DESCRIPTION:

This position requires that the applicants possess a Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) Correctional Certification. Applicants who have completed a Law Enforcement/Corrections training academy, but who have not yet been certified by FDLE will also be considered eligible for this position. Federal Bureau of Investigations (FBI) and Criminal Justice Information Systems (CJIS) security policies prohibit access to anyone with an arrest history, whose job duties allow unescorted physical or logistical access to Criminal Justice Information (CJI). A review must be completed before full access can be allowed. This position requires non-traditional work hours, consisting of a 24-hour operation.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS:

- Must meet the minimum requirements as set forth by the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission
- Good moral character
- Crime free with no recent drug use
- Ability to perform essential functions of a certified Detention Deputy
- Ability to communicate, orally and in writing
- Ability to look beyond surface issues to identify and analyze problems and develop effective responses and solutions to resolve such problems.
- Shift work (24-hour cycle) is required.

POSITION REQUIREMENTS:

- Must possess an FDLE Corrections certification, or be eligible for certification.
- Ability to acquire knowledge of Agency and Florida Model Jail Standards policies and procedures.
- Ability to communicate clearly and concisely, both orally and in writing,
- Ability to interpret and apply administrative and departmental policies, laws and rules.
- Ability and willingness to work flexible shifts as position demands.
