

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Manager is allowed to exceed any line item or department summation within any specific department or fund including both revenues and expenditures providing that the total end of the year expenditures for any fund does not exceed the original appropriation. A council resolution is required to appropriate additional amounts to any expenditure fund total; however, no resolution is required to exceed any revenue fund total.

#### **RESOLUTION #17-09**

WHEREAS, 2011 Public Act 152 (the "Act") was passed by the State Legislature and signed by the Governor on September 24, 2011;

WHEREAS, the Act contains three options for complying with the requirements of the Act;

WHEREAS, the three options are as follows:

- 1) Section 3 "Hard Caps" Option limits a public employer's total annual health care costs for employees based on coverage levels, as defined in the Act;
- 2) Section 4 ``80%/20% Option limits a public employer's share of total annual health care costs to not more than 80%. This option required an annual majority vote of the governing body;
- 3) Section 8 "Exemption" Option a local unit of government, as defined in the Act, may exempt itself from the requirement of the Act by an annual 2/3 vote of the governing body;

WHEREAS, the West Branch City Council has decided to adopt the annual "Exemption" option as its choice of compliance under the Act;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Council of the City of West Branch elects to comply with the requirements of 2011 Public Act 152, the Publicly Funded Health Insurance Contribution Act, by adopting the annual "Exemption" option for the medical benefit plan coverage year July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2018

#### **RESOLUTION #17-10**

WHEREAS, the West Branch City Council in §51.095 and §52.39 of the City of West Branch Code of Ordinances have determined that water/sewer charges constitute a lien on the property, and

WHEREAS, §92.17 of the Code of Ordinances states that the charges for mowing noxious weeds shall be a lien against the premises,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the West Branch City Council hereby acknowledges the following liens and authorizes the Clerk to place these charges on the 2017 tax roll:

#### Request for Repeal of Noise Ordinance:

--Based on a resident concern, it has been requested by a Council Member that the City Council consider repealing the following noise ordinance (keeping in mind that the City does have a separate noise ordinance which is also in effect in addition to this one—see §95.2 below):

#### § 153.04 NOISE CONTROL.

- (A) Excessive noise is hereby declared a nuisance. All loud or repetitive noises or sounds or annoying vibrations that offend the peace and quiet of persons of ordinary sensibilities are hereby declared to be public nuisances.
- (B) Each of the following offensive specific acts is declared unlawful and prohibited, but this enumeration shall not be deemed to be exclusive:
- (1) Animal Noises. The keeping of any animal, which, by causing frequent or long, continued noises, shall disturb the comfort or repose of ordinary sensibility.
- (2) Construction Noises. The erection, including excavating therefore, demolition, alteration, construction or repair of any building or street or road, except between the house of 7:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m.
- (3) Sound Amplifiers. Use of any loud speaker, amplifier or other similar instrument or device, whether stationary or mounted on a vehicle, shall be subject to the following restrictions:
- (a) The only sound permitted are music or human speech and they are subject to the requirements of §153.04(A).
- (b) The loudspeaker, amplifier or other similar instrument or device may be used only between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m.
- (C) Exceptions. None of the prohibitions contained in §153.04 (A) and (B) shall apply to or be enforced against:
- (1) Emergency Vehicles. Any police or fire vehicle or any ambulance, when engaged in emergency business.
- (2) Street or Highway Maintenance and Construction. Excavations or repairs of bridges, streets, or highways by or on behalf of the City or the State of Michigan when the public safety, welfare or convenience of the City or State so requires.
- (3) Council Resolution. The Council may by resolution modify the time limits in this subsection. (Ord. 11-03, passed 4-18-2011)

#### Other City Noise Ordinance Also Concurrently in Affect:

#### § 95.2 PROHIBITED NOISES.

(a) Generally. It is unlawful for any person to make, continue or cause to be made or continued

any loud, unnecessary or unusual noise or any noise which either annoys, disturbs, injures or endangers the comfort, repose, health, peace or safety of others. Any violation of the enumerated acts below constitutes a civil infraction subject to the fines and penalties enumerated in § 10.99 of this Code, or as otherwise established by Council resolution.

- (b) Enumerated. The following acts, among others, are declared to be loud, disturbing, and unnecessary noises in violation of this article, but this enumeration is not exclusive:
- (1) Horns, signaling devices, etc. The sounding of any horn or signaling device on any automobile, motorcycle, or other vehicle on any street or public place, except as a danger warning, the creation by means of any such signaling device of any unreasonably loud or harsh sound, the sounding of any such device for an unnecessary and unreasonable period of time, the use of any horn, whistle or other device operated by engine exhaust, and the use of any such signaling device when traffic is for any reason held up;
- (2) Radios, stereos, etc. Except as otherwise permitted by the City Council or the City Manager, as hereinafter prescribed, the use, operation or permitting the use or operation of any radio or receiving set, musical instrument, stereo, or other machine or device designed for the production or reproduction of sound in such a manner as to disturb the peace, quiet and comfort of others in the vicinity, or with a volume louder than is necessary for convenient hearing for the person or persons who are in the room, vehicle or chamber in which the device is operated and who are voluntary listeners. The operation of any of the above-named devices between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. or in such a manner that the noise is plainly audible at a distance of 50 feet from the source of the noise will be prima facie evidence of a violation of this subsection;
- (3) Loudspeakers, amplifiers for advertising. The using, operating or permitting to be played, used or operated any radio receiving set, musical instrument, phonograph, loudspeaker, sound amplifier or other machine or device for the producing or reproducing of sound which is cast upon the public streets for the purpose of commercial advertising or to attract attention of the public to any building or structure;
- (4) Yelling, shouting. Except as otherwise permitted by the City Council or the City Manager, as hereinafter provided, yelling, shouting, hooting, whistling, or singing on the public streets or any other public place, between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m., or at any time or place so as to annoy or disturb the quiet, comfort or repose of persons in any office, or in any dwelling, hotel or

other type of residence, or of any persons in the vicinity;

- (5) Engine exhausts. The discharge into the open air of the exhaust of any steam engine, stationary internal combustion engine, motor boat, or other motor vehicle except through a muffler or other device which will effectively prevent loud or explosive noises;
- (6) Defect in vehicle or load. The use of any automobile, motorcycle, or other vehicle so out of repair, so loaded, or in such manner as to create loud and unnecessary grating, grinding, rattling or annoyance;
- (7) Loading or unloading; opening boxes. Creation of a loud and excessive noise in connection with loading or unloading of any vehicle or the opening and destruction of bales, boxes, crates, and containers:
- (8) Construction or repair of buildings. The erection (including excavation, demolition, alteration or repair) of any building other than between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. on weekdays, except in case of urgent necessity in the interest of public health and safety, and then only with a permit from the City Council or the City manager, which may be granted for a period not to exceed three days or less while the emergency continues and which may be renewed for periods of three days or less while the emergency continues. If the City manager determines that the public health and safety will not be impaired by the erection, demolition, alteration or repair of any building or the excavation of streets or highways between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m., and if he further determines that loss or inconvenience will result to any party in interest, he may grant permission for the work to be done during the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. upon application. If the City Council or the City Manager shall determine that such work does actually impair the public health and safety, then such permit may be revoked by the City Council or the City manager;
- (9) Schools, churches, hospitals. The creation of any excessive noise on any street adjacent to any school, institution of learning, church, hospital, or court while the same is in session, which interferes with the work of the institutions or which disturbs or unduly annoys patients in the hospital, provided that conspicuous signs are displayed in such streets indicating that the same is a street upon which a school, hospital or church or court is located;
- (10) Hawkers and peddlers. Shouting and crying of peddlers, hawkers and vendors which disturbs the peace and quiet of the neighborhood;

- (11) Drums for commercial purposes. The use of any drum or other instrument or device for the purpose of attracting attention to any performance, show or sale by creation of noise;
- (12) Transportation of materials. The transportation of any material over the streets and other public places so as to cause loud noises or so as to disturb the peace and quiet of such streets;
- (13) Pile drivers, hammers, etc. The operation between the hours of 7:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. of any pile driver, steam shovel, pneumatic hammer, derrick, steam or electric hoists or other appliances, the use of which is attended by loud or unusual noise;
- (14) Blowers, fans, engines. The operation of any noise created by any blower or power fan or any internal combustion engine, the operation of which causes noise due to the explosion of operating gases or fluids, unless the noise from the blower is muffled and the engine is equipped with a muffler device sufficient to deaden the noise.
- (15) Compression release engine braking; "Jake braking." Noise created by semis or other vehicles due to compression release engine braking, or "Jake braking."
- (c) Approval from City Council or City Manager.
- (1) Any person, firm, or entity proposing to conduct any activity or operate any sound producing device which is reasonably expected to produce a sound or occur at a time in violation of this section shall apply to the City Manager for a permit to allow such conduct or the use of such device. In determining whether to issue such permit, the City Council or the City Manager shall consider:
- a. The date and time of the proposed conduct;
- **b.** The location of the proposed conduct;
- c. The nature and proximity of other dwellings and/or uses;
- d. The type of proposed conduct and/or the type of device proposed to be used; and
- e. The purpose for such conduct or the use of such device.
- (2) The foregoing permit process shall apply only to those noises prohibited under subsections (b)(2) and (b)(4) above. Any permit issued by the City Manager shall specify the date, time, location, and duration of the permitted activity. The City Council or the City Manager may impose such other restrictions or conditions upon the issuance of such permit as it may deem appropriate and/or necessary in the interests of the public health and welfare.

(Ord, passed 09-01-2015) Penalty, see § 10.99

#### § 95.99 EFFECTIVE DATE; PUBLICATION

This ordinance shall become effective upon publication of a notice in a newspaper circulated in the City, stating the date of the enactment and the effective date of the ordinance, a brief notice as to the subject matter of this ordinance, and such other facts as the City Clerk shall deem pertinent, and that a copy of the ordinance is available for public use and inspection both on the city website and at City Hall.

#### **City Manager Notes:**

-Should City Council decide that they would like me to proceed with this matter, I would just need a vote of the City Council authorizing me to draft an ordinance to repeal the entirety of § 153.04 (noise control), in which case I can prepare such an ordinance of repeal and have it ready for our next meeting. However, I would also recommend that Council consider having a public hearing on the matter at our next meeting, as well as personally notifying the two main individuals who have been involved in this matter, so that they are aware of the opportunity to share their views with Council on the subject before Council votes on the ordinance.

#### **Charter Procedures for Repeals of Ordinances:**

### 7.2 ENACTMENT, AMENDMENT, REPEAL AND EFFECTIVE DATE OF ORDINANCES.

- (a) Subject to the statutes and to the exceptions contained in this Charter;
- (1) Ordinances may be enacted by the affirmative vote of not less than a majority of the members-elect of the Council and shall continue in effect unless or until amended or repealed.
- (2) No ordinance shall be amended or repealed except by an ordinance adopted as aforesaid.
- (3) No ordinance shall be enacted at the meeting at which it is introduced nor until after publication or the proceedings or summary thereof of such meeting which proceedings or summary shall include a statement of its title and purpose.
- (4) The effective date of all ordinances shall be prescribed therein but the effective date shall not be earlier than fifteen (15) days after enactment nor before publication thereof.

- (b) It is provided, however, that an ordinance which is declared therein to be an emergency ordinance immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety may be enacted at the meeting at which it is introduced or before publication of the proceedings of the meeting at which it is introduced, or may be given earlier effect than fifteen (15) days after its enactment, (but only after full publication), or all three, by five affirmative votes of Council. However, no emergency ordinance may levy taxes, grant, renew or extend a franchise, or regulate the rate charged by any public utility for its services. Every emergency ordinance shall automatically stand repealed as of the sixtieth (60) day following its effective date, but this shall not prevent re-enactment of the ordinance in the prescribed manner if the emergency still exists.
- (c) No ordinance granting any public utility franchise shall be enacted except in accordance with the provisions of Section 14.2.
- (d) No ordinance shall be amended by reference to its title only, but the revised section of the ordinance, as amended, shall be re-enacted and published in full or summary form.

(Amended by vote of the electorate at a General Election held 11-7-2000)

- (e) An ordinance may be repealed by reference to its title and ordinance or code number only. However, one or more sections of an ordinance may be repealed only when said repeal actions are published and printed in full.
- 7.3 PUBLICATION AND RECORDING OF ORDINANCES.
- (a) Each ordinance shall be published in full or in summary form within ten (10) days after its enactment. (Amended by vote of the electorate at a General Election held 11-7-2000)

#### § 10.16 REPEAL OR MODIFICATION OF ORDINANCE.

- (A) Whenever any ordinance or part of an ordinance shall be repealed or modified by a subsequent ordinance, the ordinance or part of an ordinance thus repealed or modified shall continue in force until the due publication of the ordinance repealing or modifying it when publication is required to give effect thereto, unless otherwise expressly provided.
- (B) No suit, proceedings, right, fine, forfeiture, or penalty instituted, created, given, secured, or accrued under any ordinance previous to its repeal shall in any way be affected, released, or discharged, but may be prosecuted, enjoyed, and recovered as fully as if the ordinance had continued in force unless it is otherwise expressly provided.
- (C) When any ordinance repealing a former ordinance, clause, or provision shall itself be repealed, the repeal shall not be construed to revive the former ordinance, clause, or provision, unless it is expressly provided.
