the BLUE PROJECT RECEIVES PUBLIC HEARING

Reztark Design Studio presented updated concepts for **the BLUE** project at the August 11 City Council meeting during a public hearing for concept-level Planned Unit Development (PUD) approval.

The new designs included modifications to access roads to improve traffic flow and the inclusion of modern art sculptures at key locations.

Several residents spoke during the public hearing portion of the meeting, with a majority expressing concerns about traffic near the proposed mixed-use development.

City leaders said their concerns were heard and will be taken into consideration as the planning phase continues.



A second reading and vote on the PUD legislation is scheduled for the September 8, 2022, Council meeting.




future I offer you this freeze-frame of Blue Ash as it is now. I hope you enjoy it as much as I do and share it with your family, friends, and loved ones.”



TOWNE SQUARE PROJECT TAKES SHAPE

City Council received an update on the **Towne Square** design at the June 9 meeting.

Steve Barber of BHDP Architects presented a series of new design concepts and a new fly-through video.

The update included more details on the children's areas including a climbable play structure and an interactive water feature along the Promenade and Grove, expanded retail patios fronting the Promenade, and details on how the current brick pavers will be preserved and repurposed into the new Veterans Memorial.



The **HAM-Plainfield Roundabouts** project is over halfway completed.

The Hunt/Kroger roundabout has been in use since February 2.

The Plainfield/Hunt roundabout has been switched over to a single-lane roundabout configuration while island construction continues.

CONNECTIVITY PLAN UPDATE

Blue Ash Public Works Director Gordon Perry gave Council Members an update on **roadway improvement plans, traffic signal system upgrades, and connectivity plans** at the July 14 City Council meeting.

The plans outline short- (1-2 years), medium- (2-5 years), and long-term (5+ years) goals and projects that will improve city streets, sidewalks, and traffic signals.

The Roadway Plan will ease congestion, increase safety, and make it easier to travel within the City.

The Central Traffic Signal System is a modern fiber optic system with newer adaptive technology that will connect all the traffic signals in the City.

The Connectivity Plan focuses on pedestrian, bicycle, and Metro improvements to increase safety and access. The short-term goal is the completion of sidewalks within the Neighborhoods at Summit Park and installation of wide shoulders along Alliance Road similar to those along Malsbary Road. The medium-term goals are to complete sidewalks on Grooms Road, McKinley Road,



Cornell Park Drive, extend the Hunt Road sidewalk to Waxwing Drive in Reading, and add sidewalks to the east side of Reed Hartman Highway between Glendale-Milford Road and Creek Road. The long-term goals are to complete the Osborne Road and Grooms Road connector sidewalks and complete the Rails-to-Trails corridor if the opportunity ever arises.
