The BLUE is a mixed-use development proposed by Circle Development for the Kenwood/Cooper corner in downtown Blue Ash.

the BLUE will have an inviting, modern façade of ground-floor restaurant/retail, a plaza, a center park, and upper-level office space at the corner and along Kenwood Road, with the residential units, amenities, and parking tucked behind.

Circle held a well-attended open house in March to answer questions and hear resident feedback about the project.

The developer is currently conducting a traffic study in the area surrounding the proposed development.

70TH MEMORIAL DAY PARADE & CEREMONY



You're invited to the 70th Annual Memorial Day Parade and Ceremony in Blue Ash on May 30.

The parade will begin at 10:15 a.m. at Reed Hartman Highway and Cooper Road, proceeding east on Cooper to Kenwood, south on Kenwood to Hunt, and east on Hunt before ending at the Bicentennial Veterans Memorial Park at Blue Ash Towne Square.

Dozens of military and non-profit organizations, local businesses, and community groups will participate in the parade.

A special ceremony will take place after the parade at approximately 11:30 a.m. at Blue Ash Towne Square with keynote speaker Lt. Col. Dan Meyers.

The **HAM-Plainfield roundabouts project** is underway.

The Hunt/Kroger roundabout is now in operation (pictured left), with a few minor updates and cosmetic changes still to come.

Work is ramping up on the Hunt/Plainfield roundabout. Lane restrictions have begun on the off-ramp of Ronald Reagan Highway and on Hunt Road. Also, PNC Bank's Hunt Road entrance is closed to allow for excavation work on the former Speedway site (pictured left).

All work is weather permitting. Remember to drive safely and slowly through the construction zone.
