TOWNE SQUARE RENOVATION PROJECT UNDERWAY

Pardon our dust! The much-anticipated **Towne Square Renovation Project** is underway in downtown Blue Ash. Alpha Construction has been tapped to complete the project.

To make it easier for motorists to enter, exit, and park during construction, a new connector has been created between the parking lots for Park Pour and Sleepy Bee.

In addition, the City's property at the Kenwood/Cooper corner has been turned into free, temporary parking during the construction, and property at 4906 Cooper Road has been purchased for additional parking.

Use your phone's camera to scan the QR Code below to view a map of all of the available, free parking near Towne Square. All of the lots are within a five-minute walk to Towne Square businesses. To accommodate customers, lots closest to the businesses will be designated 2-hour parking.

The Towne Square Renovation Project is expected to be wrapped up in March of 2024.

HOMEOWNERS' SPRING CHECKLIST

Is your home ready for spring and summer? Here's a handy checklist to help you make sure your residence is in compliance with Blue Ash's Codified Ordinances.

YOUR YARD

- weeds and grass less than eight inches in heightfree from overgrown, uncontrolled vegetation and
- branches
 free from tires and other refuse
- sidewalks clear of plant overgrowth
- trash containers screened from view from the street
- vehicles licensed, operable, and parked on a paved surface

DRIVEWAY & WALKWAYS

- free of potholes
- free from boxes, wires, storage containers, propane tanks, tires, and other refuse

PORCHES

- repair steps, railings, and/or floorboards, if needed
- free from boxes, storage containers, and other refuse



GUTTERS & DOWNSPOUTS

- repair/paint, if needed
- appropriately directing water away from the primary building and away from neighboring buildings

EXTERIOR WALLS & GARAGES

- repair/paint, if needed
- clean of algae, mildew, or mold

ACCESSORY BUILDINGS (SHEDS, FENCES, ETC.)

repair/paint sheds, fences, doors, roofs, if needed

WINDOWS & DOORS

- weather tight and operable
- repair or replace glass/screens, if needed
- sashes and/or trim in good condition

MISCELLANEOUS

- address visible from the street
- property free of standing or stagnant water

SIX NEW FIREFIGHTERS




