PROJECT UPDATES



The **Towne Square Renovation Project** is taking shape. Crews are installing concrete on the west side of the park and will complete the Sleepy Bee patio soon. Workers will be finishing electrical and HVAC work in the restroom and storage facility in the coming weeks.

Landscaping is also underway and will involve the installation of Silva Cells, a soil containment system for ideal tree health in urban environments. The Veterans Memorial is also progressing, with hard surfaces in place for the return of the statues.

MADTREE

It was a bittersweet moment for staff members as they said **farewell to the Summit Park Hangar** in early March. The hangar began as an aviation hub, then hosted various events including an indoor ice-skating wonderland, and served as the home of Park Maintenance. The Hangar will now be transformed into Madtree Parks & Rec, a brewery/restaurant that is expected to open for business in the spring of 2025.





OBSERVATION TOWER

Work continues on the **Summit Park Observation**Tower. The enhancements will consist of hand rail repair, observation and platform level paver system upgrades, and additional safety features. The work is expected to be completed in the next few months.



Out with the old, in with the new! The former **Golf Maintenance Building** was at the end of its useful life and is now being replaced. Construction is expected to be completed in late summer. The walking path will also reopen at that time.



the **BLUE**

the BLUE, the mixed-use project slated for the northwest corner of Kenwood and Cooper Roads, is tentatively moving forward. The owner of the development company entered bankruptcy in March 2023 due to litigation stemming from a past business partnership in which he was a passive partner. He successfully emerged from bankruptcy in February 2024. During that time, Circle Development continued to fine-tune the project design and applied for construction permits. Over the next several months Circle will work to secure financing and



finalize agreements with the City related to the property transfer. The developer plans to break ground late this year or early next.

MORE PROJECTS

Central Traffic Control System Phase II - This project will improve traffic flow with the installation of fiber optic communication



lines, updated traffic signal controllers, and improved vehicle detection. Phase II involves Glendale-Milford Road to the Target Intersection along Reed Hartman Highway/Plainfield Road and along Glendale-Milford/Pfeiffer Road from Reed Hartman Highway to Storybook Lane.

2024 Paving Program - The roads included in this year's paving program are McKinley Road, which will include a new sidewalk, Rossplain Road, and Shell Road. If bids are favorable, the following roads may also be paved: Reed Hartman Highway from Cornell Road to Osborne Boulevard, West Lake Forest Drive, Ashview Place, and Grooms Road.

Plainfield/Hunt Roundabout Landscape Project - This project involves constructing landscaping walls, stone wall veneer, monument signage, and landscaping at the Plainfield/Hunt roundabout.


MEMORIAL DAY PARADE & CEREMONY

The City of Blue Ash is proud to present the **72nd annual Memorial Day Parade and Ceremony** on May 27, 2024.

The parade will kick off from the corner of Reed Hartman Highway and Cooper Road at 10:15 a.m. Dozens of military groups, community organizations, local businesses, and non-profits will honor service members who lost their lives serving our country, by marching with patriotic displays and music.

Due to the ongoing construction at Towne Square, the route will be modified. The parade will proceed east on Cooper to Monroe, and end in the Cancer Support Community parking lot at 4918 Cooper Road.

A ceremony will follow at approximately 11:30 a.m. in the Cancer Support Community parking lot. It will feature keynote speaker Major General (Ret) Leonard M. Randolph, Jr., M.D. He was the first African-American to be promoted to General Officer in the United States Air Force Medical Service and the first African-American to hold the position of Deputy Surgeon General in any of the military services.

Road.




The boxes are in the foyers of both buildings and are accessible 24/7.
