# WHAT'S HAPPENING DOWNTOWN?

#### **HOSBROOK CORNER**

While there are currently no official development plans for the Hosbrook property at the northwest corner of Kenwood and Cooper Road in Downtown Blue Ash, a developer who controls the adjacent properties recently presented an informal development proposal to City Council.

In 2020, Blue Ash City Council authorized the purchase of the 2.5-acre Hosbrook property (shown in blue). The City has completed demolition of the structures located on this property to remove the dilapidated buildings and minimize liability.

The adjacent 3.8-acre property (shown in orange), which includes the former Blue Ash Chili and Ringo Lanes, is controlled by Circle Development Company. The developer is planning to demolish the structures on the property at a later date.

Circle Development has expressed an interest in working with the City to develop both pieces of land as one cohesive development.

At the April 8, 2021, City Council Meeting, Circle Development gave an informal presentation with conceptual designs for the site and answered questions from Council Members. The meeting minutes are available at blueash.com.

The design proposal included a mixed-use develop-



ment with office, retail, restaurants with outdoor dining options, a 250-unit apartment complex, a 75-85 room boutique hotel, a 600-space parking garage, and an outdoor gathering space.

At this time, there is no formal approval timeline or process in place, and Council has not made any decisions.

When the time comes, there will be a public input process and a formal zoning approval process. Residents will be able to stay informed about these steps at blueash.com.

Any development plans will be guided by the City's downtown strategy plan.

### HAM-PLAINFIELD ROUNDABOUT UPDATE



The City of Blue Ash is about to begin construction of three roundabouts that will help improve safety and ease traffic congestion through the City.

At the May 13 City Council meeting, Council unanimously awarded the bid for the project, dubbed the HAM-Plainfield Road project, to R.B. Jergens Contractors, Inc.

Under the current plan, the roundabouts will be constructed in this order:

- **Kroger entrance on Hunt Road**
- **Plainfield Road and Hunt Road**
- **Plainfield Road and Peppermill Lane**

You may see work simultaneously at the different sites as Thank you for your patience as the City of Blue Ash comcrews prep the areas.

Currently, Duke Energy and other utility providers are in the process of relocating above-ground utilities at the intersection of Plainfield Road and Hunt Road to make way for the project.

During the next step of the project, crews will be demolishing the Speedway and Marathon gas stations at the corner of Plainfield and Hunt.

Traffic will be maintained during the construction process, though there may be lane closures from time to time. The only road closure is expected late this year Construction is expected to begin in the next few months. and/or early next year when Peppermill Road will be shut down at Plainfield Road. Updates will be posted at blueash.com.

## CENTRAL CORRIDOR PIPELINE

Duke Energy has begun construction of the Central Corridor Pipeline in Blue Ash.



One of the most notable road closures during this project is expected in June when Glendale Milford Road will be shut down to westbound traffic at Plainfield Road.





## **BLUE ASH RANKS #1 IN RECYCLING!**



Residents' efforts have landed Blue Ash in the top spot for recycling in the region once again.

With a 67 percent diversion rate, Blue Ash won **the 2020 Best City Waste Diversion Rate Award** from the Hamilton County Recycling and Solid
Waste District.

This is the highest diversion rate of any community in all of Hamilton County.

Robust yard trimmings collection options helped the community divert a staggering 7,935 tons of yard trimmings away from landfills in 2019.



You'll soon see a new Blue Ash Fire Department medic vehicle around town. It was built in Grove City, Ohio, and took five months to construct.

The City of Blue Ash is ranked #3 in the "2021 Top Places to live in the Cincinnati Region," according to a Niche.com study released in March. Thanks in part to resident reviews, Niche gave the City an overall grade of A+ in 2020 and 2021.
