E. Blalack, Jr., Lexie Goulder, Charles McQuiston, Council members attending. Ardell Simonton, reporter, Judy Watkins, Joe Chidester, Jim Wyatt, Don Scott, Alton and Anita Wells, Tom Reynolds, citizens present. Mayor called meeting to order, Goulder opened with prayer. Goulder moved to disburse with the reading of the minutes as each had a copy, McQuiston seconded. Mayor expressed the need for volunteer firemen and thanked Wells for answering the call. Since new truck would be ready on October 22nd, Goulder moved to have the truck shipped here, McQuiston seconded. It passed. Denise Rowe, Rural Area Respite Service representative, Chapter of Association of Retarded Citizens, explained her work and the need for an office, within a price range that would help their budget, so that more could be used for the retarded citizens. Goulder formed motion to let her have use of office space at the Center, free of charge, indefinitely, with plenty of time to relocate if space was needed in the future, McQuiston seconded. Reynolds informed Board that he was no longer associated with Green Thumb, but would still be an avid volunteer. He thanked the Mayor and City Manager McDivitt for all their help and cooperation while he was an employee. Board was informed that the USWA wrestling, that was scheduled for six weeks, had been canceled until the Spring. E and W Street between Wells Grocery and old Bank building was discussed, The Board decided it should be closed to thru traffic. Mayor to check on legalities. Mayor read request from employee Woods for a raise since he had been overlooked at his probationary period. Goulder moved to increase his salary \$35.00 weekly, McQuiston seconded. It passed. Third and final reading was held on modifying Light Manufacturing Ordinance. It passed with 3 ayes, no nays. Third and final reading on old Post Office space change from R-1 and B-1, Goulder moved to adopt, seconded by McQuiston. It passed. Third and final reading on modular home ordinance, Goulder moved to adopt, seconded by McQuiston. Second reading was held on Fair Housing Ordinance passed with 3 ayes, no nays. Second reading on Baseball ordinance died for the lack of action. Financial report studied, Goulder moved to pay due accounts, Blalack seconded. Mayor stated Board of Education had requested the signing of a 99 year lease on the property for the Alternative School but recommended not signing for that length of time, Board was in full agreement. Chidester requested change on specifications of modular home positioning, he was informed it would have to come before the Planning Commission for study. Mayor reported district meeting of TML to be held and wished as many of the Board members that could, please attend. McQuiston moved to adjourn, Goulder seconded.
