

TOWN OF BRIGHTON

**AN ORDINANCE COMMITTING THE TOWN'S RESOURCES TO PREPARING FOR Y2K**

WHEREAS, the Tennessee General Assembly has recently enacted legislation that removes immunity for damage or injury caused by local governments which have not taken reasonable steps to plan for Y2K; and

WHEREAS, in order to adequately make preparation, it is necessary to have the complete and full cooperation of all city employees toward this effort; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the Town of Brighton, Tennessee that:

Section 1. The Town of Brighton is hereby committed to making adequate preparation to deal with Y2K, including the development of a Y2K preparedness plan.

Section 2. The Town hereby appoints Marsha Trotter as its Y2K Coordinator, who shall be responsible for development and implementation of a Y2K preparedness plan.

Section 3. Every department head in the Town shall provide information and assistance to the Y2K Coordinator, in a timely manner, and help to identify and inventory equipment that might not be Y2K compliant and in developing contingency plans where disruptions in service might reasonably be expected to occur.

Section 4. There shall be one employee in each department, appointed by the department head, designated to work with the Y2K Coordinator in developing the Y2K preparedness plan.

Section 5. This ordinance shall become effective upon final passage, the public welfare requiring it.
