How Do I Start A Neighborhood Watch Program

Contact Your Law Enforcement Agency

Call or email the Buena Park Police Crime Prevention Unit

Explain that you would like to start a Neighborhood Watch group and ask for assistance.

Mention any current occurrences or concerns that prompted the start of a Neighborhood Watch.

With the help of the Crime Prevention Unit, set up a date, time, and place for the first meeting.

Set the meeting date far enough in advance to give everyone adequate notice.

Select a time that is convenient for most neighbors and your law enforcement representative.

Distribute flyers provided by the Crime Prevention Unit, in the desirable areas around your neighborhood.

First Meeting

Remind everyone of the meeting date as it approaches (two to three days before) as good attendance is important.

Remember, don't get disappointed if everyone cannot attend. One hundred percent neighborhood participation is desirable but is not required for the program to work.

AT THE MEETING

- Get the opportunity to meet all your neighbors
- Meet your Area Commander
- Get crime statistics for your neighborhood and surrounding area
- Get home safety tips
- Learn about different online tools and resources
- Q&A at the end of the meeting.



Once Group is Established

Be alert to unusual or suspicious behavior in your neighborhood

Call the police immediately if you observe suspicious or unusual activity

Look after your neighbors' homes when they are away, and ask them to look after yours

Get involved. It is the most effective way to reduce or prevent crime and make your neighborhood safe

Remember, your job is to report crime or suspicious activity
