Updates from Council Meetings

In case you missed it, the following are highlights from the November 17, 2021, Cape Coral City Council meeting.

City Wins Utility of the Future Award

The Water Environment Federation’s “Utility of the Future Today Award” was presented to the City of Cape Coral at the City Council meeting on Wednesday. The award celebrates the achievements of forward-thinking, innovative water utilities that are providing value-added service to communities.

This is the second time in four years the City of Cape Coral has won the award.

The President of the Florida Water Environment Association presented the award to Jeff Pearson, Cape Coral Utilities Director, who accepted on behalf of the City.

Council Approves Agreement with Comcast to Bolster City Broadband

The City Council voted to authorize an agreement with Comcast to extend the fiber and cable infrastructure in Northeast and Northwest Cape Coral. This initiative will extend broadband and other cable-related services which would otherwise not be economically feasible.



The agreement allows the City to reimburse Comcast for a portion of the \$14.3 million project in the amount of \$500,000.

Council Approves Final Leg of SUN Trail in the Cape

The City Council approved an agreement with the Florida Department of

Transportation to design and construct the last segment of the SUN Trail in Cape Coral on Kismet Pkwy. from Del Prado to NE 24th Ave.

This resolution approves the City receiving \$414,625 in grant funding to design this portion of the trail.

This 12-foot wide trail will provide a signature destination for recreational activity and non-motorized transportation in the North Cape.
