



In case you missed the meeting, the following are highlights from the November 3, 2021, Cape Coral City Council meeting.

Veterans Honored

The City Council joined staff in recognizing veterans of the U.S. Military working throughout the City of Cape Coral. The National Anthem was performed by Bailey McArthur, a senior at Oasis High School.

Council Approves Agreement to Update Founder's Park

The City Council approved an interlocal agreement between the City and the Cape Coral Community Redevelopment Agency to improve Founder's Park.

The improvements to the park will include updated walking paths, improved lighting and landscaping, and community art.

Council Appointments

The City Council appointed a new Stormwater Master and filled one vacancy on the Municipal Firefighter's Pension Trust Fund Board of Trustees and one vacancy on the Municipal Police Employees Trust Fund Board of Trustees.

Bulky Waste Removal Ordinance 57-21 Approved

This ordinance defines the process of non-compliant waste removal and establishes legal recourse against those who do not follow code guidelines. The ordinance also expedites the removal of non-compliant bulky or horticultural waste placed at the curb.

Seawall Engineering Design Standards Ordinance 85-21 Approved

Council approved an ordinance that increases the engineering design standards for seawall construction in the City of Cape Coral. The new design standards will go into effect on March 1, 2022.

New Business

Council Member Tate was selected as Mayor Pro Tem, and Mayor Gunter was appointed as Office Manager.
