



In case you missed it, the following are highlights from the June 1, 2022, Cape Coral City Council meeting.

Council Approves Renewal of Charter School Contract

In November of 2005, the City Council adopted a Charter School Contract between the City of Cape Coral and the School Board of Lee County for the City of Cape Coral Charter High School, now known as Oasis High School. The Contract serves as the Charter for the operation of the school and was effective until June 30, 2022. On April 6, 2022, City Council adopted Resolution 68-22, providing a written request to the School District of Lee County (SDLC) for renewal of the school Charter. SDLC reviewed the documents and provided the City with a Charter Renewal Contract for approval. On June 1, 2022, City Council approved resolution 99-22 to renew the charter for Cape Coral Charter High School (Oasis High School) for a term of 15 years.

Water Quality Update

On Wednesday, May 11, 2022, staff reported a Blue-Green Algae bloom located in the freshwater Boris canal system. The contractor performed an algicide treatment throughout the system last week. Water clarity has improved, and staff will follow up with quality sampling to ensure efficiency. Also, a permanent water quality monitoring station will be established in this canal system.

New Fleet Services Facility

Council approved the contract between the City of Cape Coral and Weston & Sampson Engineers, Inc. for a new Public Works Fleet Facility. The current Fleet Facility was built in 1959. The City has outgrown the current location, and the configuration, ceiling height, and lighting levels limit maintenance and service work.
