  <u>Florida Small Business Emergency Bridge Loan (EBL) Program</u> at

  program provides short-term, zero-interest loans intended to "bridge the
  gap" between the time of the disaster and when a business has secured
  longer-term funding.
- Low-interest loans from the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) will be available to assist with physical damage, economic injury, and mitigation improvements.
