

# Plan ROAD RECOVERY



By 7 a.m. Sept. 29, 2022, City crews cleared debris from all major roadways across Cape Coral.

## FIRST PUSH

By October 12, 2022, all 81 traffic signals in Cape Coral had at least one signal head working in each direction.

## TRAFFIC SIGNALS

Coral Oaks Golf Course and 90% of all Parks & Recreation facilities were at least partially reopened by November 7, 2022.

## PARKS

By March 11, 2023, all debris was removed from saltwater canals. Freshwater canal removal resumed Oct. 16, 2023.

## LANDFALL

Hurricane Ian made landfall in Cape Coral Sept. 28, 2022, and would become the costliest hurricane to hit Florida.

## STOP SIGNS

By Sept. 30, 2022, all stop signs at high-traffic intersections were repaired by City crews.

## DAMAGE ASSESSMENTS

By the end of October 2022, City staff completed all damage assessments to City buildings and parks that were damaged by Ian.

## DEBRIS

On Dec. 21, 2022, crews had removed a total of 2M cubic yards. On Jan. 21, 2023, all debris was removed from Cape Coral roadways.
