Chiquita Boulevard North Widening


- •Lee County School District Agreement: Land Donation Agreement Approved by LCSD on 5/10



• Boat Ramp Improvements.


 A total of 10 boat ramps were improved and 10 more permits were submitted to continue with the construction of more ramps. Approx. cost (\$450,000)











Vehicles and Equipment: 100% ordered: 141 - 43% received: 61 (awaiting on 80 for delivery)


