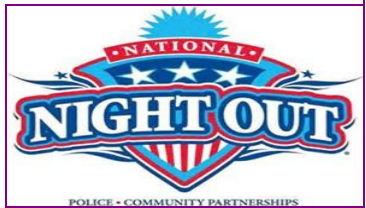
Message from Mayor David Allen



Dear Residents of Prairie View,

My first 2 months have been busy meeting with many of you through our new "Open Door" policy at City Hall as we work together to improve our city. On my fourth day, we had a motorcycle death and I visited his widow. Additionally, to help ensure safety, I have been riding with PVPD Officers as early as 4 am and busy assisting residents with FEMA & SBA, as well as, informing them of how to get available relief after the flooding and water damage in both April & May disasters which led to several families losing everything. Later, Waller

County was declared a federal disaster area. Ordinance violations are being cited as we try to bring back our Beautiful Prairie View. We are currently finalizing our search for a new Police Chief from nine applicants. I would like to say a big "Thank You" to both the Police Chiefs and our Residents for assisting. The Review & Interview Panel consists of Chief Stephens of Prairie View A&M University, Chief Hartley of Hempstead & Chief Williams of Waller.
