Message from Mayor David Allen



Dear PV Residents. We did it! \$1,000,000.00!! U.S.Department of Commerce

EDA Grant, City of PV was approved!! The City will add water and sewer on James Muse Parkway from U.S. Business 290 to Owens Road to H.T. Jones Elementary School. Economic Development can now take place along our eastern border, some of which has been trying to but lacked these necessities. Residents will benefit as our entire city's infrastructure will improve especially our water. Noteworthy, our water has a " Superior" rating now but this infrastructure will "loop" it, making it even better.

Special thanks to Attorney Lea Hayes for her assistance in helping

us reapply (awarded before but beneficiary was not eligible so grant canceled), Kristie Hadnot, Nic Housont, City Engineer David Linedecker, EDA's Lisa Larsen and Cory Dunn, and WISD Superintendent, Dr. Twardoski for his letter of support. In an EDA meeting, I asked and learned the city may recapture legal fees. We are gathering those numbers and checking on how local businesses can be included in this project.

PVAMU, Dr. Akujuobi's Research Team has an MOU with PV and received a \$100.000.00 grant to study making us a "Smart City"! Next step \$1,000,000.00 grant using technology to make life better for all of us.

Furthermore, the College of Engineering applied for a \$5.000.000.00 National Science Foundation Grant over 5 years to improve the energy and environment in PV.

Additionally, a \$350,000.00 infrastructure grant is pending approval. Also, an application has been submitted for a New FEMA Flood Grant.

Housing (student & residential): a grocery store, movie theatre, medical facility and more coming soon. Developers have purchased the land. Keep us in prayer as we
