-Panther Hill Apartments is paying the majority of the \$441,000.00 in new property taxes plus 40 jobs (students &

adults), -Prairie View Cricket Complex at largost in the country has had they and

est in the country has had thousands of visitors and tourist activity preparing to build a

5,000 seat stadium plus thousands of seats around it's 7 fields generating even more tax revenue.

-Prairie View Townhomes is a \$20 million project of townhomes, hotel and retail stores on FM 1098 across from Community Center.

-Campus Edge: 60 acres of mixed use development on Hwy 290, first apartments can be seen as you exit.

-FuelMaxx/Shell Convenience Store/ Gas Station and a Checkers Restaurant on Hwy 290 & University Drive opening soon!

-The Gates of Prairie View: 30 acre mixed-use development with retail stores, restaurants, mid-size hotel, townhomes for sale and in the rear student housing

-Home Development: 75 single family homes project on Business 290 behind old city hall, finalizing plans.

-\$1 million JM Parkway EDA Grant in newspapers for bid and will add water and sewer to our Eastern Border bringing in a lot of

Economic Development.

-\$350,000 EDA Grant repaired all of the old clay sewer pipes in our oldest residential area of Alta Vista -\$742,000 Hurricane Harvey Grant just approved and I met with Texas General Land Office rep last month, and

will repair sewer pipes in Rosewood for residents damaged by Hurricane Harvey. \$4,000,000,000.00 NEW Harvey Funds coming to Texas for us to apply from 2015 & 2016 floods, more details

in March 2020!

-Our city is unique and we have great

people but our location is away from the big city with it's resources and economic overflow!

You can see we are creating our own economic development, jobs and services!

-San Bernard Electric night rides led to a lot of new LED lights in every area of the city to increase safety.

-Studies are being presented to add a new city water tower and a wastewater treatment plant.


-PVAMU and City are working together with Memorandums of Understanding (MOU)

HT Jones Elementary Community Garden, Engineering helping on Boards and doing studies in the city. Thanks to Dr Akujuobi for leading the work going after a \$2 million Smart City Grant,

-Engineering Dean and I are working to have students and professors do more projects that assist the city, great since I came to PVAMU on an Engineering Scholarship in 1st ECI in '73. -Municipal Court we had Judge plus 1, now we have Judge plus 2 new. -Public Works had a supervisor plus 2, now USW supervising plus 5, getting a lot more done, AND we are in compliance with TCEQ, USW Licensed technicians informed us we were not in compliance in a few areas.
