Update by Mayor



We are working hard to make your city better

every day as we continue to grow and improve services.

The Code Enforcement Team is in place and has issued several 10 Day Notices for unkept property and unmoving vehicles with more owners being cited every week. We will be looking very good soon as all are in compliance. Furthermore, an ordinance to address abandoned and boarded properties is being prepared to address those issues that can lead to crime, unsafe for children, snakes/rodents and decreased property values.

A Resolution is being prepared to have all landlords register with the city, obtain a permit and be subject to annual inspections or upon complaints to insure property is inhabitable and safe to occupy.

The Prairie View Cricket Complex is almost level and a few of the 14

fields are being prepared for play. The National Cricket League NCL



has contacted us and is interested in hosting national competitions in PV and the developer's team be the one to represent Texas in cricket nationwide!

The Panther Hill Apartments on Richards Road is rising and Bureau Veritas (contracted City Inspectors) have approved plans. They have inspected and approved several buildings, others are being com-



pleted and inspected, weekly. Currently, about 600 students have reserved rooms/beds and close to 700 beds will be ready, depending on weather by August 25. The owners are making tentative plans to accommodate and work with students to make sure as rooms/ buildings are being completed, students with reservations will have a place to stay.

Additionally, Checkers Restaurant and gas station on University Drive and Hwy 290 are in the last stage of TxDOT approval; keep your fingers crossed.

A \$1 million grant to add water/sewer along James Muse Parkway is being finalized. All documents are in that the U.S. Department of Commerce and Economic Development Administration requires; the RFP will be submitted soon.

Finally, new housing (family & student) land has been purchased or under contract as meetings with developers, buyers and sellers continue to increase.
