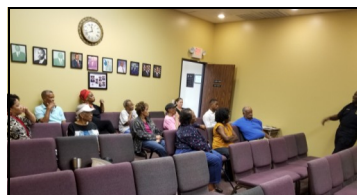
A Personal thank you to State
