

MINUTES OF THE COLERAIN TOWNSHIP SUPERVISORS – the Regular Monthly Meeting Wednesday June 16, 2021 of the Colerain Township Board of Supervisors was called to order by Chairman, Scott E. Shoemaker with a moment of silence followed by the Pledge to the Flag. Supervisors present were: Scott E. Shoemaker, Samuel R. Reinhart. Robin Church joined the meeting via iPhone. Carmen B. Wiker, Secretary was also present. A listing of others in attendance will be kept on file.

As per the revision to the Sunshine Law dated 12/98, the audience was advised that the agenda was available to them. Each agenda item will be introduced, motioned and seconded by the Supervisor(s), item will be opened for discussion for the board, and then the audience, and then a vote called for by the Chairman. The Chairman will again ask for any comments the audience may have at the end of the meeting.

Minutes of the Regular Monthly Meeting June 7, 2021 were approved as written.

A motion was made by Samuel R. Reinhart and seconded by Robin Church. to approve the June 7, 2021 Minutes. Scott called for the vote – All voted “Aye” – motion carried.

Unpaid Bills- General Fund and Park Fund

- The Bills on Hand were reviewed. *A motion was made by Robin Church and seconded by Samuel R. Reinhart to approve paying bills totaling \$26,829.03. Scott called for the vote – All voted “Aye” – motion carried.*

Old Business:

- a. Kirkwood Mennonite Church Cemetery- There was a brief discussion and agreement between all Supervisors against a cemetery in this area.

A motion was made by Scott E. Shoemaker and seconded by Samuel R. Reinhart to disapprove of a cemetery at the Kirkwood Mennonite Church. Scott called for the vote – All voted “Aye” – motion carried.

- b. Wesley Road Truck Traffic- There was discussion as to the legality of putting up “Local Traffic Only” signs, traffic studies and past Minutes concerning this subject.

Sam made a motion to approve putting up “Local Traffic Signs” but it was not followed through due to wanting to look at past Minutes.

New Business:

- a. Black Rock Retreat Request for Fire Police-They are holding their Annual BR2RB Bike-a-Thon.

A motion was made by Samuel R. Reinhart and seconded by Robin Church. to approve requesting Fire Police support for Black Rock Retreat. Scott called for the vote – All voted “Aye” – motion carried.

- b. Berkheimer Tax Request- Berkheimer is requesting that the Board adopt a Resolution that would allow us to request information from LCTCB’s tax rolls. There was a brief discussion as to the need since they only collect our delinquents. The Secretary will reach out to the Tax Collector for her opinion.
- c. LCATS Dinner July 29, 2021-Everyone is interested in going
- d. LEMSA-Formal Request for a portion of the ARPA Funds- no decision was made due to needing more clarification from the Treasury Department.
- e. Newsletter Draft- The Board will take their copies home for review. Also, Marcy from LNP News offered to work on the layout since the Secretary lacks the skills needed. Robin mentioned that it may be nice to add a “Fun Facts” section in the Newsletter.

At this time Gardell Good from the Kirkwood Mennonite Church walked into the meeting and after a brief discussion with him explained why they voted against the cemetery. Gardell was very gracious and thanked the Board for their consideration.

Any other business to be brought before the Board:

- a. New proposed Road Crew Timesheets- The Board reviewed the new sheets which would cut down on paper as it is one sheet per week in lieu of the current five sheets per week.

A motion was made by Samuel R. Reinhart and seconded by Robin Church. to approve implementing the new timesheets as of June 21,2021. Scott called for the vote – All voted “Aye” – motion carried.

Public Comment: Scott Kulicke asked about the status of the following Zoning Violations:

- b. Tim Arnold- There was discussion as to when Tim must start the fence project.
- c. Mellott's Property- There was discussion concerning what power the Board had to force cleanup if they held up their annual permit, and the mess in general. The secretary was directed to reach out to the Solicitor concerning the permit and it was decided by the Board to not issue the permit at this time.
- d. Rick Rineer- The Board has not heard from Rick's neighbor Mr. Lisinski and last time the Zoning Officer was on the property he told Scott Shoemaker that it looked better.

Adjournment:

There being no further business to be brought before the board, the board, on motion by Samuel R. Reinhart and seconded by Robin Church agreed to adjourn at 7:50 P.M. Scott called for a vote – all voted 'aye' – motion carried.
