CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order by Chairwoman Catherine Wines at 4:30 P.M.

No public comments were made.

I. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

A. Discussion of the Arts Brochure, and matters related thereto. **FOR POSSIBLE ACTION**

Ms. Wines stated the lady that is doing the brochure is waiting on the locations of the boots. She stated Simone Turner, from the public, is helping with getting pictures and the locations.

Simone Turner advised that she reached out to a photographer to take pictures of the boots. As of February 3, 2020, the status and the pictures are completed and the zip drive will be available.

Ms. Wines discussed getting to zip drive to the lady that is creating the brochures. She also thought the brochure needs pictures of the 9/11 memorial and other art around the City.

Ms. Delaney said she has the 9/11 and the Sagebrush memorial photos.

Councilwoman Simons noted there is another memorial at the airport and asked if there were any boots that they were not able to locate.

Ms. Turner advised there were three boots that they were not able to locate. She has a list that are labeled as damaged boots, unable to locate and the photographed boots. The Remax boot is had

been relocated to the Living Stones Church but is unsure if the boot will be put out when the construction is finished at the church.

Ms. Wines said she will reach out to Garrett Camps, who is a pastor at the church.

Ms. Turner stated the Coca-Cola boot was owned by the Qiznos' shop and it closed. She was not able to find anything relating to the owner of the boot.

Scott Wilkinson, Assistant City Manager, said he would be able to find the information with the business license.

Chairwoman Wines said that we will need to keep working on the information needed for the brochure so it can be created as soon as possible.

II. NEW BUSINESS

A. Review, consideration, and selection and/or nomination of Artists to receive the Mayor Arts Awards, and matters related thereto. **FOR POSSIBLE ACTION**

Chairwoman Wines wanted to start off by welcoming Tom Lester to the Arts and Culture Board. There are two nominations for the Mayor's Arts Award. Southwind was nominated for the Arts organization and Deb McFarland was nominated for the individual artist. She asked the board if everyone agreed to give both those nominees the awards.

Ms. Delaney agreed that both of the nominees are deserving of the awards.

Chairwoman Wines suggested giving the Arts Educator award to Karie Denham, who passed away last September. Ms. Denham worked with kids at the Elko County Art Club to create art and felt this would be a way to honor her.

Ms. Delaney said she knows the mother and she agreed that the award should go to her.

**** A motion was made by Cynthia Delaney, seconded by Councilwoman Simons, to award Deb McFarland the Individual Artist Award and Southwind for the Arts Organization Award for the Mayor's Arts Awards.**

The motion passed unanimously (5-0).

**** A motion was made by Cynthia Delaney seconded by Councilwoman Simons to award the Arts Educator Award to Karie Denham, and to award the Service of the Arts to Warren Archer.**

The motion passed unanimously (5-0).

Councilwoman Simons discussed that the Mayor mentioned they would like to recognize the City and others that paid for the new art memorial at the airport, of those that lost their lives in the medical plane crashes. She said the City of Elko paid for the hard cost and R.E.A.C.H, and Warren Archer paid for the soft costs.

B. Discussion of the Elko Arts Festival, and matters related thereto. **FOR POSSIBLE ACTION**

Chairwoman Wines spoke about a group of people that are starting a 501c3 called the Elko Arts Foundation. They will be in charge of the Elko Arts Festival. She will keep this discussion on the agenda as an informational aspect.

Mr. Lester asked what the timeline was to receive the 501c3.

Chairwoman Wines answered the lawyer is processing the paperwork and they are waiting for that to be pushed through.
