### Village Board Meeting in Review

At the December 1, 2020 Board meeting the Board approved the following items:

- A resolution to borrow \$986,000 from the State Trust Fund Loan for financing of street rehabilitation, building improvements and capital equipment per the 2021 Budget.
- The purchase of a Public Works patrol truck.
- The purchase of a Public Works holder tractor.
- An amendment to ordinance Section 10.03 Uniform Controlled Substances Act, which permits the Police Department to issue a citation for being in possession of prescription narcotic drugs without having a prescription for those drugs.

### December 15, 2020 Village Board Meeting Preview

### Village Board Meeting in Review

At the November 17, 2020 Board meeting the Board approved the following items:

- The 2021 Budget and the 2020 Tax Levy.
- A special use/building permit for an addition to a residence at 6812 Northway.
- Temporary extension of premises for Vintage 38 (For the Tree Lighting Ceremony and Dickens of a Village) and Ricardo's (For Dickens of a Village).
- The bids for the Safety Center Fiber Optic Connection project, which will connect the Safety Center and Village Hall to a shared fiber network.
- The creation of a flex Firefighter position. The position would work a varying shift to increase staffing on shifts.
- The Board requested Village staff contact the Wisconsin Department of Transportation regarding lowering the speed limit to 35 MPH on Loomis Road from Grange Avenue to College Avenue, based on a petition that the Board received regarding this issue.
- The 2021 Salary Resolution for Village Staff.

The Board also had a special meeting on November 23, 2020 and approved the following items:

- The purchase of a wheel loader for the Department of Public Works.
- The 2021 Street Rehabilitation Program, which will include Millshire Road, Thornridge Ln, a portion of Parkview Road and Enfield Avenue (Enfield will be bid as an Alternate).
- To hold the Village Tree Lighting Ceremony and Dickens of a Village events, with additional modifications to prevent congregating.

### **Health Department Update**

On May 19, 2020, the Greendale Health Department issued guidelines for businesses and organizations to assist them with safe reopening. In reviewing Milwaukee County's gating criteria as well as local Greendale data, the indicators show promising trends. ### Coronavirus Information

The Greendale Health Department, along with state and federal partners, continues to closely monitor the outbreak of the COVID-19 respiratory illness. Public health nurses are poised and ready to conduct investigations, if needed.

The main way COVID-19 is spread to others is when an infected person coughs or sneezes. This is similar to how influenza is spread. The virus can also spread when someone touches an object

with the virus on it. If that person touches their mouth, face, or eyes the virus can make them sick. Patients diagnosed with COVID-19 have had mild to severe respiratory illness with symptoms of fever, cough, and shortness of breath.

The best way to prevent infection is to practice everyday preventive behaviors! Stay home when sick and avoid close contact with people who are sick. Cough and sneeze into your sleeve, not your hand. Frequently wash hands with soap and water. Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces. Currently a vaccine or drug is not available for COVID-19. Community-based interventions such as event cancellations and creating employee plans to work remotely can help slow the spread of COVID-19. Schools have a plan for what they can do in the event that COVID-19 becomes widespread in the community.

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### **Village Board Meeting in Review**
