






HINSDALE FIREFIGHTERS RESPONDED TO 2,791 CALLS FOR SERVICE IN 2014.



HINSDALE FIREFIGHTERS SPENT 4,627 HOURS TRAINING IN 2014



Members of the Hinsdale Fire Department spend, on average, nearly six hours of the day training, educating, and preparing for “what if” and “worst case” scenarios. As a department, this year we spent 4,627 hours in classrooms, conference rooms, in seminars, and on the fire ground perfecting our skills. We are the first ones to admit that we are not perfect, but for a few moments during any given day at unexpected times, we have to be. Most of our training is mandated by the Occupational Safety and Health Association (OSHA), Illinois Department of Labor (IDOL), Insurance Service Office (ISO), National Incident Management Systems (NIMS) and the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) standards. Yet, our members often go above

and beyond what’s required, seeking out every opportunity to enhance their knowledge and prepare for the next step in their careers. Members of the department are in the process of obtaining Graduate and Master’s degrees, as well as Executive and Chief Fire Officer degrees through local universities and accredited programs. A few members even attended the Illinois Fire Service Institute’s Annual Fire College at the University of Illinois in Champaign. We also went to great lengths to create simulated drills in 12 vacant single family homes, 2 vacant commercial buildings, and vehicle extrications. This year’s training also included specialty response training such as TRT, HAZMAT, ice rescue and a tactical Ebola response protocol.

Training with neighboring fire departments helps to ensure the safety and efficiency of fire ground operations on real emergencies.





PROVIDING A SAFE ENVIRONMENT IN EVERY BUILDING IS OUR PRIORITY.

The goal of the Hinsdale Fire Prevention Bureau is to help business and building owners meet all the requirements of the current Fire and Building Codes together with the Life Safety Code. These codes have all been adopted by the Village and must be followed. The Bureau has the responsibility to ensure these codes are followed and works diligently with contractors to be sure they are following the approved plans to protect the business and building owners. We work closely with community development to provide the highest level of service possible. During 2014, the Fire Prevention Bureau completed a total of 1013 inspection activities, including 562 inspections, 24 special inspections, 114 plan reviews, 58 acceptance tests, 10 fire pump tests, 35 consultations, and witnessed 18 fire drills. As part of the fee structure plan, it is estimated annual fire inspections and fire pump tests accounted for \$43,825 in revenues.

A large part of what makes the Hinsdale Fire Department unique is our involvement in the community. We go to great lengths to ensure that nearly every child in every school understands the importance of fire safety and emergency preparedness through our Public Education Programs. Last year alone we reached over 1,000 children with Safety Village, Station Tours, In-school programs and scheduled Safety Talks at the Fire House. When you combine that with our Open House, Fourth of July Parade, Block Parties, Silent Parade and all of the charity events that we participate in, it's easy to see how the Hinsdale Fire Department continues to make a huge impact on the community.

Captain John Giannelli - 24 years of service - Red Shift

John is one of the most decorated fire fighters in the history of the Hinsdale Fire Department. He has an Associate's degree at the College of DuPage, a Bachelor of Science degree in Fire Science Management at Southern Illinois University, is a member of the MABAS Division 10 Hazmat team, and received two unit citations for Acts of Valor in saving the lives of both a resident of Hinsdale and a downed Hinsdale Fire Fighter in separate incidents. Captain Giannelli is also the Training Officer of the Hinsdale Fire Department and is currently pursuing his Chief Fire Officer Certification. He currently lives in Downers Grove with his wife Carla and their three children, Natalie, and the twins, Sam and Leah.

Lieutenant Bill Claybrook - 13 years of service - Black shift

Bill has been intimately involved in several key initiatives within the Department over the last four years. He developed and advocated a College Publication Education program, is currently the Official Grant Writer, is a member of the Fire Fighter Pension Board and is in the process of creating an Officer Development program for the Department. He also has several fire service certifications including his Fire Officer I. Bill earned his Bachelor of Science degree from Eastern Illinois University and holds a Master's degree in Management and Organizational Development from Illinois Benedictine. He and his wife, Michelle, live in New Lenox with their three young sons, Johnathan, Nathan, and Peyton.

Firefighter/Paramedic Tom McCarthy IV - 10 years of service - Red Shift

Tom is a second-generation Hinsdale Firefighter. He is in charge of our Health and Wellness Program, is the director of the distinguished Safety Village Summer Camp, is a Fire Investigator and a member of the MABAS Division 10 Fire Investigation Team. He obtained his Fire Fighter II certification from the Oak Lawn Fire Academy, earned his Fire Officer I and Fire Officer II certifications from the State Fire Marshall's Office and spearheads the Fire Safety and Public Education programs for all the schools in the Village of Hinsdale. McCarthy has a Bachelor of Arts degree from Bradley University and is currently enrolled in Lewis University's Master Program. He lives with his wife, Lauren and their two year-old child, Maggie, in Westchester.

Firefighter/Paramedic Jim Nichols - 7 years of service - Red Shift

Jim is the heart and soul of our department. The Hinsdale Fire Department was requested to a 4-alarm fire in Cicero in the early morning hours of January 21, 2014. Four members of Red Shift strategically positioned truck 1019 in the front of the warehouse on fire, quickly put the master water stream in service, and skillfully began extinguishing the large body of fire. As a result of their actions, Company 1019 brought the fire under control and prevented it from spreading to nearby buildings.



Captain Dave DeWolf - 28 years of service - Black Shift

Dave is one of the Department's experienced State Certified Fire Investigators. He served as President of the MABAS Division 10 Cause and Origin Team, is both an IAAI and NAFI certified Investigator, and is one of the Assistant Commanders of the Du Page County Fire Investigation Task Force. Throughout his career, Dave investigated over 1,000 structure related and explosion incidents. He has an Associate's degree in Architectural Technology from Triton College, holds several fire certifications including Fire Officer I and Fire Officer II and has been an Emergency Medical Technician for over 25 years. Captain DeWolf has been married to his wife, Jan, for 30 years and together they live in Darien. They have two children named, Mike and Lauren.

Lieutenant Jon Carlson - 15 years of service - Black shift

Jon is the Lieutenant on Bold Shift and oversees the vehicle maintenance operations of the department. Andy has vast experience in all five areas of Technical Rescue (Rope, Structural Collapse, Confine Space, Trench and Vehicle Machinery) and is certified to the highest level in each. He also is a Fire Apparatus Engineer, Firefighter III, Fire Officer II and Paramedic. Prior to joining the department, Andy spent nine years in the Indiana Army National Guard, three enlisted and six as an Officer. He holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in General Studies from Ball State University and was the recipient of an Illinois Fire Chief's Association Scholarship in 2011. On his days off, Smith is a Collapse Technician Instructor at the Romeoville Firefighter Academy. He lives in Lisle with his wife, Karen and their four children, Liam, Cassidy, Declan, and Keagan.

Firefighter/Paramedic Kevin Baker - 10 years of service - Black Shift

Kevin is one of our resident mechanics. This helps the department save thousands of dollars annually on vehicle maintenance costs, because we are able to repairs in house whenever possible. He has Fire Officer I and Fire Officer II certifications, is a Fire Apparatus Engineer, a SCBA Technician and the Vice President of our Foreign Fire Board. After the Navy, he earned his Firefighter II certification and was a Paid on Call Fire Fighter for the Aurora Township Fire Protection District for six years. At the same time, he entered Southern Fox Medic School and was a Paramedic for four years with the Pleasantview Fire Protection District. He is a Cold Water Rescue Technician, Fire Apparatus Engineer and specialty trained as a HAZAMAT Tech B. Currently, Mike lives with his wife, Lisa, in Countryside. Captain Kevin Votava - 30 years of service - Gold Shift

Captain Votava has held the ranks of Lieutenant, Deputy Chief, Training Officer, Captain and Emergency Management Coordinator, a responsibility he shares with Sgt. Tim Lamb of the Hinsdale PD. He's nearly completed his Illinois Professional Emergency Manager certification from the Illinois Emergency Management Agency (IEMA). Obtaining this certification will enable the village to qualify for additional Emergency Management Grants and funding. Kevin has an Associate's degree in Fire Science from Triton College and is currently working towards his Bachelor's degree in Fire Service Management.
