CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Waverley called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A. Approval of Minutes- November 14, 2023

Chairman Waverley noted a correction in the minutes regarding the misspelling of her name, which was located on page 5.

Commissioner Hester made a motion to **approve the minutes of the November 14**, **2023 meeting as amended**. Commissioner Keane seconded the motion. Upon the call of the roll, the votes were:

The motion carried. The amended minutes of the November 14, 2023 were approved.

LIAISON REPORTS

A. Gateway RFP Update

Superintendent Hayes provided the report. He explained the Village participates in the Special Recreation Association (SRA) – Gateway, which is comprised of nine-member communities and contracts with Ray Graham Association to provide inclusion services to residents with disabilities. He stated that in anticipation of Ray Graham Association's contract expiration June 30, 2024, the Gateway Special Recreation Association Board, which the Village is a member, solicited a Request for Proposal (RFP). Two bids were received, one from Ray Graham Association and on from the Oak Brook Park District. The Gateway Special Recreation Association Association Board voted unanimously to approve Ray Graham Association.

Superintendent Hayes stated the Village would be working with the SRA to provide locations for summer day camps and field usage.

Chairman Waverley questioned the length of the contract and Superintendent Hayes stated it was a two-year contract. Chairman Waverley asked the reason why the Gateway Special Recreation Association Board did not vote for Oak Brook Park District. Superintendent Hayes stated Oak Brook lacked specific experience and the Board felt it was better to stay with what the participants were used to. Users of the programming also supported staying with Ray Graham.

Commissioner Keane asked if the SRA currently works with the Oak Brook Park District. Superintendent Hayes replied that a lot of programming is done with Oak Brook.

There was a discussion regarding fee allocations and Superintendent Hayes explained the funding methodology. He stated staff looked at the cost of joining SEASPAR and the fees were higher.

MONTHLY REPORTS

A. Annual Pool Report

Superintendent Hayes provided the report. He reported the 2023 pool season was a success, with increases in memberships and programming, and Town Team continued to be a popular program. They received positive member feedback, especially related to the cleanliness of the pool and locker rooms.

He stated pool revenue increased in non-resident pool passes, swim team and pool rentals. The reason for the increase in non-resident pool passes was due to expanding the outreach to neighboring areas with marketing. He stated revenue decreased in daily fee and 10-punch passes which was mainly due to the weather. Revenue decreased slightly in resident passes.

Chairman Waverley asked which communities receive the expanded neighborly rate. Superintendent Hayes stated the rate was expanded to Darien. Other neighboring areas that receive the rate are: Brookfield, Burr Ridge, Countryside, Clarendon Hills, Downers Grove, Golfview Hills, Indian Head Park, LaGrange Highlands, LaGrange, LaGrange Park, Oak Brook, Western Springs, Westmont and Willowbrook.

Superintendent Hayes noted staff is evaluating ways to expand private swim lessons. Commissioner Hester asked when private lessons are taught and Superintendent Hayes stated private lessons are taught anytime the pool is open, based on staff availability.

Commissioner Boruff asked what programs generate the most revenue. Superintendent Hayes explained swim club and private rentals provide the most revenue.

There was a discussion about how private swim lessons are purchased. Recreation Supervisor Todd Linder stated lessons were sold in packs of five or ten and staff is going to start offering packs or five, ten or fifteen lessons. the pool passes were restructured in the registration system to accurately track the number of passes sold.

Superintendent Hayes stated operational adjustments, mainly reducing staffing during inclement weather, helped to reduce costs by more than \$30,000. He stated there were areas where expenses increased, including custodial expenses, guard certifications, pool chemicals, medical supplies and the general equipment budget. Included in the general equipment budget is the annual ongoing maintenance and several one-time facility improvements. General equipment budget expenses in 2023 included repairs of the dive wall fall pad, drain cover replacements, painting the baby pool mushroom and slide, along with several other projects. Recreation Supervisor Linder stated staff was looking into ways to lower the cost of chemicals by using different treatments.

There was a discussion regarding custodial services. Superintendent Hayes stated staff was happy with the custodial services provided and noted that cleaning supplies are included in the custodial expenses. Staff is working on finding the most competitive pricing.

Superintendent Hayes reported that based on feedback received, Saturday morning group lessons will be offered this year. Commissioner Hester expressed satisfaction that the Aquatic Coordinator was an adult and stated the group lessons were well run.

There was a discussion about pool events. Events returning in 2024 include Christmas in July, monthly \$5 Friday Nights, Scout Family Night, Father's Day, Red, White and Blue Day and Grandparents Day.

Superintendent Hayes noted the concession vendor, Ty's Treats, will not be returning this season as the owner will be going to college. The Village submitted a Request for Proposal and selected a new vendor. The vendor will be paid a flat fee, which has historically worked well.

Superintendent Hayes stated the two part-time Aquatic Coordinators, Christine and Tom will be returning this season. Another two Aquatic Coordinators will be added, which will ensure an adult is present at all times. About half of the staff has been hired and staff will recruit at Hinsdale Central High School. Adjustments were made to staff salaries based on survey from area municipalities who staff pools.

There was discussion regarding resident survey results. Positive feedback was received regarding the value. Feedback was also received about lounge chairs, day camps, lap lanes, the need for more shaded areas and the communication plan for pool closures.

Superintendent Hayes spoke about projects planned for 2024. These projects include:

- The replacement of lounge chairs.
- The replacement of a small heater. This is continued from last year and is currently underway.
- The repair and painting of the baby pool wood structure.
- The replacement of life jacket storage and the storage rack.
- A new air conditioner in the Manager's Office.

- · Yearly pump repairs.
- The annual heater cleaning.
- The purchase of safety equipment.
- The purchase of new portable stairs.
- A new ADA lift.

There was discussion about the Clarendon Hills pool and the possibility of it closing if a proposed referendum did not pass.

B. Annual KLM Report

Superintendent Hayes reported that the Lodge experienced a successful year of rentals in 2023 and that 2023 also represented a time of transition between staffing and operational changes. At the start of the 2024 season, the Facility Manager role was transitioned to a current Lodge employee with years of experience in various roles at the Lodge.

As part of the 2024 budget process, staff evaluated the overall facility operations, which included, but were not limited to fees, expenses, marketing, sales and staffing. The results offered a very detailed snap shot into the facility's health, which has helped staff plan for the future.

Future changes include reducing expenses through service adjustments and increasing sales through improved marketing, facility attractiveness and enhanced lead tracking. The annual report provides financial data and facility projects. Facility revenue data includes rental sales, and catering fees. Facility related expenses highlight wages and operating expenses.

At this time in 2024, the Lodge has already booked 70% of the facilities budgeted revenue for the year.

Chairman Waverley asked about the cost of the custodial services and Superintendent Hayes explained that custodial services include cleaning and also set up and take down of event furniture.

Commissioner Boruff asked about the event prices. Superintendent Hayes explained that staff is continuing to evaluate pricing and comparing the pricing to similar facilities in the Chicagoland area. Pricing currently varies based on the type of event being held.

Chairman Waverley asked about plans for 2024. Superintendent Hayes explained that staff has been tracking leads on various marketing sites to determine the best return on investment. With increased management and follow up of leads, staff is seeing more bookings. Recreation Supervisor Linder noted that since November 14, staff has followed up on 301 leads.

Commissioner Boruff asked about the conversion rate of leads. Superintendent Hayes noted that staff is working to provide more detailed information regarding the number of leads and the geographic area where the leads originate. Staff endeavors to respond to leads within 72 hours.

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Superintendent Hayes provided an overview of the 2023 projects at KLM and anticipated projects in 2024 including bathroom partitions, new sound system, lobby tv, exterior painting, water fountain replacement and a portable bar. Staff has also been in contact with a potential historical architect specializing in Zook who may be a resource for the Village regarding improvements in the future.

Recreation Supervisor Linder reported that staff launched a new software that allows caterers and guests to plan their event layout online. A virtual tour of the facility was also added to the website along with dates that are available and those that are booked.

Staff is continuing to work to benchmark operations to other similar facilities and will provide more information regarding that analysis as it develops.

B. HPTA Update

Superintendent Hayes reported that the lights at the Paddle Tennis Courts at Burns Field are in the process of being replaced. The HPTA is working with the Community Development Department on the process steps related to the proposed expansion of the Paddle Tennis Courts at KLM.

C. Holiday Registration Update

Superintendent Hayes noted that the holiday events were successful with 210 letters responded to by Santa, 550 participants at Winter Wonderland and 150 participants at the Pizza with Santa event.

D. Ice Rink Update

Superintendent Hayes noted that due to warmer than expected weather, the ice rink was not able to be installed this year.

February 8, 2024 Meeting Updates:

Elevate Program: A new adult program called Elevate is being developed, which will run during weekdays (Monday to Friday). It aims to provide services during the day, utilizing the community as the classroom and adhering to federal Home and Community Based Setting guidelines for community integration. The program will offer participants options to plan their day and learn through exposure, education, and experiences in their communities. It's set to launch in September, with Ray Gram Association in the initial planning and staff onboarding stages.

The Village of Hinsdale: Reports 21 participants registered for inclusive programs for the winter/spring season, marking the second-highest registration among nine municipalities within the organization.

March 14, 2028 Meeting Updates:

Gateways Summer Camp: The Village of Hinsdale will continue to host Gateways summer camp, but it will now be held at the Annex Building at KLM due to schedule updates to Burns Field. The camp is scheduled to run from June 10 to August 2, with weekly planned trips to the Hinsdale Community Pool.

Gateways Adult Softball Program: Scheduled to be held Tuesday evenings at Veeck Park from May to July.

Recreation Coordinator

More recently, in 2023, Tom was promoted to Recreation Supervisor overseeing all the recreation and fitness programs and the district's fitness center. We are pleased to have Tom as part of the Villages Parks and Recreation team and are looking forward to his years of experience.

Brochure Update


We are pleased to announce that the Summer Brochure for 2024 was made available online starting March 20, 2024. In an effort to ensure widespread awareness and in response to a suggestion by the Park and Recreation Commission, we have strategically placed 36-yard signs in our various parks to alert residents about the online release and opening of registration on April 1, 2024.

The 2024 Summer Brochure book features 13 special events, which will be jointly coordinated by both the Village and external organizations. Moreover, our comprehensive program guide will showcase an impressive array of 180 programs, encompassing a total of 406 classes. This marks a notable increase from our 2023 Summer Brochure, which presented 166 programs with 331 classes. The increase in classes is a result of a wider range of program offerings from various co-op locations.

The brochure has undergone significant updates, particularly regarding the organization of youth athletic classes. Instead of being sorted by contractor, these classes are now thoughtfully categorized by sport. This reorganization aims to enhance the user experience and streamline the process of finding desired classes.



The second step in the redesign is more of an internal adjustment to the program codes. Our new codes not only reference the season, but separate program types to align with our budget, and offer an assigned chronological system behind each activity number so we know exactly what number is being assigned. This change will offer staff a wide range of future reporting possibilities so programs can be thoroughly compared from season to season.

Parks Maintenance Monthly Highlights – February 2024

Contractual Maintenance

Spring clean-up is scheduled for April 22, 2024, at 4 p.m., aligning with Earth Day. Tree maintenance.

Contract was awarded for tree pruning in parks for 2024. Trees are being pruned at Katherine Legge Memorial Park and Brook Park.

Contract renewed for weekend and holiday garbage disposal for Village Parks and weekend maintenance of bathrooms.

General Park Maintenance

Bathroom shelters (six sites – 12 bathrooms, & 3 picnic shelters)

• KLM and Burns Field bathrooms are the only winter bathrooms open at times and were inspected, cleaned and stocked Monday-Friday.

Other

- Staff removed 7 dead trees at KLM Park and 2 dead/dangerous trees at Eleanor's Park.
- Staff began clearing the brush lines at Brook, Brush Hill and KLM Parks.
- Staff removed 15 declining Callery Pear trees at the pool. The areas will be repurposed to turf for additional space for pool patrons.
- Staff cut back woody ornamentals in Eleanor's Park and the Washington Lot Plaza
- Staff stored the ice rink components for the year.
- Preparation for 2024 athletic fields are under way with field layouts being determined, bad soccer nets being replaced and field paint being delivered by AYSO for the season.

Park Projects

Peirce

- The roof on the Pitch-in Kitchen was replaced in early March. This was a planned capital project. (Hinsdale Little League covered the cost of gutter replacements last fall. This helped the project come in under budget)
- Several of the garden plots were broken, staff has recently repaired these just in time as we have received our first two rental requests for the season.
- Bleacher replacements continue for a second year, with two new bleachers recently ordered to replace older bleachers.



Burlington

• Table replacements continue at Burlington Park with the second phase of black picnic tables being delivered. We have received a lot of positive feedback from staff on the easy movability of the tables and from users on the style.

<u>Burns</u>

• New garbage cans were ordered to replace older garbage cans at Burns Field. Brook

• The pickleball courts are scheduled for future full replacement, however staff has engaged with several companies to patch areas for the 2024 season.

Robbins Park

• A bench donation was received for Robbins Park. The new bench will be installed on the walking bath by the school.



KLM Park

 The Annex is scheduled to have the floors redone to match the rest of the outdoor park sites and had a fresh coat of paint applied. The space will be used for Special Recreation Summer Camp because Burns Field updates are taking place. The space also will be transitioned into a usable programming space for the Department.



Burns Field Playground Update

The Playground demolition began on March 15, 2024. Staff was able to identity over 2 dozen pieces of equipment to re-purpose to other playgrounds as needed. Overall the project is on budget and on schedule. A standing water issue was identified and is in the process of being evaluated. The new playground installation began on March 18, 2024. Staff has inspected the site daily for safety concerns and has received positive feedback from community members walking through the Park. Below are a few pictures of the project.









Hinsdale Community Pool

The 2024 pool season is under way with onboarding of staff. The Village is currently on pace to meet or exceed last year's staff levels. Staff has already started to work on several facility projects, which include finalizing a pool heater replacement, annual pump maintenance, repairs to the wood shade structure in the baby pool, replacement of 15 lounge chairs, renovations to the concession flooring and cabinets, and general facility organization. The upcoming month will be very busy at the pool as we clean and prepare the facility for filling the pools towards the end of April to support the Hinsdale Swim Club's early usage request in May.

KLM Projects

We have completed two more projects at KLM, which include replacement of the sound system and facility beverage area. The sound system is state of the art and allows us to have full digital control of all the speakers, improved sound, reduced footprint of equipment, and more microphone options. The portable beverage area is light weight and has wheels, allowing the Lodge to have more versatility in facility setup.

Background

The 2024 Capital Improvement Plan allocated funds in the amount of \$210,000 to renovate the tennis and basketball courts at Burns Field. There are six tennis courts and one full-size basketball court, serving as vital recreational spaces for the community. The basketball court is heavily utilized, while the tennis courts are integral for recreational programming and used by Hinsdale Central High School tennis teams. The tennis courts were last improved in 2015. Currently, both courts have deteriorating asphalt and paint. The Village is working with the High School to fund a portion of the improvements.

Discussion

To ensure effective project management, staff engaged Design Perspectives Inc. (DPI) for professional services. DPI was contracted to develop bid documents, manage the bidding process, and oversee court replacement. DPI has a proven track record of successful collaboration with the Village on various park projects, including recent renovations at IRMA Butler Tot Lot and Burns Field Tennis Courts in 2015.

Timely completion of the project is a priority before Hinsdale Central's fall tennis season. DPI advertised the bid package in the Hinsdalean and Daily Herald on March 19, 2024. Subsequently, the bid opening occurred on Wednesday, April 3, 2024.

Committee Action

Staff intends to request approval to award the project to the most appropriate bidder at the May 7, 2024 Board meeting. The Commission is being asked to provide a recommendation to proceed with the project to ensure that completion deadlines are met.





The nation's fastest growing sport is booming in Hinsdale! Here's what it is and how you can join the fun!



What is Pickleball?

A lot of us are pickled by Pickleball... we are here to help! Created in 1965, Pickleball is a sport that combines elements of tennis, badminton and ping-pong. It can be played both indoors or outdoors on a badminton sized court, with a slightly modified tennis net. The game is played with a paddle and a plastic ball with holes. Games are played as singles or doubles, and are typically 8-9 minutes long, played to eleven points. It is similar to tennis with serving, receiving and great play at the net. Pickleball is perfect for people who desire an aerobic exercise that can be done daily.

How is it played?

Pickleball has exploded across the country because of its social component. Like tennis, players organize games with friends and family, or it is played at organized times to insure similar levels of competition.

Facilities typically designate courts and times reserved for what is referred to as "Open Play" time. During "Open Play", players are encouraged to show up and play with other community members in a round robin format. No need to organize with others, just show up with your paddle! Players are rotated in and out of short games.

Register for lessons or join groups playing during the designated times on the Court Schedule! If you're new to Pickleball, try dropping in during an "Open Play" time or during beginner designated hours. You'll find people willing to play with you and show you the ropes!





BROOK PARK PICKLEBALL ROUND ROBIN PLAY

- 1. Specific ROUND ROBIN times are designated on the pickleball court schedule.
- 2. During designated ROUND ROBIN times anyone can use courts, but ROUND ROBIN participants have priority.
- 3. When courts are full and players are waiting to get access to a court, courts will be cycled after each game. If less than 12 players are waiting, cycling may be done in 2's rather than full courts.
- 4. Either "paddling" or the white board on the south side fence will be used to sequence the next players to use the first available vacant court.
- 5. People who wish to play with their set group can put themselves into the court rotation as a group. They should cycle in and out per the method indicated above.
- 6. Typical wait time to cycle in is between 1 and 15 minutes. Games typically last about 12-15 minutes.
- 7. Those wishing to play MORE THAN ONE GAME in a row with a set group of friends or family should pick a time outside of the designated ROUND ROBIN times or wait until ROUND ROBIN has slowed to allow for a court to be removed from cycling.
- 8. Times not listed as ROUND ROBIN are not subject to the rules listed above. Instead, courts are available on a first-come first-served basis. ROUND ROBIN may still happen during these times, but court priority goes to those that DO NOT wish to cycle into ROUND ROBIN. ROUND ROBIN groups should yield a court to any/all prearranged groups that wish to play.



All undesignated times are first come, first served.

*Priority during undesignated times are given to individual players and prearranged groups of players.

*Groups wishing to participate in Round Robin play outside of the above designated hours should yield court space to any/all prearranged groups or individual players.

*Court time is typically limited to 1 hour if there are other individuals or prearranged groups desiring a court. Cycling is not required.





DEFINITIONS

Round Robin- A group of people, often strangers, participating in rotational play. After each short game, players will leave the court and new players will rotate in.

Paddling- The use of a paddle/racket to indicate a place in line of play. Often times stuck into a chain link fence or lined up on a surface.

Cycling- When courts are rotated after each game and waiting players in paddling system have priority.





Dogs are ONLY permitted at the Off-Leash area at Katherine Legge Memorial Park during specific hours:

April 1st - October 31st 6:00A-10:00A 6:00P-9:00P

November 1st - March 31st 6:00A-10:00A 4:00P-8:00P

Park users with dogs must use the parking lot off county line road, west lot. Dogs must remain on leash and use the west area of the paved path to travel to the north end of the park.

To register for any recreation program and check availability, log on to the Village of Hinsdale's website. Online registrations close at noon one business day prior to the start of the class. *Credit card information is secure.*

If you have registered for any programs or pool memberships in the past, your household will be in the database.

- Do <u>NOT</u> set up another household.
- The default user name is your home phone number (all 10 digits with no spaces or dashes). If you don't have a home phone number, that number will be the cell number used on the registration form.
- The default password is your last name.
- You may change these once you log in.
- You must have a birth date for each household member in order to register.

If you are a new client, you can set up your household by using the 'new user' link.

- Set up your household with just a primary adult household member.
- The rest of the family members can be added once the household is created.
- You can view information as a guest without having to set up a household.







Once you have logged in, you can search activities, renew pool memberships, and buy event tickets.

- 4. A program may be cancelled due to insufficient registration. A household credit will be issued.

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Refund Policy

- Full refunds/credits will not be made unless the Parks and Recreation Department cancels the program or a physician's excuse is presented.
- There will be a \$5.00 service charge on all other refund/credits for all cancelled programs unless the program is cancelled by the Parks and Recreation office.
- Refunds/credits issued after the start date of a class will be prorated in addition to the service charge.
- Programs cancelled by either the Parks or Recreation Dept. or by the client will automatically go on your household account as a credit balance unless otherwise specified.
- Refunds or credits will not be given after the second class for any program.
- Refund checks will not be issued under \$25.00. All refunds will be returned in the form of a check and takes 4 6 weeks. *All requests for refunds must be in writing.*
- Pool memberships, visit passes and private swim lessons are NOT refundable.

2024 Pool Membership Information

All pool members are required to have a photo identification pass for the current season from the Hinsdale Parks and Recreation Department. The pool membership pass must be swiped to gain entrance into the Hinsdale Community Swimming Pool, or the daily rate will be required. Any child two years and over needs a pool pass or must pay the daily fee.

Pool memberships are available by family or individual to Hinsdale residents (with proof of residency) and non-residents. Family members are your dependents; those persons claimed on your income tax return and living in the same household. (Verification of dependency may be required before passes are issued). Family members DO NOT include caregivers and au pairs. A nanny pass can be purchased for any caregiver. The nanny pass can only be purchased with a family membership. Grandchildren or children staying with you during the summer cannot be included on a family membership. Daily visit cards can be purchased ahead of time or the daily fee will need to be paid.

Pool memberships and guest passes are non-refundable and non-transferable. Proof of residency is required before any new membership will be issued. A recent utility or tax bill will need to be shown as proof of residency.

All patrons that received a pool pass in previous years can validate their cards by paying for their 2024 membership. New cards are only necessary if you did not receive a picture ID in previous years. Children can get new pass photos taken every 3 or 4 years.

New members will need to have a photo ID pass made for each member of the family two years and older. A pool membership form and the correct fees are required before passes will be issued. It is not necessary that the entire family be present at the same time for photos to be taken. Membership information is on file and passes can be made at any time during normal office hours. Pictures can also be taken at the Hinsdale Swimming Pool. **Regular pool memberships can be renewed on-line if you are renewing exactly the same type of pass.** New memberships cannot be purchased on-line as proof of residency is required.

Lost pool passes can be replaced at \$10 per person. New pictures do not need to be taken for lost passes.



Receive a discount off the daily admission rate by purchasing a 10 visit pass. Passes are transferable. Visits are good only for the 2023 season. 10-visit passes from any other year are NOT valid. 10-Visit Pass costs \$90 for residents and \$130 for non-residents.

General Pool Rules and Regulations

- Everyone entering the facility must have a valid pool pass or pay the daily admission to enter. No Exceptions.
- All residents using the pool on a daily basis must offer proof of residency (driver's license, library card, and/or utility bill) or pay the non-resident daily admission rate.
- Proper swim wear must be worn in the water—no cutoffs, shorts or street clothes are permitted.
- The facility is smoke free. Smoking is not permitted inside the facility and must be done off pool property.
- Only children 7 years and younger are permitted in the wading pool.
- If your child is not potty-trained, the Department of Public Health requires that a swim diaper and plastic pants must be worn.
 Disposable diapers are strictly prohibited. Please do not change babies on the deck.
- Persons under the age of 12 years must be accompanied by someone 15 years or older.
- Glass or other material that might create hazardous conditions or interfere with efficient operations of the swimming pool shall not be permitted on pool property.
- The Hinsdale Parks & Recreation Department and its staff are not responsible for damaged, lost or stolen valuables. Coin operated lockers are available. Do not bring valuables to the pool.
- Toys are permitted in the wading pool. The use of toys is prohibited in the lap pool for safety reasons. The use of rafts and flotation devices is also prohibited.
- Life jackets commonly known as Personal Floatation Devices (PFD's) with a Coast Guard rating of Class III will be allowed in facility if worn properly and with adult supervision. Parents must be within arms length of a child using a PFD.
- For their own safety, no person may ride the slides with children in their lap. Children may not wear Personal Floatation Devices while riding the water slide or using diving boards in the diving well.
- All persons visiting the pool must conduct themselves in a manner so as not to cause harm to self, others, or to interfere with the lifeguards on duty. No running, boisterous or rough play is permitted.
- Persons violating any personal conduct regulations, either written or verbal, will be subject to eviction without a refund or other disciplinary action.
- Lost and found articles will be kept for one week and then donated to charity.
- Whenever additional rules or regulations are deemed advisable for the protection of the health and safety of the patrons, the management shall put into effect such rules, either printed or verbal. Exceptions to the rules are only allowed with permission from the management.

Project Description & Justification

In 2001, the Village of Hinsdale completed a Master Plan for Parks & Recreation. The Master Plan included items such as expanding the lacrosse fields at KLM, rebuilding picnic shelters, improving the pool, and more were included. The 2001 Master Plan items were completed by 2017. The Master Plan will lay the foundation for an organizational framework for improving parks and recreation facilities, programs, and services to better serve the public.

The Master Plan shapes the delivery of local government parks and recreation services, programs, and activities in a manner that is consistent with a local government's comprehensive plan and policy agenda. Parks and recreation master planning also shapes successful communities, including providing a foundation for economic development. Staff will look to create a hybrid committee and offset the cost by exploring grant opportunities.

Project Update

The CY 2023 CIP included \$180,000 for the replacement of the Burns Park Playground. This playground is the oldest playground in the Village's parks system (21 years) and is at the point where it needs replacement. Staff identified a joint purchasing program for the purchase and installation of the playground that was recently used by School District 181 at Monroe School. The joint purchasing program provides for some choice of colors and amenities within the defined budget parameters.

The soccer goals at Veeck and Robbins Parks are in poor condition. In some cases, the goals are broken entirely, creating a safety hazard. These goals are heavily used by recreation programs and as part of our field rentals with groups such as American Youth Soccer Organization (AYSO). Veeck Park currently houses the Village's only lit soccer fields. The fields at Veeck and Robbins Parks generate significant field rental revenue for the Village during prime rental months of April through October each year. In 2022, the Parks and Recreation Department collected \$20,736 in field rental fees. New goals are needed to meet the high demand of the local soccer organizations. The Lodge at Katherine Legge Memorial Park is utilized for private rental events such as weddings, memorial services and other social activities. The Katherine Legge Memorial Lodge was constructed in the 1920s and has a dark, gothic like appearance inside. The carpeting in the dining, alcove, office and stairs was replaced in 2015; however, the product is showing significant signs of staining and damage. Additionally, the tile laid around the carpeting is showing signs of damage and disrepair. The aesthetics of the Lodge make a strong first impression for clients that are booking the venue for their wedding or special event. The declining condition of the carpeting, along with its dated pattern, are often noted when touring potential clients. The life expectancy for this carpeting is 10 years. The recommendation is to replace the carpeting with high traffic carpet, in a more modern aesthetic. The significant facelift and consistency of flooring will help in securing more rentals of the Lodge facility. Improvements made to the Katherine Legge Memorial Lodge will allow staff to potentially increase rentals fees as a result of the upgrades.

Project Description & Justification

There are four vertical turbine pumps installed in 1992 that circulate the pool water. The pumps have a life expectancy of 12-15 years, but Village staff has established a maintenance schedule for the four pool pumps in order to extend the life of the equipment. Based on this schedule, the recommended interval between service times for each pump is generally five years.

The pool filtration system is comprised of four media vessels that house filter media: two serve the lap pool and two serve the dive well and kiddie pool. The filter media within the vessels use a combination of sand and stone to filter out particulates to improve pool water quality and disinfection. The benefits of replacing the filter media include:

- A reduction in backwashing frequency that saves make-up water consumption.
- A reduction of make-up water consumption reduces heating costs.

• The filter media reduces chemical costs as it maintains the pool water quality and an optimal environment for disinfection.

The pool filtration system was originally installed in 1992. The filter media is recommended to be replaced every 10 to 15 years. The last time the filter media was replaced was in 2008.

Below is a summary of the pump and filter media maintenance schedule. Public Services staff manages the pool maintenance and will evaluate the pumps and filter media prior to and throughout each season to ensure that they continue to operate as needed.





Project Description & Justification

Flagg Creek flows through the north end of KLM Park carrying the majority of the water from South of 55th Street from Madison Street to Flagg Creek. The flow of the water has caused deterioration of the asphalt bridge and the area around the access road. The creek bed erosion encroaches on the trees along the creek. Staff recommends that an engineering study be undertaken to evaluate the conditions and solutions to stabilize the road and creek bed. Work in the creek will require working with multiple entities, including the Illinois Department of Natural Resources, the U.S. Army Corp of Engineers, Flagg Creek Sanitary District, the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District, and the Village of Burr Ridge.



There are tennis courts and a basketball court at Robbins Park, which are used regularly for resident and school recreation programs. The court surface shows deterioration - portions of the overlay are worn, and cracks have developed across the court surface. This project will include crack fill and color coating that will rejuvenate the surface. With annual maintenance, the crack fill and color coating have an estimated life expectancy of 7-10 years. Full restoration has a life expectancy 20-25 years, however, freeze and thaw cycles can affect the lifespan. 

Project Description & Justification

The Lodge at Katherine Legge Memorial Park is a popular spot for events such as weddings, birthdays, corporate events, and family gatherings. The current patio layout makes it difficult to accommodate large-scale outdoor events. Guests using tents must place half of their tent on the patio, leaving the other half to rest on the grass. This is not ideal, as rain during an event means that half of the tent is resting in mud instead of on the patio.
