

**VILLAGE OF HINSDALE  
ENVIRONMENT AND PUBLIC SERVICES COMMITTEE MINUTES  
MONDAY, MARCH 11, 2013**

Chairman Laura LaPlaca called the meeting of the Environment and Public Services Committee to order at 7:36 P.M., Monday March 11, 2013, in Memorial Hall of the Memorial Building, 19 East Chicago Avenue, Hinsdale, IL.

**PRESENT:** Chairman Laura LaPlaca, Trustee Doug Geoga, Trustee William Haarlow, Trustee Bob Saigh

**ABSENT:** None

**ALSO PRESENT:** Dave Cook, Village Manager; George Franco, Director of Public Services; Tom Bueser, Deputy Director of Public Services; John Finnell, Village Arborist; and Dan Deeter, Village Engineer.

**Approval of Minutes – February 11, 2013**

The EPS Committee reviewed the minutes from the February 11, 2013 meeting. Trustee Geoga, Chairman LaPlaca, and Trustee Saigh commented on the minutes. Trustee Saigh motioned for approval of the February 11, 2013 minutes as revised. Trustee Haarlow seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

**Public Services Monthly Report**

Mr. Franco noted that the Village has used it's quota of snow removal material due to the recent snow events. Staff will keep the committee apprised of the status of snow removal activities.

**Engineering Monthly Report**

Mr. Deeter updated the committee on the status of the Oak Street Bridge replacement, the 2012 Resurfacing and Reconstruction Projects, and the 2013 Resurfacing and Reconstruction Projects. The Final Public Meeting for Phase 1 will be held on 03/12/13 at 7 PM at the Village Hall. The public is encouraged to attend and provide comments. Public comments will be accepted up to two weeks after the meeting. IDOT has notified the Village that they will audit the Garfield Street Improvement Project. The Resident Engineer on the project, Mr. Matt Abbeduto from HR Green, will review his documentation with the IDOT personnel.

**Status of Qualifications Based Selection (QBS) Process for the Oak Street Bridge Replacement Project (Discussion).** Chairman LaPlaca introduced this agenda item. Mr. Deeter reviewed the QBS process for selecting an engineering consultant for Phase 2 (Design Engineering) for the Oak Street Bridge Replacement Project. It is the Village evaluation team opinion is that both engineering consultant

teams have demonstrated the engineering expertise, coordination and management abilities to successfully accomplish the design engineering phase. The evaluation team felt that HR Green had demonstrated excellent customer service to the Village and Village residents on previous construction projects within the Village. Chairman LaPlaca remarked that HR Green has provided excellent support during the Woodlands Phase 1 project. Further, the HR Green team included the same designer who gathered resident input to develop the aesthetic characteristics of the bridge during Phase 1. The evaluation team unanimously recommended HR Green as the best qualified engineering consultant to conduct the Phase 2. After some questions, the committee unanimously agreed with the evaluation team's recommendation.

The Village staff and IDOT will begin negotiations with HR Green to develop a contract for Phase 2. Once negotiated, the contract will be presented to the EPS Committee and the Board of Trustees for approval.

**Central Business District Parking and Alley Options (Discussion)** Chairman LaPlaca introduced this agenda item. During the development of the proposed Garfield Crossing development at the corner of First and Garfield, several residents have provided suggestions to address the issue of trucks loading/unloading on First Street. Considering the central business district issues as a whole, the staff developed two alternatives:

- Obtaining public right-of-way for an alley directly south of the west half of the 000-block of E. First Street
- Connecting the existing Washington Street parking lot and the proposed Garfield Crossing parking lot.

Mr. Deeter commented on the two alternatives. Mr. Carl Weber addressed the committee about the need for the alley alternative and potential acquisition costs. Mr. Jim Brody addressed the committee about the options.

Considering the routine traffic problems that loading/unloading trucks create on First Street, the committee members agreed that these suggestions were worthy of consideration. After some discussion about the alternatives, Chairman LaPlaca identified the following activities for future consideration:

1. Staff will investigate the presence of coal cellars in/under the alley.
2. Staff will contact the owner, Mr. Lee Wish to determine his interest.
3. Staff will contact the Chamber of Commerce to understand their position on these options.
4. Staff will coordinate with the CMAP parking task force.
5. Staff will coordinate with Chief Bloom about potential truck loading zones locations and times.

6. This investigation will continue in parallel with the Garfield Crossing development process.

**To Approve a Resolution for the Chestnut Street Construction Contract Change Order Number 5 in the Amount of \$195,046.41 Deduction to Martam Construction, Inc.** Chairman LaPlaca introduced this agenda item. Mr. Deeter provided additional comments. This is the final change order which includes the final line item reconciliation and project close-out. The punch-list for the project was completed in 2012 and there have been no warranty items to be address at this time. Trustee Saigh moved to approve. Trustee Haarlow seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

**To Approve A Resolution for Maintenance of Streets and Highways by Municipalities under the Illinois Highway Code.** Chairman LaPlaca introduced this agenda item appropriating funds for the annual 50/50 sidewalk program. Trustee Haarlow had a question about the Village's obligation to repair sidewalks. This was addressed by Mr. Cook. Trustee Geoga moved to approve. Trustee Saigh seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

**To Recommend to the Board of Trustees the change order repairs to Well #5 to Municipal Well and Pump in the amount of \$31,254.00** Chairman LaPlaca introduced this agenda item. Mr. Franco provided additional information concerning pump maintenance and the need for the additional repairs. After questions and discussion by the committee, Trustee Geoga moved to approve. Trustee Haarlow seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

**To Approve a Resolution Approving and Accepting a Plat of Subdivision to Re-subdivide The Properties Commonly Known as 127, 135 and 145 E. Fifth Street in the Village of Hinsdale, County of DuPage.** Chairman LaPlaca introduced this agenda item. After some discussion among the committee members, Trustee Geoga moved to approve. Trustee Saigh seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

**To Approve the award of bid # 1540 to Water Services in the contract price of \$8,200.00.** Chairman LaPlaca introduced this agenda item. Trustee Geoga moved to approve. Trustee Saigh seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

**To Approve the award of bid #1539 to American Underground Inc, not to exceed the budgeted amount of \$40,000.00.** Chairman LaPlaca introduced this agenda item. Trustee Geoga moved to approve. Trustee Haarlow seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

**To Approve the award of bid #1536 for the service of tree and stump removal to Homer tree Care Inc, not to exceed the budgeted amount of \$65,000.00.**

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## MEMORANDUM

**SUBJECT: PUBLIC SERVICES MONTHLY REPORT-MARCH 2013**  
**Date:** 4/2/13

The Public Service Department dispatched snow and ice crews 5 times during March, plowing snow/ice and spreading 229 tons of rock salt on roadways with an additional 2 tons of rock salt used to treat village sidewalks, ramps, and stairs. The cost for chemicals used was \$11,704.00 for rock salt. These crews have logged approximately 209 overtime hours and 145 regular hours for snow removal operations, which included removing snow from the Business District one time during February. The sidewalks in the Business District were shoveled once for a cost of \$595.00. A comparison of time and materials related to snow and ice operations from this year to last year (through March 31st) is as follows:

equipment and prepare equipment for more seasonal tasks. Public Service crews also responded to and repaired 1 water main break during the month of March which was located at Vine St. and Chicago Avenue.

The Public Service Department has been involved with other projects, which include:

- The continuation of the small tree pruning program, with Village crews pruning 204 trees with a diameter of 15 inches or less (1,756 trees in this category have been pruned over the winter season); crews have also completed 24 resident requests pruning 37 trees.
- The continuation of the tree pruning contract, with The Care of Trees pruning 588 parkway trees with a diameter of over 15 inches since November 2012.
- Public Services staff has reviewed and commented on 9 tree preservation plans submitted for building/demolition permits.
- Monitoring of sump pump discharge locations, which require maintenance to remove icing hazards on roadways. During March, crews used approximately 8 tons of salt and 12 man hours to salt and scrape the ice from various locations throughout town.
- The installation and removal of two sets of banners on decorative light poles in the Business District.
- The preparation of athletic fields for the upcoming season, which includes layout, striping, and placement of goals.
- The removal of 6 EAB positive ash trees in February, 73 EAB positive ash trees have been removed since February 2011.
- Pot hole patching crews have been making temporary repairs to the roadways and alleys. During March, these crews have used approximately 23.5 tons of cold mix and 18.5 tons of gravel for repairs.

The Public Services Department will be targeting the following tasks in April:

- Preparation of the Community Pool for the upcoming season.
- Completion the athletic field layout and weekly maintenance.
- Completion of the prescribed prarie burns on Jackson St. and Charleston Rd.
- The black dirt and seed parkway restoration of areas throughout the Village which have been impacted by water main break excavations or snow plow damage.
- The second year of ash tree treatments on selected trees.
- The opening of parkland bathroom facilities and the start of weekend refuse removal from parklands as weather permits.

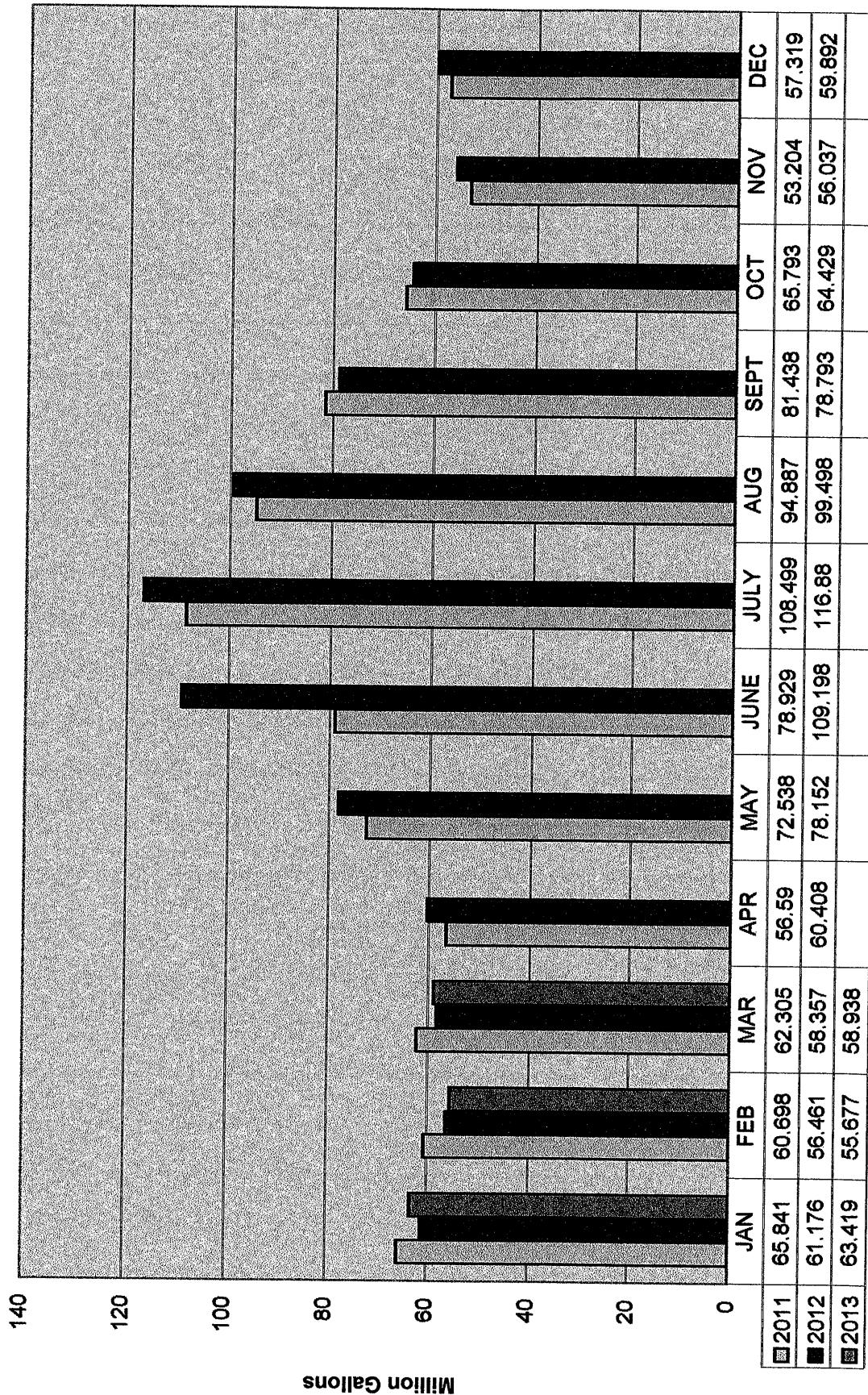
#### **PARKS MAINTENANCE**

Parks maintenance crews continued emptying trash receptacles while cleaning and stocking bathroom facilities. Crews finished all small engine maintenance in preparation for the spring season. KLM paddle tennis courts were shoveled and trash receptacles were provided for a tournament. Robbins Park was cleaned and prepared for the Easter egg hunt, which included turf restoration, clearing trash and debris from the grounds, moving snow piles from parking lots and stocking supplies for the egg hunt. Graffiti was removed from various locations around Village property. Parks maintenance crews began opening fields for spring athletics. Preparation includes moving goals from storage, planning, laying out fields, and striping.

#### **BUILDING MANTENANCE**

Building maintenance crews have been monitoring and servicing heating systems in all Village owned buildings, making repairs as needed. Service calls for March include: testing of all electrical fire detection units, reset all Village clocks and timers, light fixture replacement at KLM lodge and annex bathrooms, ran wiring for PD cameras in lobby area, and checked the Village Hall and Police and Fire Dept. generators for proper operation.

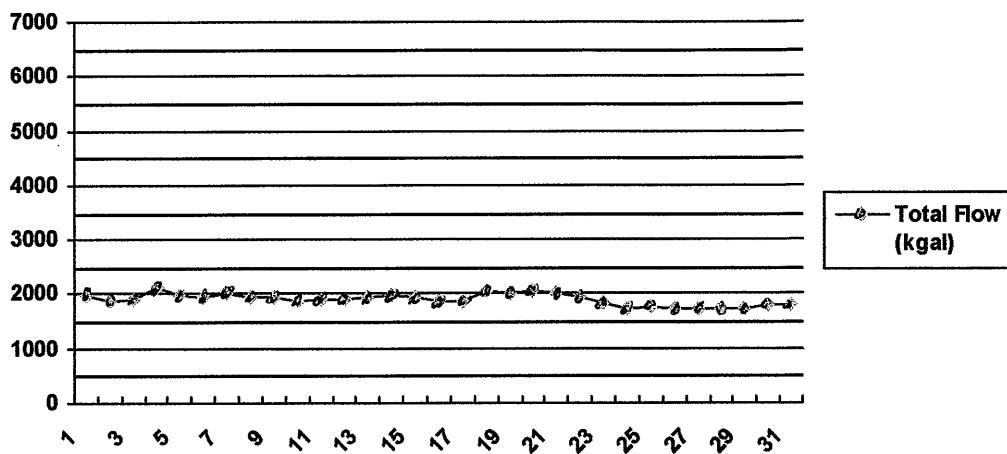

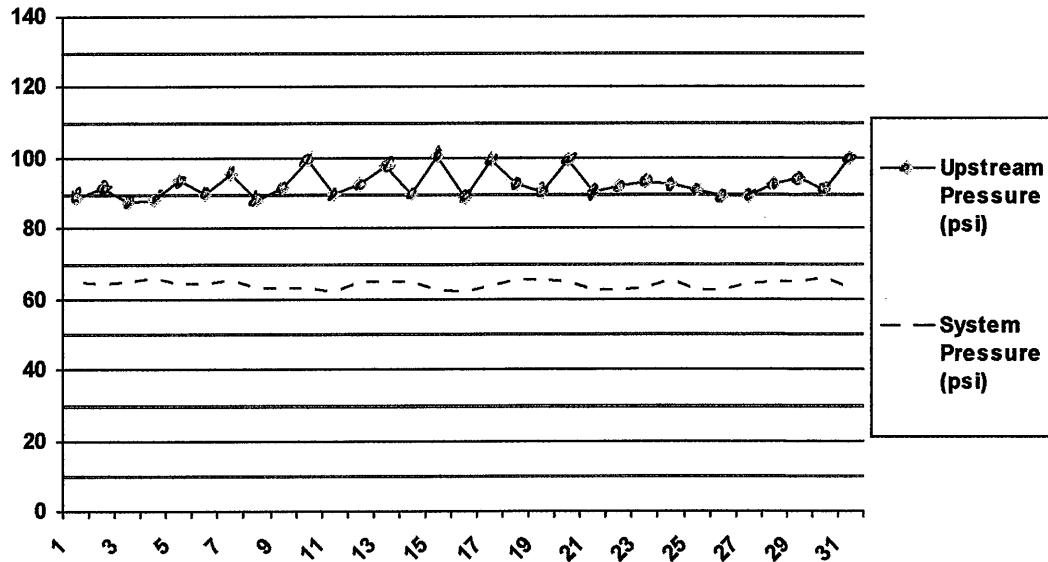

Daily Flows from DWC

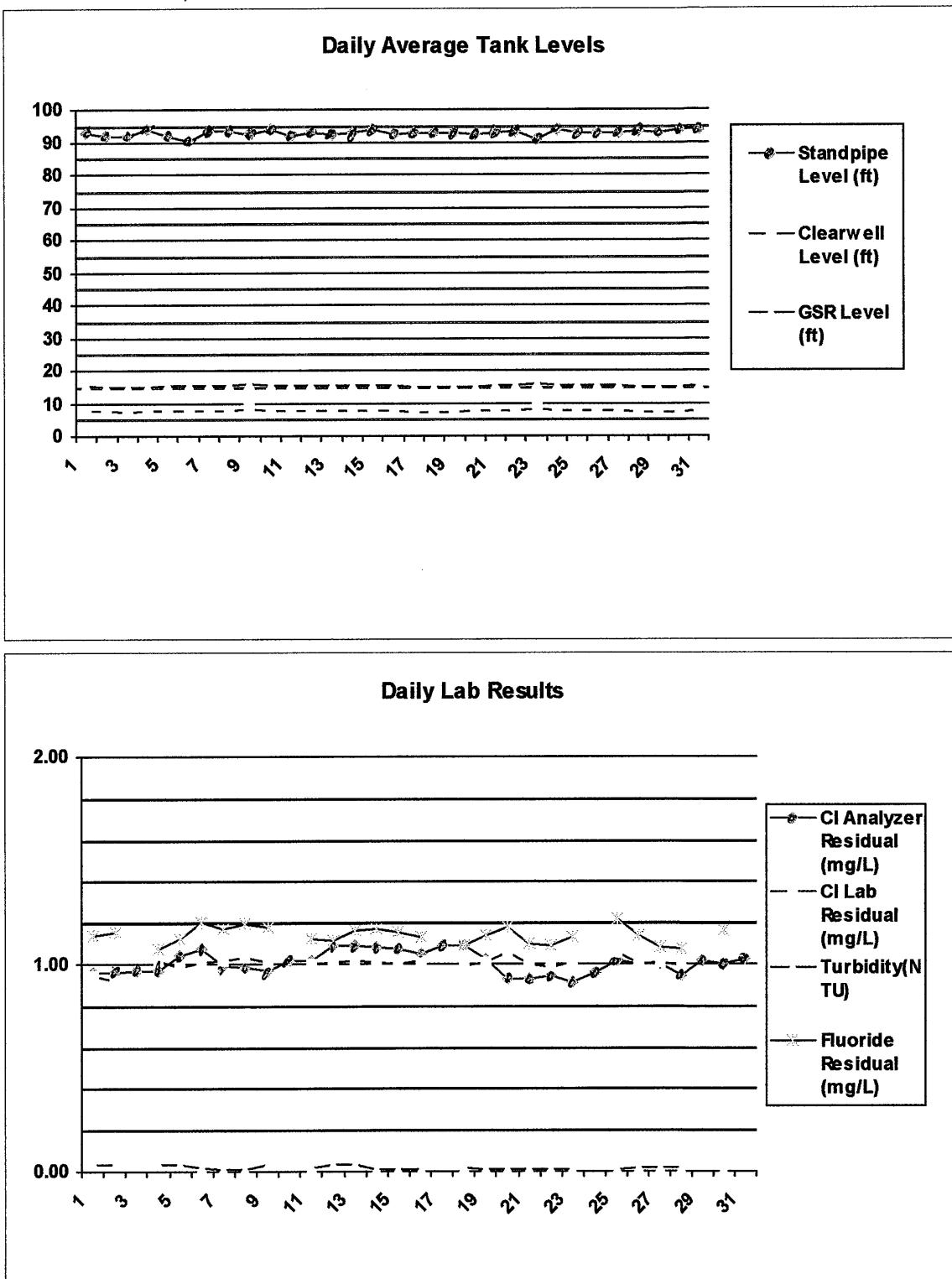


Daily Average Pressures



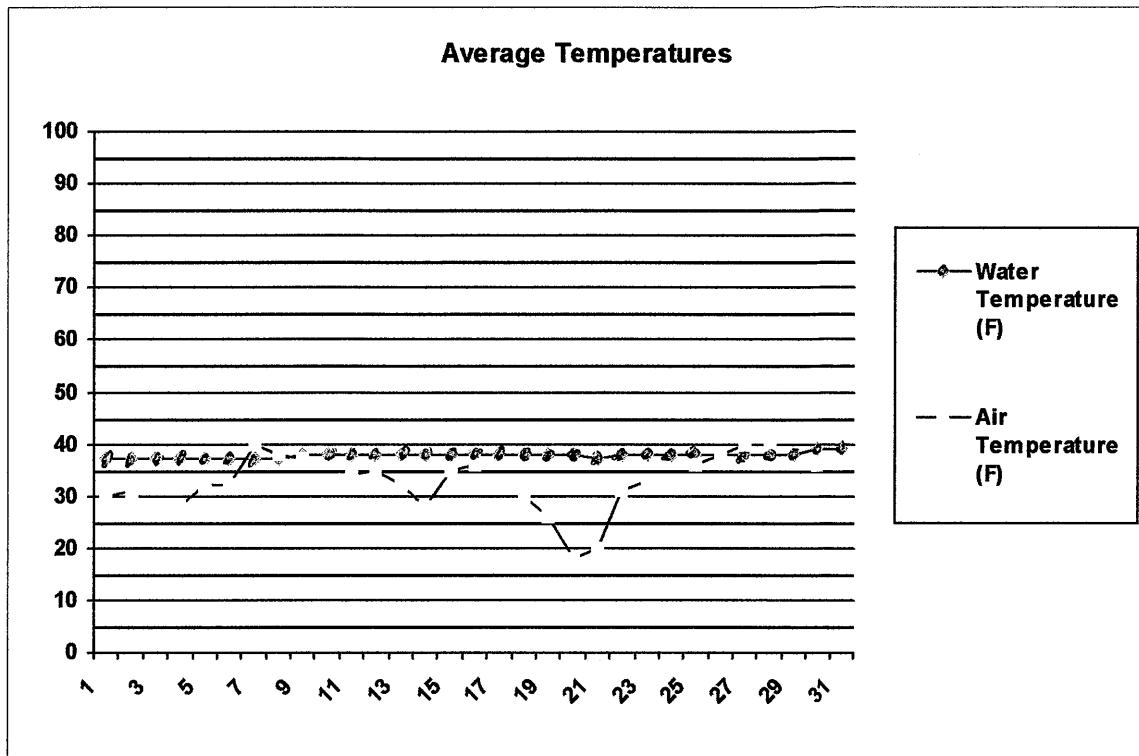

The Village of Hinsdale recently applied for and attended a meeting of the West Suburban Mass Transit District for the Highland train station commuter parking lot resurfacing which is included in the FY2013-14 budget. The Village was awarded a grant not to exceed 2/3 of the cost for the repairs to be completed not to exceed \$150,000.00. The current estimated cost of repairs is \$123,986.00. The approved grant from WSMTD would be approximately \$82,658.00 for these repairs.

The Public Service Department also received notice from the Metropolitan Mayors Caucus that the EAB reforestation grant will be awarded in the amount of \$10,000.00. This grant total will be utilized to plant an additional 40 trees on parkways throughout the Village.

As you are aware, BNSF recently completed renovations to the train platform and stairwell. As a result of the heavy equipment used during construction, the lot is now in need of major repairs. The lot provides 53 regular and 4 handicapped spaces. The lot is 194" by 135". The estimated cost of repairs is \$123,986 and the village is requesting that WSMTD approve a grant not to exceed \$82,658 (2/3 of the cost). Attached are the estimated costs for the project as prepared by our Village Engineer.

In the on-going effort to manage Dutch elm disease and Emerald Ash Borer in the Village staff continues to investigate treatment options for elm and ash tree preservation. As part of the annual elm preservation program staff received 5 bids for preventative fungicide treatments. The low qualified bidder was Tree R Us with a contract comparison bid of \$9.95 per diameter inch of trunk. Included in the contract, Trees R Us has agreed to offer their bid price (cost per diameter inch) to any interested Village of Hinsdale resident who wishes to treat a tree on their private property.

**RE:** Central Business District Parking and Alley Options (Discussion)

---

During the March 11, 2013 Environment and Public Services committee meeting, staff presented two options for improving traffic patterns in the 000-block of East First Street. These options are 1) obtaining public right-of-way for an alley directly south of the west half of the 000-block of E. First Street, and 2) connecting the existing Washington Street parking lot and the proposed Garfield Crossings parking lot.

Considering the routine traffic problems that loading/unloading trucks create on First Street, the committee members agreed that these suggestions were worthy of consideration. After some discussion about the options, Chairman LaPlaca identified the following activities for future consideration. The results of staff's investigation are noted below each activity.

1. Staff will investigate the presence of coal cellars in/under the alley.
  - a. Research by staff indicated that only 101 S. Washington may have a coal cellar extending into the alley. During a site visit, staff found that 101 S. Washington had an 11-foot by 10-foot room under the alley (south of the building's southern wall). The room appears to have a concrete ceiling (unknown thickness) supported by two 4-inch metal columns on square concrete footings. The columns and footings appeared to be a later addition to the room. Staff cannot speculate as to the bearing capacity of this room. We recommend that the alley owner employ a licensed Illinois structural engineer to evaluate the room/alley load bearing capacity. Staff also found a +/-1-foot wide, grated opening south of the southern wall at 8 E. First Street. This opening is not within the wheel path of vehicles using the alley and is not considered an obstacle to vehicle traffic in the alley.
2. Staff will contact the owner, Mr. Lee Wish to determine his interest in selling this property.
  - a. Mr. Lee Wish was contacted and stated that he would consider selling the property.

3. Staff will contact the Chamber of Commerce to understand their position on these options.
    - a. Mr. Deeter and McGinnis presented the alley option to the Chamber of Commerce on March 27, 2013. A response from the Chamber of Commerce is attached.
  4. Staff will coordinate with the CMAP parking task force.
    - a. Mr. Tim Scott discussed the options with the parking task force. They were in favor of any option that increases the overall parking in the central business district.
  5. Staff will coordinate with Chief Bloom about potential truck loading zones locations and times.
    - a. Chief Bloom's observations on addressing the parking problem are attached.
  6. This investigation will continue in parallel with the Garfield Crossing development process.

Dear President Cauley and Village Board of Trustees,

Recently, the Hinsdale Chamber of Commerce Executive Board had the opportunity to review ideas for a proposed reconfiguration of the alley-way located behind the Chamber's building. At this meeting, two options were presented by Village staff, and they stated that the idea was being offered as a means to potentially improve delivery of goods by truck to businesses located on the south side of First Street between Washington and Garfield.

After reviewing, the Chamber Executive Board discussed the issue at length and came to the following observations:

- Of the two options presented, implementation of the one most intrusive to the Chamber's property would require an estimated 300+ square foot loss in actual building space. This would decrease the property's value and result in lost revenue since the remaining first floor tenant space would be much less attractive for leasing.
- Both options would have a limited impact on total actual truck deliveries on First Street since such an alley would only serve merchants on the south side of the street. The proposal would not change the manner in which deliveries are made for merchants on the north side of the street and for those accessing alley-ways for deliveries to the merchants of the east side of Washington Street.
- Both options reduce/limit accessibility to the Washington Street parking lot for convenient use by all pedestrians including shoppers, permit holders, and Hinsdale Middle School students.

In conclusion, the Chamber's Executive Board believes that neither option produces a substantial benefit nor merits additional consideration, and that the proposal is neither economically sound nor a fiscally responsible use of tax payer monies. The Board would much rather prefer to see these financial resources applied to parking solutions for the central business district.

Dan,

We researched if any communities had tried to regulate truck delivery hours and found none. We have a couple of choices; we could remove some metered spaces and designate a truck loading zone or we could do a curb cut on Garfield just south of First Street to widen the street and allow for truck unloading on the west side of the street. The problem is that we lack area in the BD that provide ample room for truck parking. I would not recommend that they block alleys and make them impassable to traffic and fire apparatuses.

If the issue is the semi-truck from Sysco unloading on First Street between Wash and Garf then our best approach may simply be to talk with the driver/restaurant and see if we can change their delivery time to early morning or evening to have less impact on BD traffic. Brad

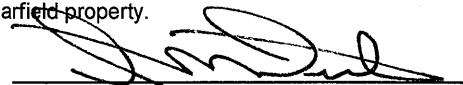

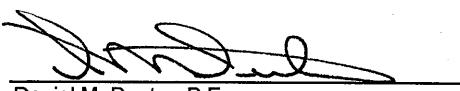

Contractors for Village of Hinsdale infrastructure improvement projects have routinely requested a daily project start time of 7:00 AM as opposed to the 8:00 AM start time specified in section 9-12-2 of the Village Code of Hinsdale. The contractor's request is based on the area dumps' operating hours - 7:00 AM to 3:00 PM on weekdays. The 8:00 AM start time decreases their daily excavation and material disposal rate by 12.5%. This, in turn, lengthens the duration of projects and the associated inconvenience to our residents.

During the last two years staff has surveyed residents in each project area concerning a possible earlier (7:00 AM) start time. The impacted residents' responses were in favor of an earlier start time as shown below:

Section 1. Village Code Amended. Title 9 (Building Regulations), Chapter 12 (Miscellaneous Provisions), Section 2 (Limitations on Noise), subsection D (Work By Public Agencies) is amended to read in its entirety as follows:

#### 9-12-2: LIMITATIONS ON NOISE

\* \* \*

D. Work By Public Agencies: The limitations stated in subsections A and B of this section may be waived by the board of trustees by resolution for work undertaken by any public body or agency for the benefit of the public. For work being performed by the village or its subcontractors as part of the village's capital improvement program, the village manager may administratively waive the start time limitations stated in subsections A and B. The board of trustees or the village manager, as applicable, may attach to any such waiver all conditions it deems necessary to protect the public health, safety, or welfare.

\* \* \*

Section 2 Severability and Repeal of Inconsistent Ordinances. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any of the other provisions of this Ordinance. All ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage, approval, and publication in pamphlet form in the manner provided by law.

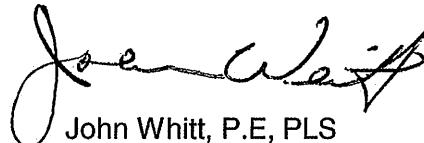

A bid summary is attached. The bids are based upon estimated quantities. Final pay outs will be dependent upon actual work done.

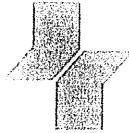

In accordance with the Request for Bids, the Village of Hinsdale opened Bids for the 2013 Street Improvements – Reconstruction (#1543) Project on Tuesday morning, March 26, 2013. The Engineer sent out Bid Advertisements to eleven (11) contractors and two (2) construction news journals. The project consists of the reconstruction of Portland Cement Concrete (PCC) and bituminous pavement structure using a Hot Mix Asphalt (HMA) cross-section on 8,500± linear feet of various residential roads and streets throughout Hinsdale including portions of Third Street, Fourth Street, Sixth Street, Bodin Street, Monroe Street, Oak Street, Park Avenue, Railroad Avenue, Stough Street, Thurlow Street and Alley (between Thurlow Street and Madison Street). 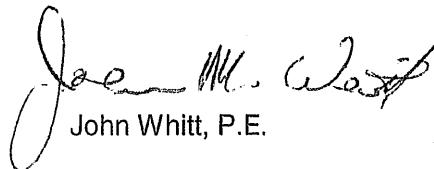
