NON-HOME RULE SALES TAX REFERENDUM

President Cauley opened discussion by stating that last week the Board of Trustees had approved placing a 1% sales tax referendum on the February 2, 2010 Primary ballot. In conversation with Trustees since then regarding the advisability of waiting until the November election to put this to voters, he agrees there are three compelling reasons to consider a postponement. These are as follows: refining the infrastructure master plan, demonstrating the fiscal responsibility of the Board to the community and hopefully having a grassroots movement to educate and bring residents on board with the referendum. Therefore, the Board has before them an ordinance to repeal the previously adopted ordinance and to approve the referendum question for November 2010.

Trustee Angelo moved Approve an Ordinance Placing a Referendum on the November 2, 2010, General Election Ballot Regarding Imposing a Non-Home Rule Municipal Retailers' Occupation Tax and Non-Home Rule Municipal Service Occupation Tax in the Village of Hinsdale. Trustee Saigh seconded the motion.

Discussion followed. Trustee Williams expressed concern about approving this item a year in advance when much can happen in that time. President Cauley explained this is an affirmative step at this time, provides sufficient lead time for a successful result and if something changes this can be rescinded. Trustee Schultz commented the cart is before the horse; we need to align the citizen group and then put it on the ballot. Trustee Geoga said having a target to aim at as we address the 2010 budget cycle will provide a goal. Trustee Saigh stated that this is a demonstration of our resolve as a Board, it is not that onerous, if circumstances develop that indicate this should not be on the ballot, there is plenty of time to remove it. Trustee LaPlaca said we shouldn't go into this with the thought that we can take it off the ballot, we needed this money six months ago and she doesn't believe enough will change between now and November where this won't need to be a fundamental part of a plan. Trustee Cauley said he has no reservations about putting this on the ballot. Trustee Williams still concerned, but Trustee Geoga reiterated the severity of existing deficits and that it will take a protracted effort to correct. He disagrees that the lead time is irresponsible; this will surely be part of a comprehensive plan. Trustee Schultz said in this case he agrees it is of

the utmost importance that the Board is unanimous. He supports the sales tax referendum, as he has in the past, but urges that the Board pull the plug if citizens are not on board.

collaborative effort between The Hinsdalean staff, Cub Scout Pack 52, Chamber staff and other volunteers. She also invited everyone to read the Village Gingerbread storybook on display in the lobby.

VILLAGE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

President Cauley gave tribute to Mrs. Alice Mansell who passed away this week. She was the consummate volunteer and he recited all the organizations she had been involved with and that she will be missed and long remembered.

He informed the Board that after the last Plan Commission meeting that addressed the generator issue and the proposed hospital helipad, he received a call from Chairman Byrnes. The meeting ended at 1:00 a.m., and as there will be two Plan Commission meetings a month next year, President Cauley is recommending a scheduled ending time for these meetings.

To Eliminate the Public Sidewalk per the Oral Policy of Prior EPS Committees Regarding 704 S. Lincoln With Payment to be made by the Homeowner In Lieu of the Construction of that Sidewalk at the Value of the Construction of that Sidewalk, with a Further Recommendation that the Sidewalk on that Street be Placed on the North Side of the Street with the Village Working in Close Cooperation with the Homeowner on the Least Disruptive Construction of that Sidewalk Possible (Item taken out of order)

President Cauley explained that at the last Board meeting a motion was made to waive the oral policy as described, however, after much discussion a motion was made and seconded under Rule 7 to table the matter to this meeting. Trustee Saigh withdrew his motion to eliminate the Public Sidewalk per the Oral Policy. Trustee Angelo withdrew his second. Trustee LaPlaca stated that in light of the fact that the oral policy was informal and not adopted by the Board and that the oral policy has been applied inconsistently, she moved to send the sidewalk policy back to the EPS Committee for formalization and no sidewalk will be installed on the south or north side of Lincoln Street at this time. Trustee Angelo seconded the motion. President Cauley pointed out that five or six homes have been built where no sidewalk was installed. This will not stop any permitting for the current resident. Trustee LaPlaca added that if these addresses are ever on the sidewalk master plan and the Village has funds, this could be revisited. Trustee Schultz disagreed with the proposed solution. Discussion followed, all other Trustees concur with the idea to develop a policy first and implement the policy. Mr. Ray Burnstein, resident, commented that he agrees it is best to go back to Committee and he will provide input at that time.

The items regarding parking amnesty, suspension of drivers licenses and video gaming were clarified. Trustee Saigh commented on Items L and M and wondered if there was any thought about publishing the names of these people. Chief Bloom said he has no experience as to whether that is an effective tool, but Village Manager Cook commented that the Village used to publish the delinquent water billing accounts, but it had little effect. Although many of the people who don't pay their tickets are non-residents and it wouldn't bother them anyway, Trustee Schultz thinks it might be a good idea to publish names as they could be business owners taking spots from shoppers. Trustee Williams asked that Items M and O be pulled from the consent agenda. Trustee Angelo moved to approve the Consent Agenda, as amended. Trustee Saigh seconded the motion.

Ordinance Amending Chapter 6 (Motor Vehicles and Traffic), Chapter 6 (Stopping, Standing and Parking) of the Village Code of Hinsdale by Adding a New Section 6-6-17 (Suspension of Driver's License)

Trustee Williams doesn't think people should be punished because of over-zealous parking enforcement. Chief Bloom explained that this would only pertain to people with ten or more unpaid

tickets and he explained that these individuals would have received late and final notices on each of the tickets. They have 45 days to contest tickets and/or set up a payment plan. After the 45 days, notice would be sent to the Secretary of State, and another 45 day period in which to challenge begins. There are currently only 35 people who would be affected by this action, one is a limo company and most others are part-time local employees. Chief Bloom said this is the only recourse left to collect on the tickets and noted that these aren't contested tickets; these people are choosing not to pay. Trustee Saigh moved to approve Item M: An Ordinance Amending Chapter 6 (Motor Vehicles and Traffic), Chapter 6 (Stopping, Standing and Parking) of the Village Code of Hinsdale by Adding a New Section 6-6-17 (Suspension of Driver's License). Trustee LaPlaca seconded the motion.

President Cauley stated that he is not inclined to decide these kinds of things when there is no issue present, however, Trustee LaPlaca explained that if a business gets a permit and invests money to create space for this activity, the Village would be in a difficult position to try to remedy the situation after the fact. This is a proactive measure. Trustee Schultz interjected that there are many communities addressing this issue at this time. Trustee Williams pointed out that one third of the capital bill is funded by video gaming, we will get funds from the capital bill and thinks this action is premature. Trustee Geoga mentioned a possible personal conflict; however, President Cauley did not see a problem. Trustee LaPlaca moved to approve Item O: An Ordinance Amending Chapter 5 (Police Regulations) Chapter 3 (Misdemeanor Offenses), Section 5-3-1 (Gambling) of the Village Code of Hinsdale to Prohibit Video Gaming Within the Village Corporate Limits. Trustee Saigh seconded the motion.

This is a small amount, but there is a Village rink available to all. He is reluctant to make this expenditure. Trustee Saigh stated that he was not at the ACA meeting, but would have voted no with Trustee Geoga. This isn't a high priority item and thinks that reimbursement is out of the question. Trustee Schultz commented that the use of the Melin Park rink is not limited to neighbors only. Trustee Schultz moved Approval of a Cost Reimbursement for Melin Park Ice Rink. Trustee Angelo seconded the motion.

Assistant Village Manager/Finance Director Langlois presented a modified program to the ACA Committee that was approved 2-1. Trustee Schultz said he was concerned about people who might be relying on this program going into the winter, and preferred a phasing out of the program. It was noted that previously purchased tickets will be honored. Trustee Geoga moved to eliminate the Senior Citizen Taxi Program. Trustee Angelo seconded the motion.

ENVIRONMENT AND PUBLIC SERVICES

Lincoln With Payment to be made by the Homeowner In Lieu of the Construction of that Sidewalk at the Value of the Construction of that Sidewalk, with a Further Recommendation that the Sidewalk on that Street be Placed on the North Side of the Street with the Village Working in Close Cooperation with the Homeowner on the Least Disruptive Construction of that Sidewalk Possible (Item previously taken.)

FY2010 - 2011 Budget Process

Trustee Geoga provided a presentation and explained that the Finance Commission has made the following recommendations:to reduce general government expenditures by 1.5 million, spend 1.3 million on non-infrastructure capital expenses, provide only a symbolic addition to current reserves and have to allocation from corporate reserves to infrastructure. He recapped and compared the figures that he had calculated with the Finance Commission recommendations. Trustee Geoga believes there are no decisions, only trade-offs. The Board will have to pick one set of priorities with specific consequences. President Cauley confirmed there are difficult decisions ahead and will discussed more thru the spring.

ZONING AND PUBLIC SAFETY

Trustee Williams noted that Walgreens has asked for a wine license which is under consideration and that residents will have an opportunity to comment in the months ahead. Village Manager Cook said there may be a draft ordinance for review at the next meeting.

Trustee LaPlaca provided a status update on the Woodlands stormwater and road improvement proposal that is being worked on. It was suggested to undertake a green initiative that would save money and solve the problems. Clark Dietz, Inc. prepared a cost analysis and a proposal. They have conducted testing of the program over the last couple of months at the Seventh Street basin, an area that is representative of the problems in the Woodlands. The report is on the Village web site and a map of the area is included. They applied three components: permeable pavers, rain gardens and underground storage. It differed from the Earthtech proposal in that there are no large underground tanks. The program replaces off road areas in the public right of way with permeable pavers and small storage tanks that provide for a slow release of water into the ground with no impact on tree line. The findings indicate this method would be generally feasible in the whole area. There is a

\$15,000,000 price tag as compared to the \$28,000,000 cost of the traditional method. Additionally, this approach will maintain the character of the Woodlands. There is a 40% resident contribution in the form of Special Service Areas for the streets; however, because this is a green project, the Village could realize State and Federal funding. No further work will be done at this time, until financing is secured, but a five to seven year time frame is anticipated for implementation. President Cauley confirmed that the Village might not move forward until after a successful referendum. Trustee Geoga commented that he hopes that the sales tax referendum is the last piece of a comprehensive plan that would allow the master infrastructure plan, including the Woodlands, to move forward. Mr. Chuck Johnson, Clark, Dietz, confirmed that Cook County is going to adopt the same 100 year storm standards as DuPage County.

REPORTS FROM ADVISORY BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS

Mr. John Karstrand, Economic Development Commission Chair, addressed the Board. He said there are 45 Gingerbread storybooks around town; ballots can be cast for the favorites. He said the 3/50 promotional campaign will launch soon and run through the spring. He also said the Distinctly Hinsdale holiday programs included holiday cookie decorating, horse drawn carriage rides and visits with Santa Claus.

STAFF REPORTS

Village Manager Cook said that, unless there were any changes, the 2010 Meeting Schedule would be formalized and posted.

Chief Bloom warned about recent residential burglaries. These are daytime burglaries and he urged citizens to be vigilant. He asked that citizens please call the police with anything suspicious.

TRUSTEE COMMENTS

Trustee Schultz urged that the Village Attorney be present at Plan Commission meetings when a development of any magnitude is on the agenda. The petitioner pays our expense and the Village should have legal representation. Mr. Cook said unless the petitioner or the Plan Commission chair requests it, legal representation is normally not required. Trustee Schultz reiterated that anytime an application for a major text amendment or a hot button issue the Village attorney should be present. Trustee LaPlaca and President Cauley agreed.
