VILLAGE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

President Cauley reported that the sales tax referendum passed on November 2nd by a 17% margin of victory. He thanked John Karstrand for heading up the citizen's group. He thanked those residents who gave their time, hosted events and emailed neighbors: Ed Barrow, Neale Byrnes, Tom Massouras, Bruce Melton, Bill Seith, Pat Bruder, Adam Waldo, Greg Spitzer, Andy Blankenburg, Kathy Adelman, Andy Williams, Bill Mucha, Chris Elder and Doug & Chris Sink. He thanked Village staff: Dave Cook, Darrell Langlois, Tim Scott and George Franco. He thanked the Trustees, especially Trustees Geoga and LaPlaca. He also thanked The Hinsdalean and Suburban Life, commenting that their support was instrumental in helping to pass the referendum.

Regarding the Garfield Road construction project, President Cauley stated that it is complete except for the striping and landscaping. The Village will now begin to work on implementing the master infrastructure plan with monies made possible by the sales tax increase. Moving forward, the Village will work closely with contractors to ensure projects are done as quickly as possible to minimize disruption to residents. Additionally, the Village will complete the engineering work well in advance to ensure the best price for the work. On the financial side, the sales tax increase does not go into effect until July 2011, and first receipts will not be realized until October 2011. This year we put aside \$500,000 from the corporate fund, next year we want to set aside one million dollars, but that will require more budget cuts. By 2014-2015, as existing debts retire, we should have \$1.5 million for infrastructure projects. He stated the Village will aggressively pursue grant opportunities. He also noted that the Board will continue to explore other options such as low interest loans and bonds.

ENVIRONMENT AND PUBLIC SERVICES

Presentation - Ordinance Regarding Tree Protection and Preservation

President Cauley introduced the item by referencing a memo from the Village Attorney which raises the question as to whether or not the Village of Hinsdale, as a non-home rule community, has the statutory authority to prohibit so called landmark trees from being removed from private property. He believes this can be referred to EPS, but more research should be done as to the legality. Trustee LaPlaca noted that the EPS Committee has discussed this at a number of meetings without benefit of the attorney's memo. She agreed that this needs to be looked into, but the Ordinance before the Board tonight has been studied by the Beautification Task Force over several months. They have used Glenview's as a model; this is not a prohibition on tree removal, the owner would just need a permit to do so and would be required to replace the tree or pay on a scale. An expert from the Morton Arboretum spoke to the EPS Committee and addressed the legality issue stating that in her experience there has never been a successful challenge to an ordinance of this nature. New regulations

found in the proposed ordinance would tighten and clarify the rules to protect trees on public property, including the protection of trees during construction. The protection of trees on private property is currently unregulated. The Committee felt residents are concerned and interested in this. This specifically addresses landmark trees—those of a certain size, dimension and species. For a resident to remove these trees they would have to apply for a permit, the Village would determine the fee based on a table in the ordinance or provide a recommendation to plant replacement trees. Diseased trees or trees causing danger would not be regulated by this ordinance.

Trustee LaPlaca explained that EPS also discussed funding and enforcement. Staff analyzed options, but a final decision was not reached. Some funding or all funding could come thru assessed penalties; the current budget might prohibit hiring. The conclusion of EPS is that this ordinance would help to provide the community with the mindset that trees are valued and to think before removing a tree. Public input would be invaluable in moving forward, and it would be appropriate to have public meetings at the EPS level. This is a municipal code ordinance, therefore, public hearings not required.

Ms. Candy Cleveland, member of the Beautification Task Force, commented that she would have concerns about legality, however, there are communities going forward with these kinds of regulations. She stated that 63% of the people who responded to the 2020 Survey supported a comprehensive plan. She believes it is an untenable position to not protect these trees.

Dr. Joe Ryne, Chair of the Beautification Task Force, gave a power point presentation wherein he outlined the importance of protecting our assets and preserving the character of Hinsdale. He reported staggering numbers of trees lost to Dutch elm disease and noted that the Emerald ash borer is an impending problem. He talked about inoculation, the 50/50 tree planting program, construction damage, debris and compaction. He believes that at the very least, we need to enact the construction part of this ordinance, because the Village is not currently doing a good job of protecting trees. It is our responsibility to protect the irreplaceable investment that is our tree inventory.

Village Attorney Florey pointed out that most of what is in the ordinance is good and cleans up the public property aspect, but he wants to look into the regulation of tree removal on private property. Discussion followed regarding how best to promote a culture in the Village that values and saves its trees. Trustee Geoga cautioned against an administrative situation that would require discretionary decisions nor would laborious and bureaucratic. He also expressed concern regarding non-home rule jurisdiction, he would like to know what is permitted before more time is spent on the matter. Ms. Cleveland commented that she has observed a lot of destruction in public and private areas. Discussion followed regarding raising awareness and the

education of the public as to tree protection. Trustee Saigh commented that there is a powerful mindset about private property and that historic preservation didn't work and he doesn't think this will either. President Cauley recommended this discussion be continued at the next meeting when more information will be available.

2010 Proposed Tax Levy

At its November 2, 2010 meeting, the Village Board approved the tentative 2010 Village and Library tax levy of \$8,325,963 net of abatements, which represents a 3.76% increase over the 2009 extended tax levy. Under the requirements of the Truth-In-Taxation Act (35 ILCS 200/18) the Village is not required to hold a public hearing as the increase in the levy is less than the 5% increase required to mandate a public hearing on the tax levy.

The Police and Firefighters' Pension Fund contributions included in the Tax Levy Ordinance are based on the actuarial studies performed by the Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation ("State"), which would be the minimum amount required under Illinois law. Using the State's calculations, the 2010 tax levy requirement would be \$777,470 for Police (a decrease of \$40,406 over the 2009 tax levy extension) and \$882,024 for Fire (a decrease of \$41,429).

By law the Pension Funds are required to formally request a contribution amount, which are contained in the attached Tax Levy Reports (these reports were a new statutory requirement in 2009). In formulating their tax levy requests, both funds have based their request on data calculated by an independent actuary, and in both cases the actuarial assumptions used are different than those used by the State and generate significantly higher Village contributions. For the Police Pension Fund, their requested contribution is \$999,446, which is an increase of \$221,976 over the proposed State tax levy amount. For the Firefighters' Pension Fund, their requested contribution is \$1,259,822, an increase of \$377,798 over the proposed tax levy amount. Should the Board consider any increase over the State minimum amounts, an offsetting reduction in another category is required as the total levy is limited by the tax cap.

The tax levy documents are all consistent with documents reviewed by the ACA Committee in early November.

ORDINANCE NO. O2010-____

AN ORDINANCE LEVYING TAXES FOR CORPORATE PURPOSES FOR THE FISCAL YEAR OF THE VILLAGE OF HINSDALE, ILLINOIS, COMMENCING ON MAY 1, 2010 AND ENDING ON APRIL 30, 2011

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Hinsdale, Cook and Du Page Counties and State of Illinois, did on July 13, 2010, adopt and approve Hinsdale Ordinance No.O2010-36, the Annual Appropriation Ordinance for the Village for the fiscal year commencing May 1, 2010 and ending April 30, 2011, the amount of such appropriations being the aggregate sum of \$33,378,049, and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities of the Village of Hinsdale have ascertained that the total amount of appropriations budgeted for in 2010 and amounts deemed necessary to defray additional expenses and liabilities for all corporate purposes to be provided for by the tax levy for the fiscal year commencing May 1, 2010, and ending April 30, 2011, amounts to \$9,495,277 and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Hinsdale, Cook and DuPage Counties and State of Illinois, as follows:

- Section 1. Recitals. The foregoing recitals are hereby incorporated into this Ordinance as findings of the President and Board of Trustees.
- Section 2. Tax Levy. There shall be and is hereby levied on all taxable property within the corporate limits of the Village of Hinsdale for the fiscal year commencing May 1, 2010, and ending April 30, 2011, the sum of \$9,495,277 for General Corporate purposes including Liability Insurance, Police Protection, Fire Protection, Audit, Recreation Programs for Handicapped, Illinois Municipal Retirement Fund, Social Security Fund, Debt Service Fund, Police Pension Fund, Firefighters Pension Fund and Library Funds, making a combined levy of \$9,495,277 as set forth in the attached Exhibit A, which Exhibit A is by this reference hereby fully incorporated into and made a part of this Ordinance.
- Section 3. Unexpended Balance. Any unexpended balance of any item or items levied in and by this Ordinance may be expended in making up any deficiency in any items under the same general budget and levy for the same general purpose.
- Section 4. Filing with County Clerk. The Village Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to file a certified copy of this Ordinance with the County Clerk of Cook County, Illinois, and the County Clerk of DuPage County, Illinois, prior to December 30, 2010, and in accordance with law, so that said tax may be extended and collected according to law.

Severability. Should any clause, sentence, paragraph, or part of Section 5. this Ordinance be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole or of any part of this Ordinance other than the part so declared to be invalid.

Section 6. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately on, and after, its passage by a vote of two-thirds of all Corporate

Authorities now holding office and approval, the Corporate Authorities hereby finding and declaring that the matters contained herein are matters of urgency. The Deputy Village Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to immediately cause this Ordinance to be published in pamphlet form in the manner provided by law.

Attached is the Ordinance authorizing the levy of taxes related to Special Service Area # 9.

On March 20, 2007, the Village Board proposed the establishment of SSA # 9 to provide for drainage improvement. After a public hearing was held on April 17, 2007, and having received a no-majority of registered voters disputing the establishment of the SSA # 9, the Village enacted Ordinance # O2007-46 which officially Established the SSA # 9.

In October 2008, the necessary drainage improvements were completed and the Village submitted its payment to the Vendor, Premier Landscape for \$46,929.00. There are also costs related to the engineering of the project for \$8,032 for a total project cost of \$54,961. The resident's are responsible for 80% of the cost of these drainage improvements, or \$43,969. Staff has computed the annual levy to be \$5,155 over a ten-year period with interest at 3%. The 2010 levy marks the third of these ten annual installments.

Approval of the attached ordinance is requested. Should the Committee concur with the requested levy, the following motion would be appropriate:

- Payroll withholding payments and wire transfers for two payrolls.
