If you are having trouble paying your rent or experiencing a decrease in income, please call and speak to the management office staff or email as soon as possible and request an interim reexamination. The Centers for Disease Control order banning evictions for non-payment of rent runs through June 30, 2021.

- LMHA needs verification of income decrease (letter from employer or other source of income provider)
 - If you cannot get a letter right away, you can complete a Self-Verification form
 - Once there is a third-party verification another interim reexam will be completed
- LMHA needs verification of unemployment benefits.
 - For information on applying for unemployment insurance visit: kcc.ky.gov/Pages/default.aspx
 - Regular unemployment benefits are considered income. Any additional enhancement will not affect the rent calculation

 - If you have returned to work, plan to return soon or would like assistance finding employment, consider enrolling in the Family Self-Sufficiency program.
