SPECTRUM AND LOUISVILLE COMMUNITY LEADERS CELEBRATE AWARDING MORE THAN \$120,000 TO MULTIPLE AREA NONPROFITS

LOUISVILLE, KY - (September 29, 2022) - Over a two-day span, September 28-29, Spectrum recognized and awarded grants to five Louisville-area nonprofit organizations for various initiatives. Over the last year, Spectrum contributed a total of \$121,000 to various organizations in the Louisville area through its Spectrum Digital Education and Spectrum Employee Community Grants programs. These are two signature corporate philanthropic programs at Charter Communications, Inc. — which operates the Spectrum brand.

Spectrum Digital Education (SDE) supports nonprofit organizations that educate community members on the benefits of broadband and how to use it to improve their lives. Since 2017, Charter's \$8 million commitment provided for 215 grants nationally (both cash and in-kind) distributed to nonprofits. This amounted to more than 95,000 beneficiaries and more than 25,000 digital education classes. Additionally, the program grantees have collectively distributed more than 12,000 devices and created 149 technology labs.

"We appreciate the partnership with all of our Spectrum Digital Education grantees, as they are instrumental in helping us provide support for digital literacy in the Louisville community," said Rahman Khan, Vice President, Community Impact, at Charter Communications.

Spectrum Employee Community Grants (SECG) was developed to support communities where Spectrum employees are volunteering their time and talent. To date, 456 donations have been made through SECG, totaling almost \$1.3 million in funding across 31 states.

"Through Spectrum Employee Community Grants, we're proud to provide support to organizations which are nominated by employees and are providing basic needs such as food, clothing and emergency shelter, added Khan. "Together, we're building stronger communities where our customers and employees live and work across America."

At several recent events, the company recognized the following Louisville nonprofits who received funding from Spectrum SDE and SECG.

Spectrum Digital Education Grant (SDE) Recipients:

- **Louisville Urban League** – \$80,000 SDE (\$40,000 for 2021/\$40,000 for 2022) – Louisville Urban League, a five-time recipient of SDE totaling \$180,000 over the past five years, is utilizing the grant for its SeniorTech program, a workforce and life skills training

initiative that gives seniors a fresh start through specialized training, on-the-job experience, a 24-month stipend and success preparation using a tailored keyboard and software orientation. During the event, Spectrum recognized the organization's senior participants who have successfully completed the program.

"We are grateful for Spectrum's continued support of our successful Urban Seniors Jobs Program," said Sadiqa Reynolds, President and CEO of the Louisville Urban League. "With the Spectrum Digital Education Grant, seniors are able to receive the technology skills they need to stay connected."

- **Louisville Metro Housing Authority** – \$20,000 SDE – Louisville Metro Housing Authority is utilizing the grant for its Digital Inclusion program that focuses on connectivity so residents have access to digital training and laptops at satellite labs at five senior/disabled housing sites. During the event, LMHA showcased a future lab at its St. Catherine Court facility.

"Through the generous donation from Spectrum, our residents will have the tools to allow them to gain important technological skills and access resources needed to achieve their social and career goals," said Gena Harris, Chairperson, Louisville Metro Housing Authority. "In order to help bridge the digital divide in our area, we must make sure our seniors receive the critical training necessary to learn how to use new technology."

Spectrum Employee Community Grant (SECG) Recipients:

- **The Hope Buss** – \$7,500 SECG – Through Project Re-Imagine, The Hope Buss is meeting the emergency needs that involve food or housing resources for the homeless and families in Louisville.

"The Hope Buss strives to connect local organizations to the crisis in the community, create sustainable resources, and invigorate hope and strength into the people," said Stachelle Bussey, Executive Director of The Hope Buss. "Spectrum's support will help us better accomplish our mission by bridging the gap between local organizations and the community by attacking hopelessness at its core in a myriad of ways."

- **Wayside Christian Mission** – \$7,500 SECG – Wayside Christian Mission provides food and shelter and clothing the homeless men, women and families of the Louisville community. During the event, Spectrum donated 10 laptops to the organization to assist homeless community members so they can stay connected, apply for job opportunities, etc.

"Our homeless population are less likely to have access to food, shelter, clothing and technology, which is critical to their well-being," said Nina Moseley, Chief Operating Officer, Wayside Christian Mission. "Funding from Spectrum will help these individuals receive the support services and skills needed so they are more self-sufficient."

- **Snacks in Sacks** – \$6,000 SECG – Snacks in Sacks is providing non-perishable food packed inside gallon sized for homeless camps in the Louisville area. During the event, Spectrum presented the organization with 200 snack bags from a recent donation drive organized by the company.

“Spectrum’s support is more important than ever, as more people become impacted by homelessness during these trying times,” said Sarah Lawrence, Executive Director, Snacks in Sacks. “Spectrum’s support will help us better accomplish our mission to collect and provide snack bags and other essentials to people who are experiencing homelessness and food insecurity.”
