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


One request for service since the last report. A passenger vehicle left the roadway and crashed into a creek. Vehicle fluids began leaking into the creek water. Oil absorbent boom and pads were deployed downstream to collect the fluids. A remediation company contacted by the Incident Commander collected the absorbents. No injuries were reported. No equipment was damaged.

LCCC facilitated a technician class in October 2024 using the Phillips 66 training facilities with six students. All six were added to the hazmat team roster. We are still working on getting them onto the MABAS roster.

- The Technical Rescue Team finished out 2024 by partnering with the EMA, IDOT, Madison County Highway Department, Petroff Towing, and Cross Towing to tackle a rope-assisted extrication of a vehicle suspended over a bridge. LEPC Chairperson Report 1/15/2025

As a friendly reminder, Tier II reports and Emergency Response Plans must be signed by applicable authorized personnel. These reports are maintained at the MC EMA office (1) electronically, and/or (2) hard copies. Please continue to use the EMA@madisoncountyil.gov email address for these notifications.

Dave Martin, IEMA Hazardous Materials Section Manager, asked me to convey that the Chemical Safety Act requires chemical facilities to develop a Chemical Contingency Plan. This chemical contingency aspect may be added to their Emergency Response Plan, they submit to me (LEPC).

MC Emergency Operations Plan outlines detailed procedures and strategies for effective response and management of emergencies with the focus of protecting lives, property and minimizing damage. EOP includes pre-planned actions, designated personnel and available resources.

Under LEPC, I am working toward a risk assessment with any findings added to the MC Threat and Hazard Identification and Risk Assessment (THIRA) for preparedness.
