

INTRODUCTION

Madison County Mental Health Board Mission Statement

"To assure the availability of a comprehensive system of community mental health services for residents of Madison County who are affected by mental illness, Intellectual/developmental disabilities or substance use disorder."

In 2022, the Madison County Mental Health Board completed a Community Needs Analysis. Interviews with local key informants revealed that one of the strengths of Madison Counties is that there are a wide array of behavioral health and other community support services. However, the key informants also addressed that the community at large continues to be unaware of the services that exist. It was an added concern that the lack of knowledge of local services impacts every aspect of an individual finding, navigating, accessing, and receiving appropriate behavioral health care.

With the findings of the Needs Analysis, the Mental Health Board established the 2023-2025 3-Year Strategic Plan to include a goal to increase public awareness of the behavioral health treatment and support services available to Madison County residents. Through the dedicated work of multiple Graduate Interns from Southern Illinois University, Edwardsville this Behavioral Health Resource Directory is being presented with the most recent revision having been completed by Emily McAteer. The Resource Directory will be distributed and followed by community presentations to further educate the public and consumers and their families to increase awareness about where they can turn when finding themselves in need of mental health, substance use disorder, or intellectual/developmental disability services and supports.

Apps for Individuals with Disability:

From picture-based communication systems to finding accessible locations, you can make life a little easier with these assistive apps for disabled people.

Voice4u AAC:

This Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC) app provides a picture-based communication system for people with speech challenges. It comes pre-loaded with more than 180 icons; and you can make your own icons to expand the built-in library, record your own voice and even print matching picture cards. Ideal for non-verbal people, people on the autism spectrum, stroke victims and anyone who struggles with communication. With its \$60 price point, Voice4u AAC is much more affordable than expensive standalone units.

Prologuo2Go:

This AAC app was created to be a daily communication tool for people with speech challenges. Users communicate by tapping symbols from the 10,000+-word library. The app features customizable vocabulary levels so it's appropriate for a range of fine motor and visual skills, and even has a progressive language feature that can help people extend their vocabularies.

Be My Eyes:

This app connects blind and low-vision people with sighted volunteers through live video calls. The sighted volunteers assist with guided problem-solving. For example, it can be used to help find lost or dropped items, describe pictures, read labels, shopping at stores, and navigating new places.

Subtitles Viewer:

Powered by the <u>OpenSubtitles</u> database, this app lets you view subtitles on your iOS device while watching TV or at the movies – which makes it one of the most entertaining apps for disabled people. Since most TVs, DVDS, Blu-Rays and streaming services like Netflix and Amazon Prime Video offer built-in subtitle functionality, this app might be best used in the movie theater – provided you can use it without disturbing other moviegoers.

Access Now:

Access Now is a community-driven app that pinpoints accessible locations on an interactive map. You can look up places like restaurants, museums and attractions and view their accessibility ratings: accessible, partially accessible, patio access only and not accessible. You can also rate locations and even add your own to help others in the community.

CoughDrop:

CoughDrop is an AAC app that is available as a monthly subscription or can be bought as a lifetime purchase. There are many conditions—such as Down's syndrome, Angelman syndrome, cerebral palsy, and others—that make an individual's speech difficult to understand. They want to raise the bar for assistive technology without breaking the bank and believe in open standards and open access so communicators are free to build the solution that will work best for them. The company says the app was designed with an "open mindset" to help people with disabilities.

NotNav GPS Accessibility:

NotNav is a free GPS app for the visually impaired. NotNav goes a step beyond traditional GPS systems by announcing your direction, the nearest street address, and nearby cross streets. This GPS app is special in that it is was designed "by the blind, for the blind" and assists users with walking, not driving. And it's free!

Spoken AAC:

Spoken words via tap-to-talk and uses predictive technology to simplify communication for people with aphasia and other speech and language disorders. Instead of limiting users to simple phrases and icons, the app predicts the next words you're likely to use so you can quickly build complete sentences.
