AN ORDINANCE DETERMINING THE AMOUNT OF ALL COUNTY TAXES FOR ALL MADISON COUNTY, ILLINOIS PURPOSES, AND LEVYING SAID TAXES FOR THE FISCAL PERIOD BEGINNING WITH THE FIRST DAY OF DECEMBER, 2015 AND ENDING WITH THE THIRTIETH DAY OF NOVEMBER, 2016

WHEREAS, a County Budget and Appropriation Ordinance for the County of Madison, Illinois, for the fiscal period of twelve months, beginning with the first day of December, 2015 and ending with the thirtieth day of November, 2016 has by this County Board been duly adopted and passed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by said County Board of the County of Madison, Illinois as follows:

Section 1. That Thirty-three Million Four Hundred Six Thousand Nine Hundred Thirty-four dollars and 00/cents (\$33,406,934) be and the same is hereby fixed and determined to be the total amount of all County Taxes to be raised in the County of Madison, Illinois, for all purposes, for said fiscal period of twelve months, beginning on the first day of December, 2015 and ending with the thirtieth day of November, 2016.

Section 2. That Thirty-three Million Four Hundred Six Thousand Nine Hundred Thirty-four dollars and 00/cents (\$33,406,934) being the total amount of all County Taxes to be raised in the County of Madison, Illinois, for all purposes, including (1) General County Revenue (2) Detention Home (3) Health Department (4) Illinois Municipal Retirement Fund (5) Social Security (6) Mental Health (7) Museum (8) Veteran's Assistance (9) Highway (10) Bridge (11) Matching Tax and (12) Tort Judgments and Liability Insurance, be within said County of Madison, Illinois, at a rate per cent on each One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) equalized valuation not in excess of the rate per cent provided by the law on all taxable property in said County subject to taxation.

Section 3. The Specific amounts as levied for all objects and purposes above mentioned for said fiscal period are as follows:

The Finding of Fact of the Board of Appeals: I. The notice of Public Hearing was posted on the property in accordance with the terms of the ordinance; II. The legal notice appeared in the newspaper and meets the requirements of the ordinance for publication; III. The adjoining property owners were notified by mail of the time and date of the public hearing; IV. David Lewis, applicant and property owner, stated that he is seeking a variance in order to construct a metal building in a "R-2" District and a variance in order for the proposed building to be located 7.5 feet from the east property line instead of the required 40 feet. Mr. Lewis stated that there is an existing metal accessory building on the adjoining property and that due to the shape of the right-of-way on Forneris Lane, he is also seeking a reduced setback from the east property line. Mr. Lewis stated that the front of his new structure would be located behind the front of his dwelling, which adheres to the spirit of the setback requirement. Mr. Lewis stated that he spoke with the adjoining property owner to the east, Richard Mark, who did not have opposition to the proposal; V. Michael Fernandez, adjoining property owner to the north and west at 543 Forneris Drive, spoke in favor of the request; VI. A letter of opposition was submitted by Carole Althardt, nearby property owner at 530 Richter Hill, stating that the metal building would be an eye sore and that the applicant's hardships are self-inflicted; VII. A letter of opposition was submitted by Cheryl Watson, property owner of 1240 Grand Avenue, Edwardsville, Illinois, stating that the metal building would be an eye sore and that the applicant's hardships are selfinflicted. Mrs. Watson's letter of opposition was a copy of Carole Althardt's letter but signed by Mrs. Watson; VIII. The Board of Appeals notes for the record that the proposed variance request would be compatible with the surrounding area; IX. The Board of Appeals feels that to allow this request would not cause a detrimental effect on adjoining properties; X. The Board of Appeals notes that the Comprehensive Plan, Madison County Zoning Ordinance, and the zoning file were taken into consideration.

A RESOLUTION RECONSTITUTING THE MADISON COUNTY PLAN COMMISSION

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MADISON COUNTY BOARD that:

1. The Plan Commission shall consist of nine members who shall be appointed by the County Board Chairman with the consent of the County Board. One of the nine members shall be designated by the County Board Chairman as the Plan Commission Chairman.

2. Members shall be appointed for a period of two years.

3. The Plan Commission shall prepare and recommend to the County Board a comprehensive plan.

4. The said commission shall be a fact finding body and shall make such investigations and gather such statistics as it shall deem necessary for the planning and development of Madison County to include all matter which it may deem necessary for the development thereof.

5. A member of the Planning & Development Committee, as designated by the Planning & Development Committee Chairman, the Madison County State's Attorney or his designee, and the Planning & Development Administrator shall be ex-officio members of the Plan Commission.

6. Members of the Plan Commission shall serve without pay, and all plans shall be advisory only.

7. Plan Commission members shall be reimbursed for mileage expenses in accordance with county travel regulations.

8. The plan, when adopted by the County Board, shall be designated as the official plan of the county. Thereafter, from time to time, the Plan Commission may recommend changes in the official plan or any part thereof.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Plan Commission may hold the necessary public hearing, or hearings, of the proposed plan prior to its submittal to the County Board.
