Mr. Babcock: An issue has been brought to my attention by some of our employees recently as to whether or not Madison County will mandate that employees be vaccinated for Covid19. As the Chairman of the Health Committee, I wanted to go on record and say that I would never support such a mandate that would that would impose any state or federal initiatives that attempt to impose such a mandate. In the state of Illinois, the House passed a bill into law called HCRCA in 1998, Health Care Right of Conscience Act. It states, and I'll read a portion of it, it is the public policy of the State of Illinois to respect and protect the right of conscientious of all persons who refuse to obtain, receive, or accept or having engaged in or delivered of arrangement for or payment of health care services and medical care whether acting individually, corporately, or in association with other persons and to prohibit all forms of discrimination, disqualification, or coercion. Of course there is more in this bill that we could talk about. As a public body, I just want our workers here in Madison County Government to know that we support them and respect their conscientious decision to take the covid vaccine or not to take the covid vaccine. If they choose not to take the vaccine, we as a body should be ready to step in and absolutely ensure that nobody in this county loses their job for not taking the vaccine.

Mr. Holliday: There is a mandate from the State that we wear masks indoors. Should we not at least have on the doors when we come in the opportunity for people to see that we have the right to wear or not wear the mask? Should that not be on the doorways when you come in? It just looks like we are in defiance of the total idea of wearing masks.

Mr. Prenzler: We have a number of elected officials here and as far as I can see, no one has a mask on and I think that is what it is, Mr. Holliday. I think it is fine for the people who decide to wear a mask, that is their choice, and you are choosing to do that and I respect that.

Mr. Holliday: We as the County Board of Health should be looking after the health of all citizens of Madison County.

Mr. Prenzler: I believe we are.

Mr. Holliday: Some of those, they need to understand that it is a good opportunity to wear a mask, it can prevent.

Mr. Prenzler: I think, probably, the most important thing we have done, if you've been paying attention to the Board of Health, we have spoken up and publicly announced that a very important treatment is available and that is called the Monoclonal Antibody Infusion Treatment. It has been saving lives and we have been working hard to make that public and to let people know about it. I can tell you from talking to many people from the county that it has been saving lives. I believe that is the most important thing we have been doing.

Mr. Holliday: Over 95% of the people, who have died from Covid, did not wear a mask. It does help prevent people from dying. We have lost some very close friends, some right here in Edwardsville, just this past week. It is just sad that we are losing people, and these masks can save lives.
