### HONORING THE SESQUICENTENNIAL OF AFRICAN-AMERICANS FIRST VOTING IN MADISON COUNTY

**WHEREAS**, the War of the Southern Rebellion (*also known as* the American Civil War) was fought over the issue of race-based chattel-slavery; and

**WHEREAS**, the victory of Union forces over those of the Confederacy made it possible to end the pernicious practice of slavery; and

**WHEREAS**, the said victory allowed for the abolishment of slavery and involuntary servitude (except as punishment for a crime) through the ratification of the Thirteenth Amendment to the United States Constitution, which was proclaimed adopted on 6 December 1865 by Secretary of State William H. Seward; and

**WHEREAS**, a co-author of the Thirteenth Amendment to the United States Constitution was Illinois Senator Lyman Trumbull, of the county of Madison; and]

**WHEREAS**, citizenship rights and equal protection under the law were established through the ratification of the Fourteenth Amendment to the United States Constitution, as adopted on 9 July 1868; and

**WHEREAS**, Illinois was one of three states to share the honor of being third, in ratifying the Fifteenth Amendment to the United States Constitution on the same day, 5 March 1869; and

Mr. Prenzler: Before we go into the appointments, I do have some good news to share with the County Board. We have been working diligently for the past week on increasing the availability of COVID-19 testing here in Madison County. We also want to be able to get testing access to our underserved, low income and minority communities. I had asked Board Member, Ray Wesley, who is sitting next to me and who chairs the Health Department Committee to help with the project and he's been doing some great work on this behind the scenes, cultivating relationships that he has developed over the course of his professional career. Ray has been in contact with both the SIU School of Medicine as well as the Lewis and Clark Community College and has had our Health Department Director, Toni Corona, intimately involved as well. So, this afternoon, we were able to get confirmation that we will be rolling out a mobile COVID-19 testing unit that can travel to underserved areas of the County and do drive-up or walk-up testing. Mr. Wesley and Ms. Corona has spoken with Dr. Kruse, who is the Dean of the SIU School of Medicine and Dr. Kruse has offered to train staff and volunteers of the mobile testing unit. Mr. Wesley has reached out to his contact at Lewis and Clark Community College and they have offered to lend their mobile health unit. We have reached out to include Board Members Doc Holliday, Vic Valentine and Gussie Glasper to assist and secure locations of the minority and underserved communities as well. We think this will truly be a win-win for the county. It looks like we will be able to roll this out by the end of the month, if not sooner. I want to give a big thank you to Ray Wesley and Toni Corona, as well as Dr. Jerry Kruse, Dean of the SIU School of Medicine, Kevin Rust, Trustee for Lewis and Clark Community College and Dr. Lori Artis, Interim President for Lewis and Clark Community College. This has truly been a collaborative effort and I'm excited to see this rolled out because it's the right thing to do for our communities. Later in the meeting, under New Business, I'll have Director Toni Corona give us an update with more information as well as any potential funding requests for this effort. So, if we could move right into the appointments.

**Mr. Holliday:** They are actually going to be starting next week.

Mr. Prenzler: Yes.

**Mr. Wesley:** Yes, the plan is to start early next week.

Mr. Parkinson: Wasn't Dr. Hightower directly involved with getting this off the ground?

Mr. Prenzler: I'll give that question over to Mr. Wesley.

**Ms.** Glasper: On behalf of the residents in the Madison and Venice areas, I am thankful to all of those involved for getting this project on. This is much needed and much appreciated, thank you.

**Mr. Madison:** I have had a lot of people contact me over the last couple of weeks. A lot has transpired this week and in the state. I'm being asked a lot what the Sheriff is planning on doing if someone follows our resolution and opens early. What is the Madison County Sheriff's Department stance on all of this against

someone opening or are they going to leave them alone, whatever the case might be? Also, I'm being asked a lot and I'm concerned as well, what the State's Attorney's stance is on this subject? If anybody from both offices could answer, I would certainly appreciate it.

**Major Connor:** Mr. Madison, we've taken the stand that we are not going to be out looking for any violations of the Executive Order. We would respond to any complaint that may come from a citizen and the first step we would do is educate the business as to what the Order actually is but we aren't out looking for any violations, if that answers your question.

**Mr. Gibbons:** This is Tom Gibbons, I'm happy to answer on behalf of the State's Attorney's Office. I'm sure anyone who's done their research on this knows that the State's Attorney's Office doesn't do enforcement absent request by the local Health Department. So, that would mean that if the Health Department is not referring cases for enforcement, then we would not be taking any action.

**Ms.** Novacich-Koberna: Yes, Mr. Chairman, I have a resolution supporting US House H.R. 6800 HEROES Act that I wanted to bring forth tonight and ask that it be passed onto the Public Safety Committee for review.

**Mr. Walters:** Mr. Chairman, I think it should go to Government Relations. Since this is government, I think that is the proper place to send it.

**Ms. Novacich:** I'm going to read the resolution now so everyone can hear it. You should have received an email with it as well.

### A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING U.S. H.R. 6800 - HEROES ACT

**WHEREAS**, The United States House of Representatives passed H.R. 6800, also known as the HEROES Act, as the fourth relief package amid the coronavirus pandemic; and

**WHEREAS**, The HEROES Act would provide nearly \$1 trillion to state, county, and municipal governments for the purposes of paying and retaining critical workers, including first responders, health workers, and educators and allow local governments to access payroll tax credits to cover the cost of paid leave; and

**WHEREAS**, The HEROES Act would provide \$200 billion for a Heroes' fund, which would ensure essential workers risking their lives during the coronavirus pandemic would receive hazard pay; and

**WHEREAS**, The HEROES Act would provide an additional \$100 billion for the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Health Provider Relief Fund for hospitals, \$7.6 billion for Community Health Centers, and \$75 billion for a new testing and contact tracing initiative; and

**WHEREAS**, The HEROES Act would provide 100 percent federal assistance for individuals' health insurance premiums for employer-based health plans for those who have lost their jobs, extend weekly \$600 federal unemployment payment through January of 2021, and provide a 15 percent increase to the maximum SNAP benefit and additional funding for nutrition programs; and

**WHEREAS**, The HEROES Act would provide funding for a second round of economic impact payments of \$1,200 per family member, up to \$6,000 per household; and

**WHEREAS**, The HEROES Act would require OSHA to issue a strong, CDC-informed standard requiring infection disease exposure control plans and to protect workers in their workplaces and prevent employers from retaliating against workers who report infection control issues; and

**WHEREAS**, The HEROES Act would provide \$10 billion for COVID-19 emergency grants through the Economic Injury Disaster Loan Program and strengthen the Payroll Protection Program by extending the coverage period and expanding eligibility for nonprofits; and

**WHEREAS**, The County Board of the County of Madison, Illinois, remains committed to the personal and economic wellbeing, safety, and livelihoods of all county residents, including essential workers such as first responders and those in the fields of health, transportation, education, child care, grocery, restaurant, food production, and more;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the County Board of the County of Madison, Illinois that it hereby supports the passage of U.S. H.R. 6800, the HEROES Act, into U.S. law; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the County Board hereby urges its United States Senators, Richard Durbin and Tammy Duckworth, to support the passage of HEROES Act in the U.S. Senate and its United States Representatives, Michael Bost, Rodney Davis, and John Shimkus, to support the legislation should it return to the House.

Mr. Chairman, it needs to be submitted to the Government Relations or Public Safety Committees, whatever your pleasure is and whatever the Board's pleasure is.

**Mr. Walters:** I make a motion we put it into the Government Relations Committee.

Mr. Prenzler: Mr. Walters, I can make the decision later, if that's ok with you.

**Mr. Walters:** Oh, sure, sorry, Mr. Chairman, I didn't mean to step on your toes.

**Mr. Hankins:** First I want to thank Ms. Novacich-Koberna for bringing this resolution up tonight. This would be great for Toni Corona and the Madison County Health Department to get those needed funds and for all the nurses, police, and fire, those that are suffering so much. I urge everybody here to support this, call your republican and democratic legislators to support this.

\* \* \* \*

**Mr. Slusser:** You and I had spoken earlier and the Special Meeting on Friday is going to be for the resolution to postpone the delinquency date interest for first installment of the property taxes. It was urgent we got this passed this month because we are going to be sending out tax bills at the end of next week so the first week of June, people will be receiving their bills so there would be a lot of questions and confusion if this wasn't passed ahead of time. We will still have a July 9<sup>th</sup> due date for taxes for the 1<sup>st</sup> installment. We are unique, the only other county that offers 4 installments is Rock Island County so, all the other counties in the State only offer 2 installments that are typically in June and September; ours is July, September, October and December. We are going to allow the 1<sup>st</sup> installment to be delayed as long as it is paid by Sept 9<sup>th</sup>, there won't be any penalties assessed on that, there will be no late fees. The resolution is not extended to escrow payments because the banks have already received that from people who have paid their mortgages and so we will still be requiring that the escrows be received. That will allow us to continue to get some revenue and get revenue out to the schools and that makes up about 1/3 of our payments. When I publically announced this, I encouraged people who are able to pay, who haven't suffered hardships to please pay it on time because the schools still need to function and the taxing districts as well as the

municipalities. We're anticipating that 50-60% of the people will still pay and we'll receive that revenue in July. I brought the school districts in on this as well, Rob Werden sat in a conference call with all the superintendents and they appreciated they got a lot of advanced warning so they can plan but they are in a better place than they were a few years ago. Also, the Mayors that I contacted were ok as well, a few were a little weary. They are basically going to get their money but it will be delayed a couple months, a portion of it will. I just wanted to give everyone a heads up so they kind of knew what was going on in the meeting on Friday.

**Mr. Parkinson:** Chris, I spoke to you earlier about the Park Districts. Could you also touch on your answer to me for the Park Districts as well?

**Mr. Slusser:** Our conversation was a while back but the Park Districts are going to still get their money \*inaudible\* is what they're going to receive. I would assume they are going to get a big chunk of it in July and the rest of it would probably come August or September for that 1<sup>st</sup> installment.

\* \* \* \*

Ms. Corona: I just wanted to take a moment to talk a little bit more about these testing opportunities and just kind of remind everyone we've been in this process pretty much from day 1 we've talked about the importance of testing. It's essential to be able to identify the prevalence of the virus as it circulates in our community now and that's why we need to continue to be so diligent to make sure we have enough testing available. I'm really, really happy and proud of the partnerships that have been formed and the true potential of possibility of the county being able to work closely with not only SIU School of Medicine but another federally qualified health center, Southern Illinois Healthcare Foundation. They have been phenomenal in helping us stand up testing sites throughout the county. We have a lot more work to do but, in a nut shell, working with these agencies, what we've identified is the fact that yeah we've had some standalone sites stood up, you know, Southern Illinois did that in Granite City and there's also a site in Wood River. We still have a problem in some of our communities where frankly, some folks don't necessarily have transportation to those testing sites and for a lot of other reasons, people are just not necessarily able to access them. So, this concept on mobile testing in Madison County is frankly unique and I think it's really going to serve a purpose of getting testing to some very special parts of our populations, special areas within our population to get everyone on the same ground of equal footing as far as testing goes. This is so critical, especially as we start to open up with people moving more in the communities. We're going to need to be able to test and provide testing for some time as it relates to Covid, so this is a great opportunity. We've been able to secure with Southern Illinois Healthcare Foundation, we hope to get started as early as next week. Primarily, we're going to target areas that we really feel that need to have some more testing prevalence in, some medically underserved areas and just other parts of the community. We're going to hopefully start in Alton next week and this has all been unfolding and just kind of falling into place so I don't have complete details but it is our hope that we would begin some sort of mobile testing service with Southern Illinois Healthcare Foundation next week in Alton. The Health Department will be involved primarily to help them work with logistics of developing the strategy for where we'll actually land to drive these mobile testing units to the specific areas and we'll work to get that set up and certainly market it and publicize. Just to give an idea, we can work with communities and potentially set up in multi-housing units and perhaps utilize some of the areas within housing authorities, etc., and other common areas where we could actually potentially access a good number of people to test our population of over 265k people to date. We just started sharing online, I hope you've noticed on the dashboard that we are finally getting a better idea of how many tests are conducted in Madison County on a daily basis. For a population this large, to say we've only had approximately 4,184 tests, here or there, data is provisional so hopefully it's a little bit more in that capacity, that's really not enough tests to give us a good indication within our population so we're very happy about this opportunity. Really happy also, about the opportunity with SIU School of Medicine and Lewis and Clark. As I said, this is all somewhat new and fresh and we are working on details

with that. I suspect that we will need to be able to dive in a little bit more and kind of look at any particular needs that we may have. There certainly is probably going to be an opportunity where maybe we can access some grant dollars but there could also be a need from the Board to help us supplement this endeavor which frankly is a very critical component of our pandemic response.

**Mr. Holliday:** I'd like to add onto that the areas she's talking about is a lot of the black, African American places that are under looked as far as getting testing in Alton, Madison, Venice as well as parts of Collinsville. I'd like to ask Toni if she was able to come up with a budget that she would be looking into getting these testing sites up.

Ms. Corona: Yes, Mr. Holliday, thank you for that question. We are currently evaluating the items and the cost that we'll need. Hopefully, it'll be minimal resources from the Health Departments standpoint but we do need to work with these federally qualified health centers, SIU and Southern Illinois. I suspect we will have some direct cost related potentially in transportation of the samples to the laboratory to get them tested quickly. Because these are what we consider community based testing sites, we would be able to utilize Illinois Department of Public Health's laboratory, that's critical because it opens up the testing parameters meaning we have access to test people that potentially have symptoms or just have risk factors, maybe they have come into contact with somebody with Covid or maybe they have a compromised immune system or perhaps asymptomatic etc. We have that opportunity to test more, we don't necessarily need a doctor's order to do this testing, and that's a real big advantage for us to do that. So, I suspect we will have some associated costs in just making sure we can tie up any loose ends to ensure this happens. I wish I had a good figure for you tonight, I don't, I will tell you we will do our best to be as responsible as we can be and as resourceful as we can be. Both Southern Illinois Healthcare Foundation as well as SIU, I know we all have the same goal in mind. We all believe in the importance of getting this testing out and making this testing available for folks and we're going to do everything in our power to make sure that happens. I think we're in a great situation because we can handle the logistics of this and so many other needs that may surface with it.

**Mr. Holliday:** SIUE will provide some staffing for that and also the 2 appropriations, what is that money for that was presented to the department?

Ms. Corona: Actually, I just need to correct you there, Mr. Holliday. We are actually working with SIU School of Medicine, not directly with SIUE. They'll all be related because there's an opportunity for us to work with the School of Nursing in addition but we're working with SIU School of Medicine and I know that's confusing. The appropriations that you all approved earlier was for \$25k that came from Phillips 66, we're basically a pastor agency, the idea of that money is if we have any first responders like firemen, or paramedics, or police officers potentially that would come exposed to Covid and would need to quarantine, they would be able to stay in a hotel room instead of going back and potentially contaminating or bringing a potential exposure into their families. Phillips 66 set up that pot of money to be able to help those units of local governments, those firefighters, those police departments if they had someone they wanted to put up in a hotel to quarantine, they could then submit the invoice to us and we would pay from that pot of money, we're pass through, that's not our money, that is intended for the first responders for that purpose. The \$139k that came, that was an emergency award that was provided from Illinois Department of Public Health to local Health Departments. We were able to utilize that money to help offset some of our personnel costs so far in this pandemic and frankly, most of that's gone because we are working so long in pandemic response, we're not running programs in our normal grant programs, etc., so fortunately, that money is helping us to offset some of our resources, our staff funding from that regard. I'm hopeful we'll have access to more dollars as it comes but the bottom line is with this mobile testing idea and this thought process, we may need some start up dollars to like I said, shore up any loose ends so we can continue to press on and get this taken care of.

**Ms. Kuhn:** A question that I have is, I understand that the State Department of Health is the one in control of the nursing homes, but that seems to be where the majority, even in Madison County, where the cases seem to be and so we don't end up with a problem like New York had and I believe it was Sweden where they concentrated on the nursing homes and the elderly. What are we doing about that? What about letting the state know that we would like for them to concentrate on the nursing homes because that seemed to be even in Madison County, it was just it shows the majority of the cases are.

**Ms. Corona:** Thank you, Ms. Kuhn for bringing that that observation out. Honestly, while we have been affected, and we're seeing a lot of our deaths, actually are related to long term care facilities. In fact, there's a good number of our cases that are not associated with long term care facilities. It's kind of a twofold approach and I just kind of keep that in our mind.

Ms. Kuhn: But aren't the deaths from there, Toni? Aren't the majority of deaths from the nursing homes?

Ms. Corona: The majority of the deaths are, but the majority of the cases are not. I don't want anyone to think that we don't have Covid spreading within the community and then only long term care facilities or congregate settings, while they are the most vulnerable populations, and we absolutely want to keep Covid out of those areas, because it can become so devastating and so deadly to those vulnerable populations. That's not just where Covid exists in Madison County. Another advantage of this mobile testing that we will have, is the state health department is responding, the local health department were very much involved in these long term care facility outbreaks and infection control practices within these long term care facilities. What I would hope that we'll be able to do is also expand testing within the additional long term care facilities in Madison County and actually do additional testing there with these mobile sites too. There have been a lot of different situations that have come up, the state has tried to put together some teams across the state to go in and do some testing within long term care facilities. The hope is to get across the state in all the systems eventually, but I don't know when that will happen in Madison County, and to have potentially two different sets of mobile testing units that are deployable, not only to get into our vulnerable populations, as Mr. Holliday describes, but to potentially also help some of these congregate living facilities. This again is a really great opportunity for us. It's a unique model, not a lot of counties are doing it and I think we can really make this happen and make it work so that it's advantageous not just to a particular population, or particular setting, but across the board to a lot of people in Madison County that need to pay attention to this.

**Mr. McRae:** I was looking at the numbers today and I would just like, if you will, Toni, we have 505 confirmed cases in Madison County as of today, 268 of those recovered and so we have 237 active cases, is that correct? You would subtract recovered from the number of confirmed cases?

**Ms. Corona:** Yeah, you can look at it that way. Again, I just want to use the word, we've actually changed that wording just because recovered, kind of implies that they're no longer affected with the illness. What we mean by that, as far as being released, is they're no longer in quarantine or isolation. They may still be experiencing symptoms, etc., but they are no longer symptomatic to a point where we're worried about transmission from their particular pace.

**Mr. McRae:** So, then just a couple other things, the numbers are kind of interesting, but, you know, 80% of the people that have Covid experienced no symptoms whatsoever, correct?

**Ms. Corona:** I don't know, I'll tell you just looking at our breakdown, and I do have a little bit of data, there's big gaps, but of the report and patient status of some of the numbers I know, it's actually a much smaller percentage of folks that were asymptomatic who actually became our cases. What we know is that a good number of symptoms are actually not detected and people are tested. They have had no symptoms,

and they are in fact Covid positive. That's what makes this so problematic, because you may not know you're sick and still very much capable of spreading the virus.

**Mr. McRae:** The other thing that I noticed that I believe is April 21st, our cases sort of spiked in Madison County, it was almost a month ago with 28 cases. Then the last couple of days, we've had two and four cases, right, confirmed?

Ms. Corona: Yeah.

Mr. McRae: Even though we're testing more, right, than we were a month ago? I would assume that.

Ms. Corona: If I could just kind of give you some logistics on that end of it. Yes, we are testing more than we were even back towards the end of April. However, we are also, some of our primary laboratories that are doing the reporting have had some problems with their machines. So, the machines have been down in the labs, the test, the swabs have actually had to be sent out to a private laboratory, so we're experiencing a little bit of a lag in actual results over these last couple of days because of that. So, you can't just look at it from that way. Let me give you another example, again, one of our primary labs that does these diagnostics for us, they don't process the swabs, they have to shut down one day, out of the week, to kind of recalibrate the equipment, etc., so Mondays can typically be a slower day of reporting results, just because the diagnostic machinery has not ran on Sunday. So, some of these are just you know, sometimes you see that decline and you wonder, oh, good, we're finally making progress and going down, but some of it is just real life happenstance regarding, you know, the logistics around the actual analysis of the tests themselves. That's why we want to look at it a longer period of time. I can't fully, I'll stop.

**Mr. McRae:** No, no, it's okay. That's what I tried to do, is kind of look at it over time. You know what what we were asked to do is to bend the curve so we didn't overwhelm the healthcare system. You know, and thanks to you and a lot of other people that have, you know, helped to do that and kept us informed. I think that, I guess that's my point is we've done as citizens, we've done our duty, you know, we have bent the curve and if you just look at the trends in Madison County, I realize the data is not perfect, but there is a significant trend downward, and we're testing more, I guess that's my point. As Ms. Kuhn said, unfortunately, most of the deaths, which is what we're most worried about, by my calculations about 73% from what I saw on the state website, or from nursing homes, and so I just thought those were interesting observations and things that I think we've done our duty as citizens in bending the curve, I truly do.

**Mr. Wesley:** First of all, I'd like to say that I'm absolutely ecstatic that a program such as this is being made available to our communities. We need to do all we can so that these underserved communities have all the resources available and get these tests completed. But also, I would like to thank Dr. Hightower, who's the vice chairman of the SIU Board of Trustees for facilitating a meeting between SIU Medical School and Director Toni Corona because he was a contact to get us actually in touch with the right people. So I thank him for that.
