The meeting of the Madison County Health Department Committee of the County Board was held at the Madison County Health Department, Wood River, IL on April 11, 2018.

Members Present: Michael Holliday Sr., Helen Hawkins, Chrissy Dutton, Lisa Ciampoli, and Robert Pollard.

Members Absent: Jim Dodd, and Jack Minner.

Others Present: Toni M. Corona, B.S., L.E.H.P., Public Health Administrator, and Stacey Counton, Administrative Assistant.

The meeting was called to order by Michael Holliday, Chair at 1:00 p.m.

A motion was made by Helen Hawkins seconded by Chrissy to approve the minutes of the April 11, 2018 meeting. Motion approved unanimously.

Public Comment: Lisa passed out information about Hazardous Waste pickups.

Purchase Order Recommendations: A motion was made by Lisa Ciampoli and seconded Helen Hawkins to approve Madison County Health Department Committee Purchase Order Recommendations/Requests: Michael Holliday, Helen Hawkins, Lisa Ciampoli, Chrissy Dutton, and Robert Pollard. NAYS: None.

Expense Reports: A motion was made by Lisa Ciampoli and seconded by Helen Hawkins to approve the April 2018, Madison County Health Department Expense Summary Report. AYES: Michael Holliday, Helen Hawkins, Lisa Ciampoli, Chrissy Dutton, and Robert Pollard. NAYS: None.

Public Health Administrator's Report: Viewed the "Then and Now" DVD video which previews the journey of how the tobacco industry created and used specific marketing strategies to hook users and keep them addicted and how the marijuana industry is utilizing those same strategies. Discussion followed.

Tobacco 21, Support (HB 4297/SB 2332) – Raising the age of sale for tobacco or e-cigarettes to 21 years old in Illinois. Predicts a 25% drop in teen tobacco use. Studies are showing that it will help prevent the next generation of adult smokers, cutting adult smoking rates by 12%.

The Health Advisory Committee approved a motion to advise the Health Department Committee that they collectively support Tobacco 21, HB4297/SB2332.

A Sheriff's Deputy will now be on the premises of Wood River Facility during evening meetings.

Synthetic Cannabinoids, often called Spice, K2, or fake weed are human-made, mind-altering chemicals that are sprayed on to dried plant material. They can be smoked or sold as liquids to be vaporized in e-cigarettes and other devices. As of May 3, 2018, 156 cases in the state of Illinois (one in Madison County), 4 deaths have been linked.

Mosquitos – Vectorborne diseases are anticipated at a higher risk this year. MCHD is hosting a program called I-TICK, Tick-surveillance Program that gathers data to combat tick-borne disease in Illinois, on Tuesday, May 15, 2015, at 11 am in Manley auditorium. The four species that are vectors of diseases are: American Dog Tick, Lone Star Tick, Blacklegged Tick/Deer Tick, and Brown Dog Tick. Discussion.
