The meeting of the Madison County Health Department Committee of the County Board was held via GoToMeeting on April 3, 2020.

The meeting was called to order by Ray Wesley, Chair at 10:00 a.m.

The March 6, 2020 minutes were approved by all Health Department Committee Members present.

Public Health Administrator Report: Gave an overview of the protocol/guidance given to us by the Illinois Department of Public Health on testing and information released. At this point, we do not have enough positive cases to release information by zip code or municipality, therefore, we are only releasing data at county level. We should assume all areas in Madison County have potential spread of COVID-19 and all should be practicing the "Stay At Home" and "Essential Needs only" executive orders currently in effect in the State of Illinois.

Novel Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) Update – The health department has been in full activation since March 4, 2020. The first Madison County Case was announced on March 17, 2020. We suspended all Walk-In Clinics effective March 20, 2020. All health department staff are considered essential and are working on this response in various ways. The Health Department has a phenomenal group of people that have embraced this response and all are doing the best that they can to address all the issues or concerns as they come up. Discussions.

Operations:

- Call Center established
- Investigation of cases and contact tracing
- SNS-RSS (Receiving and Shipping of PPE supplies). Supplies are given to hospitals, Healthcare workers, First Responders (Police, Fire Departments, etc), Long Term Care facilities.
- PIO (Public Information) Getting the Stay-at-home message out on social media and website. Handling all media inquiries.


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Public Comment: Mr. Wesley read into record two emails sent prior to meeting:
