Public Health Administrator's Report: Toni provided an overview of the protocol/guidance given to us by the Illinois Department of Public Health. At this point, we are only releasing data at county level and are not providing zip code or municipality information to protect privacy information and HIPPA.

Novel Coronavirus 2019 Update – The health department has been in full activation since March 4, 2020. The first Madison County Case was announced on March 17, 2020 Walk-In Clinics were suspended on March 20, 2020. All health department staff are considered essential and are working on this response in various ways. The Health Department has a phenomenal group of people that have embraced this response and all are doing the best that they can to address all the issues or concerns as they come up. Discussion.

- Investigation of cases
- SNS-RSS (Receiving and Shipping of PPE supplies). Supplies are given to Hospitals, Healthcare workers, First Responders (Police, Fire Departments, etc.), Long Term Care Facilities.
- PIO (Public Information) Getting the Stay-at-home message out on social media and website.
