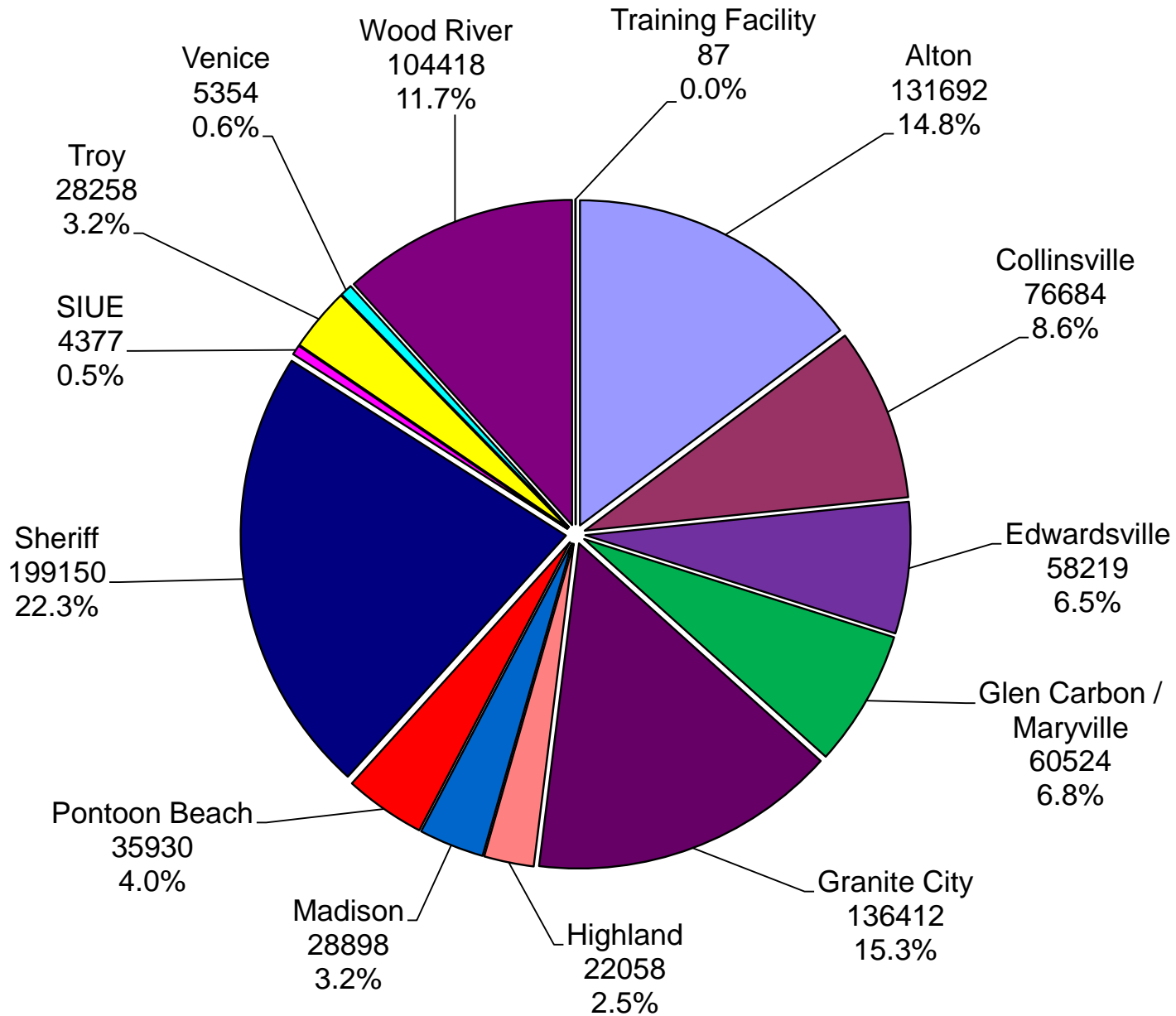

# NOTEWORTHY INVESTIGATIONS

---

*THE PUBLIC IS REMINDED THAT ALL ARRESTED PERSONS ARE ONLY ACCUSED OF THE CHARGES AGAINST THEM AND ARE PRESUMED INNOCENT UNLESS PROVEN GUILTY IN A COURT OF LAW.*

- **1/22/2022 (2022-1455) – Home Invasion and Aggravated Robbery**

On Saturday, January 22, 2022, at approximately 8:40pm, residents from the 5300 block of State Route 162, Glen Carbon, Illinois, contacted the Madison County Sheriff's Office reporting a Home Invasion/Robbery that just occurred. Residents reported that an unknown white male, wearing all black, kicked in the front door to the residence and entered the residence with what appeared to be a firearm concealed inside the suspect's coat pocket. The suspect stole cash, a cellular phone, and a vehicle during the Home Invasion. It was further reported that the suspect grabbed a female resident's arm advising she was coming with him prior to letting her go and leaving the scene, in the victim's vehicle. During the course of the investigation, deputies located the stolen vehicle, resulting in a pursuit and foot chase. Patrol Deputies set up a perimeter and arrested the suspect, Darron L. Stafford II. **Darron L. Stafford II** was formally charged with **Home Invasion, Residential Burglary, Aggravated Robbery, Offenses Relating to Motor Vehicles and Aggravated Fleeing or Attempting to Elude a Police Officer.**

- **1/24/2022 (2022-1527) - Home Invasion**

On Monday, January 24, 2022, the Madison County Sheriff's Office responded to 3<sup>rd</sup> St., Cottage Hills, Illinois, in reference to a report of a Home Invasion. The Caller/Victim reported that an unknown black male and unknown white female had kicked the door in to her trailer and robbed her at gunpoint. During the course of the Home Invasion, and while inside the trailer, the black male fired a single shot. A cellular phone was stolen during the course of the Home Invasion.

Upon review of surveillance video, investigators were able to link a recent Shooting and Attempted Homicide that occurred on the parking lot in the 600 block of Lewis and Clark Blvd., East Alton, Illinois. Through the course of the investigation, the suspects were identified as **Berton Newton** and **Amber Golliday**. Investigators with the Madison County Sheriff's Office, along with Alton Police Department, Wood River Police Department and East Alton Police Department, were able to locate the suspect vehicle in the Alton area, at which time Berton Newton and Amber Golliday were taken into custody. Further investigative efforts were conducted and the firearms were located and seized from a secondary location. Additional investigation also found Berton Newton to be the suspect in Shooting/Attempted Homicide cases in Fresno, California, and Las Vegas, Nevada. As it related to the Home Invasion in Madison County, **Amber Golliday** and **Berton Newton** were formally charged with **Home Invasion, Armed Robbery and Unlawful Possession of Weapons by a Felon**. The investigation also assisted with securing formal charges of Attempted First Degree Murder for the incident in East Alton, Illinois.

- **03/01/2022 (22-4088) – Predatory Criminal Sexual Assault and Child Pornography**

On March 1, 2022, the Madison County Sheriff's Office Digital Forensics Division received a cyber tip from the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC) via the Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) task force. The tip was in reference to the suspect, Ryan Nation, uploading possible child pornography

to a Dropbox account. Upon further investigation, it was determined that Mr. Nation was a registered sex offender. Multiple search warrants were obtained for Nation's accounts, IP records, and eventually his residence, cellular device and laptop computer. After reviewing Dropbox records, several images/videos containing child pornography were located. Ryan Nation was taken into custody and his devices were forensically examined. Upon further investigation, investigators located evidence that Nation was producing Child Pornography with an 18-month old child. A second sex assault victim was also identified and interviewed at a later date. **Ryan Nation** was ultimately charged with **Predatory Criminal Sexual Assault of a Child, Child Pornography** and three counts of **Child Pornography**.

- **04/02/2022 (2022-6478) - Double Homicide**

On Saturday, April, 2, 2022, at approximately 10:26am, the Madison County Sheriff's Office and Collinsville Police Department received a 9-1-1 call from McDonough Lake Rd., Collinsville, Illinois. Upon arrival, Collinsville Police Department and Madison County Sheriff's Office units located two deceased females (Jessica L. Joiner and sister, Jamie L. Joiner). Investigation revealed both died as a result of gunshot wounds and identified **Adam B. Cobb** as the perpetrator in the case. Upon notifying area law enforcement of the situation, Cobb was located and pursued by the Illinois State Police in the area of Pana, Illinois. At the end of the pursuit, Cobb, who was armed, confronted an Illinois State Police Trooper and died as a result of this confrontation. No law enforcement involved were injured.

- **5/11/2022 (2022-9643) – Armed Robbery**

On Wednesday, May 11, 2022, the Madison County Sheriff's Office was notified of an Armed Robbery which occurred on Godfrey Rd., Godfrey. The victim reported they were attempting to purchase an Xbox One gaming console through Facebook Marketplace from an individual where they agreed to meet on the parking lot of a local business. During the transaction of the sale, two of the occupants within the vehicle brandished firearms and robbed the victim of the cash he had to purchase the Xbox. Investigators identified the suspect vehicle, which was out of St. Louis, Missouri, and identified **Tyrese M. Wilson** as the offender in the case. Tyrese Wilson was formally charged with **Armed Robbery**.

- **06/05/2022 (22-11731) - Aggravated Discharge of Firearm**

On June 5, 2022, the Madison County Sheriff's Office responded to a report of a juvenile male that sustained numerous gunshot wounds. It was determined that he had been struck in the face, shoulder, and hip. The victim was transported to Children's Hospital for treatment. After reviewing surveillance video, detectives learned that the suspects, Carmelo Mendoza Jr. and Eric Ramirez observed the victim at the Raceway Gas Station. As the victim was leaving the parking lot, the suspect vehicle drove alongside the passenger's side and fired multiple gunshots into the victim's car. Within a few days, the driver, Eric Ramirez, was taken into custody. The investigation continued which identified the shooter as Carmelo Mendoza. Mendoza was later taken into custody. **Carmelo Mendoza Jr.** was charged with **Aggravated Battery with a Firearm, Aggravated Discharge of a Firearm** and **Aggravated Unlawful Use of Weapons**. **Eric Ramirez** was charged with **Aggravated Discharge of a Firearm, Reckless Discharge of a Firearm** and **Aggravated Unlawful Use of Weapons**.

- **08/07/2022 (22-16475) - Homicide**

On Sunday, August 7, 2022, the Madison County Sheriff's Office received a 9-1-1 call from a residence on Miracle Ave., Granite City, Illinois. The caller indicated he answered the door, and a subject started beating him. Additionally, the subject started beating another person at the residence and was covered in blood. The victim was transported to a St. Louis area hospital where he died as a result of his injuries. Investigators identified the suspect as Blake Streeb. **Blake Streeb** was arrested and charged with **1<sup>st</sup> Degree Murder**.

- **10/24/2022 (22-22806) - Child Pornography**

On October 24, 2022, the Madison County Sheriff's Office, Digital Forensics Division and Special Victims Unit was notified of an incident that occurred in rural St Jacob during a family gathering. After speaking with the juvenile victim, it was determined that she was provided with alcohol by an adult male that was also attending the gathering. After consuming said alcohol, the suspect began sending inappropriate messages to the victim via social media. This information was verified after interviewing several other juveniles and their parents. Upon making contact with the suspect, Douglas Owen, evidence was seized and a search warrant was obtained for purposes of conducting a forensic exam on his cellular device. Upon completing the exam, it was determined that Owen possessed and possibly disseminated child pornography. **Douglas Owen** was ultimately charged with **Child Pornography (5 counts)** and **Contributing to the Delinquency of a Minor**.

*When a serious crime occurs, the Major Case Squad of Greater St. Louis is activated and the investigators are assigned to assist the local jurisdictions with the investigation and prosecution of the suspects involved in the case. The Major Case Squad of Greater St. Louis is recognized as being one of the top investigative squads in the United States and has a clearance rate of over eighty percent (80%) on the cases they are involved in.*

*There were nine (9) Major Case Squad of Greater St. Louis homicide activations in Illinois during 2022. The Madison County Sheriff's Office Investigations Division responded to assist in all of those activations. Madison County Sheriff's Office Command Staff were assigned as Deputy Commanders for two of those activations, which were cleared by the arrests of the suspects involved. The Madison County Sheriff's Office continues to play an integral part of the Major Case Squad of Greater St. Louis and is committed to holding suspects of major incidents accountable for their actions while protecting our community.*

### MADISON COUNTY JAIL 2022 COMPLIANCE MONITORING REPORT

Criminal Justice Specialist Kathy Melvin monitored the Madison County Jail on October 7, 2022. Entrance and exit interviews were conducted with Captain Tharp and Captain Ridings.

#### IMPROVEMENTS SINCE LAST COMPLIANCE MONITORING

1. The facility contracted with IC Solutions for the purchase of tablets. Each detainee will be assigned a tablet which offers improved access to communicate with family/friends, informational materials, and digital communication options for commissary, grievances, and sick call requests.
2. The facility contracted for incoming, non-privileged mail to be sent to a remote site where it will be scanned and made available to detainees via their assigned tablet. The process will offer increased safety to detainees and staff as well as eliminating the introduction of contraband into the facility.
3. The facility received a grant which provides free transportation via the Madison County Transit to indigent detainees upon release.
4. The facility purchased a second Live Scan machine. The previously purchased machine is scheduled for replacement in fiscal year 2022. The addition will allow for a more efficient and timely booking process.
5. The facility purchased twelve cameras to be installed throughout the jail. The addition will provide increased monitoring for the safety and security of detainees and staff.
6. Supplementary training was provided to staff. Supervisors received leadership training provided by the local Mobile Team Unit. Two members of the jail and classification division graduated from the Correctional Intelligence Analyst Academy of the Indiana Department of Corrections. Staff received training which allowed for both a certified field training officer and a certified crisis intervention officer to be assigned to each platoon.
