2017 July Tax Bills

In an effort to keep the summer tax bills organized the Village and Township use different colors on the bills so you are aware of the difference. The bills are mailed in SEPARATE ENVELOPES because there are two different due dates. Both bills are mailed to arrive July 1st, however, VILLAGE TAXES ARE DUE AUGUST 31ST, SCHOOL TAX BILLS ARE **DUE SEPTEMBER 14TH.** If you do not receive your bill by July 15th you should contact the treasurers' office for a duplicate copy to be mailed. If you receive a tax bill that is labeled "Information Copy" this means that a mortgage company will be paying your taxes through your escrow account. If this is not correct contact us to make the appropriate changes. Failure to receive a tax bill does not preclude the responsibility of the homeowner to make sure all required taxes are paid.

If you are a new resident and have recently moved in be sure to file your PRINCIPLE RESIDENCE EXEMPTION and PROPERTY TRANSFER AFFIDAVIT with the Milford Township offices before June 1st, 2017. The "PRE" ensures that you will be placed on the tax roll at the correct millage rates. Failure to do so can result in overpayment of your school taxes.

Poverty exemption forms are available at the Township offices. If you qualify or would like to discuss please call Cynthia Dagenhardt, Treasurer at 248-685-8731 or email at treasurer@milfordtownship.com. All forms must be returned to the office no later than June 30th.

Milford Township & Village Burning Regulations

Spring clean-up time is upon us, especially after our recent visit from Mother Nature! Remember **BURNING IS ONLY PERMITTED IN MILFORD TOWNSHIP** and you must first obtain a burning permit from the Township Offices, 248-685-8731. Once the permit is issued you still need to call the Milford Police Dept. at 248-684-1815 each time you burn. There is no charge for the permit, however, by pulling the permit the municipality, police and fire departments are aware of where fires are located and ensures that there is no burning in unapproved zoning districts.

Only recreational fires such as campfires or outdoor barbecues are allowed in the VILLAGE.

Household Hazardous Waste/Recycling Information

The Village of Milford and Milford Township have joined the Resource Recovery and Recycling Authority of Southwest Oakland County (RRRASOC), which expands the offerings for recycling, household hazardous waste, and electronic waste disposal services to our residents. These enhanced services are available to Milford residents at no additional cost to the services already in place.

Free Weekly Curbside Clothing Recycling

Single family households in the Village of Milford and Milford Township can fill the Simple Recycling green or orange bags with unwanted clothing, textiles and small household items. Set your green or orange bags out for collection on your normal pickup day. Simple Recycling will collect the full bags and leave replacements bags behind. *Have questions or need more bags? What Can You Recycle?

- Paper (cardboard boxes, paper bags, paperboard boxes, paper drink cartons, newspapers, magazines, junk mail, office paper, phonebooks)
- Plastic bottles and containers (#1, #2, #4, #5, #6, #7)
- Glass food and beverage bottles and jars
- Metal cans, small household scrap metal
- PLEASE NO no plastic bags; no recyclables in plastic bags; no electronics; no medical waste, no Styrofoam, no hangers.

Recycling Bins and Carts Information

Recycling bins can be obtained at the Village and Township offices at no charge. Products like these do not break down in the Village sewer system, causing plugs in sewer pipes and pumps, resulting in sewage backups, costly cleanups, and environmental consequences that can result in rate increases.

What Can YOU Do to Help?

- 1. Do not flush objects down the toilet such as: wipes, diapers, feminine hygiene products, or dental floss.
- 2. Dispose of these items in your household or business trash receptacles.
- 3. Inform those who clean your house or business of proper disposal methods for convenience products.
- 4. Select cleaning supplies that can be washed and reused.
- 5. Spread the word! Inform your friends and family of the dangers of flushing wipes down the drain.


Milford Transportation Service

Pet Waste and Clean Water

Animal waste contains harmful bacteria, and when left on the ground, can be carried to our waterways when it rains. Follow these simple steps to protect our lakes, rivers, and beaches:

- **Dispose of it promptly and properly** Whether in your yard or on a walk, promptly dispose of your pet's waste in the trash.
- **Pick up before lawn watering** Pick up after your pets before watering your yard or cleaning patios or driveways. Don't use a hose to clean pet waste off driveways or sidewalks.
- Share the message When at a dog park, community meeting, or talking with friends, spread the word about the positive impact picking up after your pet can have on water quality.
- **Don't treat ducks or geese as pets** Feeding ducks and geese may seem harmless, but, in fact, can be a nuisance to people and harmful to our water. Feeding waterfowl causes them to become dependent to humans. This, in turn, creates unnaturally high populations and problems in parks and lakes. Waterfowl waste can pollute our water with harmful bacteria.

Dog Licenses

Remember dog licenses are available without penalty through June 1st. Failure to renew could result in a much higher cost (\$30 versus \$7.50). Even though rabies shots are good for three years, dog licenses must be renewed yearly unless you purchase a three year tag. A valid rabies certificate is necessary to obtain the new license.

Now that the weather is warming up everyone likes to get outside and start walking, especially with their dogs. Please remember that according to Village

ordinance dogs are required to be confined and under control of their owner when upon the premises and on a leash when not upon the premises.

By adhering to the ordinance everyone can enjoy the outdoors!

Spring & Summer Lawn Care for Cleaner Rivers, Lakes & Beaches

Follow these tips below to grow a green lawn while protecting our rivers, lakes and beaches:

• Select earth-friendly fertilizers

Choose fertilizers with slow-release nitrogen and low phosphorus content to protect water quality and support healthy grass. Avoid weed-and-feed products which can add unnecessary herbicides to your landscape.

• Create fertilizer-free zones

Keep a 15-foot buffer along waterfronts in your yard by not fertilizing or just letting the grass grow. A buffer helps to keep grass clippings and fertilizer from entering the water and causing algae problems. A buffer can also help discourage geese.

• Keep fertilizer and lawn clippings on the lawn

Sweep or blow fertilizer and grass clippings back onto the lawn and not into the street to prevent them from getting into storm drains and ditches, which lead to our rivers, lakes, and beaches. Don't dump lawn clippings into drains or ditches.

• Mow high and leave the clippings

Set your mower deck high (3 inches) to establish strong, healthy roots and shade out weeds. Leave clippings on your lawn to return nutrients to the soil.

• Hire a knowledgeable contractor

Check out <u>Michigan Green Industry Association's</u> endorsed companies for the Healthy Lawn Care Program for Watershed Protection.

• Reduce your lawn area

Making your lawn smaller by creating more planting areas with native plants will help infiltrate more water and reduce the amount getting into storm drains.



Sewer Credits

Applications for the 2017 watering season will be accepted beginning May 1. The credits are available to those who do not have a separate meter for their outside watering. Applications can be found online at www.villageofmilford.org, under Permits and Forms or at the Village office.

Remember, credits are NOT processed until after the bills comes out in September!

Garage Sales & Signs



Just a reminder that before you put your treasures out for sale, be sure to pull a garage sale permit. There is no charge for permits. They are available at the Village and

Township offices and online.

Sales may run three days and you can only have two sales in a calendar year.

Please comply with ordinances. Two signs are permitted and they cannot be placed in the right-of-way (the area between the sidewalk and the street) or they will be removed!

Keep in mind that realtor or other signs for advertisements are not allowed in the Village right-of-way. Signs must be placed, with permission, on private property only.
