Election Day



Election Day is Tuesday, November 8th. The polls are open for voting beginning at 7:00 a.m. and will close promptly at 8:00 p.m. If you are in line at 8:00 p.m. you will be given an application and allowed to vote. If you arrive late, you cannot vote. Voters should expect long wait times throughout the day. Non-peak times are usually 10:00 a.m. to 12 noon, and 2:00 – 5:30 p.m.

The Clerk's office will be open Saturday, November 5th from 8:30 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. to issue absentee ballots and assist voters. Absentee ballots will be mailed to voters up until 2:00 p.m. that Saturday. Absentee ballots will be issued on Monday, November 7th from 8:30 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. These ballots must be voted on-site at the Township Office.

Winter Reminders In The Village

No Parking on Village Streets - To aid in snow removal, parking on Village streets is prohibited from December 1 to March 1 between 3:00 am and 6:00 am. Violators will be ticketed.



Snow Removal - Property owners are responsible for clearing the snow and ice on sidewalks which adjoin their property. Snow must be removed within 48 hours of snowfall. The Village will arrange snow removal if not done within 48 hours and bill the property owner.

To avoid estimated water bills, please keep a path cleared to the remote for the water meter that is on the outside of your home.

Snowbirds! - If you are heading to warmer weather this winter don't forget to call the Water Department to have your water turned off and/or give us your winter address for billing.

Expanded Transportation Services Now Available for Milford Residents

Earlier this year, Milford Township and the Village of Milford launched a new transportation program which is available to all Milford residents. This new program is operated by our partners at **People’s Express** and allows residents to arrange for transportation to and from work, medical appointments, shopping, and more.

Local fares and trips to major medical centers are \$4 each way, and trips outside the normal service area are available at discounted rates, with seniors (age 55+) and adults with disabilities qualifying for half-priced fares. TRASH PICK-UP INFORMATION

Rizzo is closed six days yearly on the following holidays: New Year’s Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day. If your pickup day falls on or after a holiday during the business week, services will be pushed back one day.

Performance Dashboard

Each year Milford Township and the Village of Milford must meet certain requirements in order to qualify for the full CVTRS (City, Village and Township Revenue Sharing) payment from the State of Michigan. One of the requirements is to provide that certain documents be made available to the public for viewing. These documents can be found at www.milfordtownship.com (select Economic Vitality Program) and www.villageofmilford.org (select Government/Departments/Village Treasurer/Budget & Financial Reports).

Dog Licenses



2017 Dog licenses will be available for purchase at the Township offices starting December 1st. Current prices are \$15.00 for an unaltered animal or \$7.50 if the pet has been spayed or neutered. Seniors 65 years of age or older are discounted to \$6.75 for a spayed or neutered pet or \$13.50 for an unaltered pet. These prices are good through June 1st 2017 – after that date all licenses are considered delinquent and the cost is \$30.00. Pets with adoption papers dated past the June 1st deadline or puppies too young to have received a rabies vaccination before June 1st will be licensed using the current prices. Proof of the adoption or change of ownership is required.

Milford Township accepts cash, credit cards or checks for tag purchases and you **MUST** bring in a valid veterinarian rabies certificate. Dogs are welcome to accompany their owners. Milford Township also sells the three (3) year license with proof of a three year rabies certificate. Cost is three times the current rate. If you find a lost dog wearing a license tag, you can call the number on the tag which goes directly to Oakland County Animal Control who can contact the dog’s owners.

Yard Waste Collection



The last day for **VILLAGE** yard waste is Tuesday, November 29, **TOWNSHIP** is Wednesday, November 30.

A reminder, residents are not permitted to rake or blow leaves into Village streets. The Village will be sweeping the streets to keep storm drains cleared so there are no blockages.

BURN PERMITS – New Regulations for TOWNSHIP Residents

In order to open burn in Milford Township a permit must first be obtained from Milford Township Offices (248-685-8731) before burning. A permit number will be issued and either mailed or emailed to you with a copy of the ordinance. The permit is good for six months. Each time you burn you still need to call the Milford Police Department (248-684-1815) with the burn permit number that was assigned by Milford Township. The ordinance is also available on the Milford Township Website (www.milfordtownship.com).

Reminder

Assessment Change notices will be arriving in your mailbox the third week of **FEBRUARY 2017**. It is very important that you review it carefully. If the address on the notice is your **PRIMARY RESIDENCE** please make sure that it is listed as **100% PRE**. These new numbers will affect your 2017 taxes. If you disagree with the new assessment there is information on the notice on how to appeal the assessment.



A Citizen’s Guide to Cold Weather Practices



Winter brings with it lots of fun activities, like sledding, ice skating and skiing. But winter also means mounds of snow to shovel and layers of ice to remove from our sidewalks and driveways. We often make the job easier by applying deicers like salt. Besides sodium chloride, many deicers also contain chemicals like cyanide. When ice melts, the salts and chemicals dissolve and flow into street drains that lead directly to the river, endangering aquatic life.

Here are a few tips to reduce salt use and prevent pollution year-round.

1. Try An Alternative

Calcium magnesium acetate (CMA) was developed as a deicing alternative because it has fewer adverse environmental impacts than salt and doesn’t cause erosion.

2. Reduce Your Salt Use

By limiting the amount of salt we use on sidewalks and driveways, we can reduce the amount of polluted stormwater washing into our waterways.

3. Use De-icing Products Based On Winter Conditions

Before applying a deicer to your sidewalk, think about the air temperature, potential for sun exposure, and how much product you'll need. Remember to follow label directions carefully and use products sparingly. It's easy to over apply deicers, but applying more than you need won't melt your ice any faster.

- For Dry, Powdery Snow: Shovel or sweep snow immediately to avoid using deicer.
- For Wet, Heavy Snow: Apply deicer product as soon as snow begins falling in order to prevent it from bonding.
- For Sleet & Freezing Rain: Apply deicer product early on to prevent ice from building up.
- For Significant Snowfall: When more than 2 inches of snow falls, plow or shovel first and then use a deicing product to melt any underlying layers of ice that have built up due to packed down snow.

FOG Prevention - Protect our environment and keep drains clear of Fats, Oils & Grease

Fats, oils, and grease (FOG) in sewer pipes can create severe pollution problems in our Village. FOG enters sewer pipes through restaurant, residential and commercial sink drains. Once in the sewer, FOG sticks to the pipe and thickens. FOG can build up and eventually block the entire pipe. Blockages in sewer pipes can send sewage backward – out of manholes into streets and rivers, or up floor drains in homes. These sewage overflows pollute the environment.

Impact of FOG

Preventing sewer backups from FOG blockages saves residents money and protects the environment. When sewer pipes on private property back up, the homeowner is responsible for the cleanup. If a resident regularly pours grease down a drain, it eventually forms a blockage in the sewer pipe. If a plumber has to be hired to clean the sewer and or repair plumbing inside the home, the cost can be expensive.

Keep Drains Clear

Follow These Tips:

- Pour or scrape greasy or oily food waste into a container or jar.
- Keep drains clean by pouring 1/2 cup baking soda down the drain followed by 1/2 cup vinegar. Wait 10 to 15 minutes and then rinse with hot water.

2016 Community Project

The Milford Garden Club designed and established a butterfly-friendly landscape at the Milford Senior Center. With the benefit of a civic improvement grant from our parent organization, the Woman's National Farm & Garden Association, and matching funds from Milford Township, a retaining wall and an irrigation system were installed. Volunteer's from the Garden Club, Senior Center and workers from the Village DPS helped make this project possible.
