- Motion to approve bills for May in the amount of \$48,732.24 and \$4,546.91 by Schmude, 2nd Knepfel: Carried 5-0:
- Budget as of May 31st was reviewed. Currently 38.05%
Chief Schlueter reported that the budget looks to be on track for the year. He expects to be about \$2,000 over in the 101.52102.276 uniform account due to the extra bullet proof vests and the hiring of 2 officers. But the PD is reimbursed 50% for the bullet proof vest by the Feds. This money goes into a separate account.
Chief Schlueter also expects to see an increase in the overtime budget for July as the PD is short 1 officer and 2 others are out on FMLA. The PD will be filling 28 shifts in the month of July.

Chief Schlueter will be starting a Sergeant process soon to replace Earl Ruckdashel.

Chief Schlueter received a certificate from CVMIC for the successful review of the NLPD state mandated policies.

Chief Schlueter has started having people with community service clean up the downtown, boat launch and parks.

Steve Elliott is going to help set up a citizen's academy. We are hoping to have it span 5-6 weeks and start this fall.
