



Disallowing marijuana facilities within Saginaw Township will not in any way impact a person's now-legal ability to use such products in the manner allowed by MRTMA, and given that staff anticipates several communities within the region will have opted to allow medical and/or recreational marijuana facilities, reasonable regional access to such products is also afforded to Saginaw Township stakeholders who wish to purchase them.

Staff believes that neither the benefits nor the costs of the marijuana industry in Michigan can be reliably forecasted at this moment. While it may prove the case that such facilities – whether growers, processors, retailers, testers or transporters – provide positive net value to their host local governments, it is impossible to know this with reasonable certainty right now. Likewise, it is difficult to estimate what the negative effects may be of this new industry in our state, including some that are impossible to entirely quantify such as effects on the community's reputation and image. Based upon these aforementioned uncertainties, the Township needs to take action. Opting out will provide the Township with certainty so that we are not idle participants waiting for MRTMA to make its impact.

The main risk facing Saginaw Township is the potential for vested property rights claims. By opting out at this time and aligning our recreational marijuana policy with our medical marijuana policy, we can prevent such claims. Many residents voice concerns of the Township attempting to quell the voice of the people by prohibiting recreational sales facilities within our Township. However, MRTMA specifically allows local governmental units to disallow recreational marijuana facilities from opening in their municipality. Not only does opting out align with our own past policies, but will also align with a majority of neighboring communities.

Whereas the proposed zoning ordinance text amendment is consistent with recently-established policy affecting similar marijuana facilities within Saginaw Charter Township, staff recommends adoption of Z-18-03, prohibition of commercial marijuana facilities.

Mr. Gombar asked if the Planning Commission had any questions for staff. Having no questions at this time, Mr. Gombar then asked for public comments in favor or in opposition of allowing commercial marijuana facilities to operate in Saginaw Charter Township.

1. Tammy Sawyer, 3581 Desert, thanked the Township for providing this forum and then stated she is for having marijuana facilities in the Township. She felt it was the "will of the people" to have these facilities, the Township would benefit financially, and that the Township was making a moral decision instead of an economical decision.
2. Jimmie Green of 4591 Spurwood stated he supports the Township's decision to disallow marijuana facilities within Saginaw Township. Mr. Greene feels it's a question of community and "what kind of community do you want it to be".
3. Rol Jersevic of 3737 Mannion is concerned with the younger generation with drugs and alcohol and supports the Township's decision.
4. Tammy Sawyer stated she understands and shares the concerns regarding younger children. She feels allowing the marijuana facilities will get rid of the black market for marijuana sales.
