As an adjoining property owner, Mr. Wayne Spell of 5565 North Salemburg Highway expressed his concerns related to the increase in traffic. Mr. Spell informed the board there had been numerous accidents at this intersection in the past, he was concerned with the small turn radius for transfer trucks, and was concerned over the lack of turn lanes for both directions of traffic along North Salemburg Highway. Ann Naylor informed Mr. Spell the board appreciated his information and participation and prior to any permits being issued for the development, the applicant would have to meet all NCDOT requirements and obtain applicable driveway permits from NCDOT.

Mr. Jackson asked the applicant what his plans were in addressing protection of the scenic quality of North Salemburg Highway (Hwy 242) as described in the Sampson County Land Use Plan as being designated as a scenic route in North Carolina? Mr. Derwood Spell informed the board he intends for this convenience store to be a cornerstone for the community and his grandparents had operated a store at this location in the past.

<u>DECISION</u>. Andrew Jackson moved to recommend approval of this request as presented with the recommended findings of fact, proposed hours of operation, installation of driveways meeting NCDOT requirements, and zoning consistency statement, the motion was seconded by Clayton Hollingsworth and unanimously approved by the Board.



One hundred percent of the grant funds have been expended for contracts with Caldwell Tanks (500,000-gallon tank) and

Herring-Rivenbark (water mains), and Enviva has met their hiring

commitments.

THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF SAMPSON COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND A PRIOR ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE SAMPSON COUNTY PLANNING BOARD

WHEREAS, the Sampson County of Board of Commissioners ("Board"), being the duly-constituted governing body of Sampson County ("County"), a body politic and corporate and political subdivision of the State of North Carolina ("State") created by act of the North Carolina General Assembly ("General Assembly"), finds that a Planning Board is essential for the proper exercise of the planning and development regulation powers granted to the counties by the State in Chapter 153A, Article 18 of the North Carolina General Statutes ("General Statutes") or ("G.S.") and necessary for the promotion of the public health, safety, morals, and general welfare of the citizens of the County; and

WHEREAS, the Board is authorized under G.S. 153A-321 to establish a Planning Board by local ordinance for the purposes set forth in Chapter 153A, Article, and on July 2, 2007, the Board adopted such an Ordinance, entitled <u>An Ordinance Establishing the Sampson County Planning Board</u> (the "Ordinance"); and

WHEREAS, the Board may pursuant to G.S. 153A-323 amend the Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds that in order to best promote the public health, safety, morals, and general welfare of the citizens of the County and the planning and regulation development objectives set forth in Chapter 153A, Article 18 of the General Statutes, it is necessary to amend the Ordinance as more particularly set forth below;

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED that Ordinance is hereby amended as follows:

Section 100. MEMBERSHIP. The Planning Board shall consist of seven members appointed by the Board of Commissioners. Each member shall be a resident of Sampson County residing in an area subject to the jurisdiction of any of the County's planning, zoning, subdivision or development ordinances. In addition to the appointed members, the Zoning Administrator or designated assistant shall be an ex-officio, non-voting member of the Planning Board and shall attend all meetings for the purpose of providing technical assistance when requested by the Planning Board. The County manager shall also be an ex-officio, non-voting member of the Board.

Section 200. TERMS OF OFFICE. Two of the initial members shall be appointed for a term expiring December 31, 2007. Two of the initial members shall be appointed for a term expiring December 31, 2008. Three of the initial members shall be appointed for a term expiring December 31, 2009. Upon the expiration of these initial terms, all terms shall be for three years. A member may only be appointed for two consecutive terms, after which he or she shall be ineligible for reappointment for one year. For purposes of reappointment, a partial term of more than eighteen months shall be regarded the same as a full term, whereas a partial term of less than eighteen months shall not be considered a term for purposes of the two consecutive term limit set forth

above. Any member's term of office shall continue until such time as his or her successor is appointed and takes the oath of office.

Section 300. REMOVAL FROM OFFICE. An appointed member shall may be removed from office upon a majority vote of the Board of Commissioners for any of the following causes:

- (1) Absence from any four meetings during a calendar year unless such absence has been excused by the Chairman of the Planning Board or the remaining members of the Planning Board a majority of the members of the Planning Board only upon a showing of good cause with the reason therefore constituting good cause being entered in the minutes of the proceeding Planning Board for each of the meetings from which such member was absent.
- (2) Knowing participation in the consideration of any matter brought before the Planning Board under circumstances that would violate the constitutional rights of any person to an impartial decision maker.
- (3) Violation of any statute, regulation, ordinance, policy or other provision of law governing the conduct of members of local planning boards.
- (4) Conviction of any crime that is classified as a Class 1 or Class 2 misdemeanor, with the exception of violations of offenses codified in Chapter 20 of the General Statutes which do not constitute crimes of moral turpitude, or a felony under the laws of North Carolina or the equivalent thereof if such conviction is under the laws of another state or the federal government of the United States.
- (5) Engaging in personal conduct that is detrimental to the reputation or integrity of the Planning Board.
- (6) Any other cause for which there is a legal basis for removal from office under the statutory or common law of North Carolina *or the United States*.

Section 400. OFFICERS. Officers for the Planning Board shall be selected as follows:

Subsection 401. CHAIRMAN AND VICE-CHAIRMAN. The Planning Board shall elect a Chairman and Vice-Chairman from its appointed membership by majority vote of the members of the Board. The Chairman shall preside at all meetings of the Board, appoint members to committees, decide all points of procedure unless otherwise directed by a majority vote of the Board members present, and perform such other duties as may be ordered by a majority vote of the Planning Board. The Vice-Chairman shall preside as Chairman at all meetings where the Chairman is not present. In the event that the Office of the Chairman becomes vacant, the Vice-Chairman shall succeed to that office for the remainder of the unexpired two-year term set forth below. In the event that the Vice-Chairman is required to fill such a vacancy in the Office of the Chairman, the members of the Board shall appoint a successor Vice-Chairman by majority vote, and said successor Vice-Chairman shall succeed to that office for the remainder of the unexpired two-year term set forth below. These The Offices of the Chairman and the Vice-Chairman to be held

at the first meeting of the Planning Board in each even numbered year. The Chairman and Vice-Chairman shall be eligible to serve successive terms without limitation, *other than those more general term limitations set forth in Section 200 above*.

Subsection 402. SECRETARY. A Secretary shall be appointed by the County Manager, either from within or outside the Planning Board's membership, to hold office during the term of the Chairman and/or until a successor Secretary shall have been appointed. The Secretary shall be eligible for reappointment for successive terms without limitation, other than those more general term limitations set forth in Section 200 above in the event that the Secretary is from within the Planning Board's membership. The Secretary, subject to the direction of the Chairman and the Board, shall keep all records, shall conduct all correspondence of the Board, and shall generally supervise the clerical work of the Board. If the Secretary is chosen from outside the membership of the Board, he or she shall not be eligible to vote upon any matter.

Section 500. COMPENSATION. Appointed members of the Planning Board shall be compensated for each meeting attended in an amount established by the Sampson County Board of Commissioners in the County's annual budget each year. This compensation is to be paid in one lump sum amount at the end of the County's fiscal year.

Section 600. POWERS AND DUTIES. The powers and duties of the Planning Board shall be as follows:

Subsection 601. DUTIES AUTHORIZED BY G.S. 153A-321. The Planning Board shall perform the following duties:

- (1) Make studies of the county and surrounding areas;
- (2) Determine objectives to be sought in the development of the study area;
- (3) Prepare and adopt plans for achieving these objectives;
- (4) Develop and recommend policies, ordinances, administrative procedures, and other means for carrying out plans in a coordinated and efficient manner;
- (5) Advise the Board of Commissioners concerning the use and amendment of means for carrying out plans;
- (6) Exercise any functions in the administration and enforcement of various means for carrying out plans that the Board of Commissioners may direct;
 - (7) Perform any other related duties that the board of commissioners may direct.

Subsection 602. SUPPLEMENTAL POWERS AUTHORIZED BY G.S. 153A-322. The Planning Board, with the concurrence of the Board of Commissioners, shall have those supplemental powers authorized by G.S. 153A-322, at such times and in such circumstances as the Board of Commissioners may direct.

Subsection 603. DUTIES RELATED TO ZONING MATTERS. The Planning Board shall initiate proposals for amendment of the Sampson County zoning ordinance based on its studies and the comprehensive plan, as that term is defined in the county's zoning ordinance, and shall recommend such proposed amendments to the Board of Commissioners.

Subsection 603. DUTIES RELATED TO SUBDIVISION REGULATION. The Planning Board shall initiate proposals for amendment of the Sampson County subdivision regulations based on its studies and the needs of the County, and shall recommend such proposed amendments to the Board of Commissioners. The Planning Board shall review and make recommendations to the Board of Commissioners concerning all proposed major subdivisions and any other matters as set forth in the subdivision regulations.

Subsection 605. BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT. The Planning Board is hereby designated as the Sampson County Board of Adjustment and is vested with all the powers and authority of and shall perform the duties of the Board of Adjustment pursuant to and in accordance with G.S. 153A-345.

Subsection **606. FURTHER POWERS AND DUTIES.** The Planning Board shall have such further powers incidental and necessary to perform any duties which it may perform pursuant to Article 18 of Chapter 153A of the General Statutes.

Subsection 607. BYLAWS AND PROCEDURES. The Planning Board shall have the authority to adopt bylaws and procedures consistent with this ordinance and applicable law, provided that said bylaws and procedures must be approved by the Board of Commissioners.

Subsection 608. COMMITTEES. The Planning Board shall have authority to establish any committees under such terms and conditions as it deems necessary or prudent to assist the Board in conducting any of its duties.

Section 700. MEETINGS. All meetings of and hearings conducted by the Planning Board shall be held in Sampson County at such time and place as established by the Planning Board and in accordance with the Open Meeting laws of North Carolina.

Section 800. MINUTES. Minutes, records, or accounts of all meetings of the Planning Board shall be prepared and maintained permanently. All minutes, records, and accounts of such meetings shall be open for public inspection.

Section 900. CONFLICT WITH LAWS AND ZONING ORDINANCE. To the extent that any provision of this Ordinance conflicts with any state or federal statute or regulation or the County's zoning ordinance, the statute or zoning ordinance shall control.

Section 900-1000. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its adoption.

AMENDMENT TO ANIMAL CONTROL ORDINANCE OF SAMPSON COUNTY

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners (the "Board") of Sampson County (the "County") adopted an Animal Control Ordinance (the "Ordinance") on or about April ___, 2008, and unanimously voted to amend in certain respects on two prior occasions, at its April 7, 2014 regular meeting and its May 5, 2014 regular meeting, after duly advertising and conducting public hearings prior to each such regular meeting; and

WHEREAS, the National Association of Public Health Veterinarians ("NASPHV") has recently developed new national guidelines for rabies postexposure management of dogs and cats which it has published in the Compendium of Animal Rabies Prevention and Control, 2016 (the "Compendium"); and

WHEREAS, the North Carolina Division of Public Health ("DPH") has promulgated a Model Rule for Postexposure Management of Dogs and Cats (the "Model Rule") based upon the recommendations contained in the NASPHV Compendium and has recommended that the State's local boards of health adopt the Model Rule pursuant to their rulemaking authority to adopt by reference any code, standard, rule or regulation which has been adopted by any agency of the State, another state, any agency of the United States, or by a generally recognized association pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 130A-39; and

WHEREAS, the County's Board of Health has adopted the Model Rule on October 17th, 2016 pursuant to its rule-making authority under N.C. Gen. Stat. § 130A-39; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds that in order to best promote the public health, safety, and general welfare of the citizens of the County and to ensure uniformity among the rules promulgated by the County Board of Health and the Ordinance, it is necessary to amend the Ordinance in part;

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED that Subsection (k) of Article IV, Section 1-40 of the Ordinance is hereby amended as follows:

Article IV Rabies Control and Bite:

Section 1-40 Rabies Control:

- k. Animals exposed to Rabies.
 - 1. If the County Health Director determines that an animal has not been vaccinated against Rabies at least twenty eight (28) days prior to being exposed to Rabies from a suspected rabid animal, the animal shall be immediately euthanized unless the owner or keeper agrees to strict isolation of the animal at a veterinary hospital for a period of six (6) months at the owner's or keeper's expense.

- 2. If the County Health Director determines that an animal with a current Rabies vaccination has been exposed to Rabies from a suspected rabid animal, it shall be revaccinated and returned to the owner or keeper who shall be responsible for the cost of the Rabies vaccination.
- 1. If the County Health Director determines that an animal with a current Rabies vaccination has been exposed to Rabies from a suspected rabid animal, the animal shall receive immediate veterinary care with a rabies booster dose within ninety-six (96) hours of exposure at the owner or keeper's expense, and its owner or keeper shall be required to keep the animal under a forty-five (45) day observation period.
- 2. If the County Health Director determines that an animal that has never been vaccinated against Rabies has been exposed to Rabies from a suspected rabid animal, the animal shall be euthanized unless the owner or keeper of the animal agrees to provide the animal with immediate veterinary care with a rabies booster dose within ninety-six (96) hours of exposure at the owner or keeper's expense and quarantine the animal for a period of four (4) months.
- 3. If the County Health Director determines that an animal that has at least one prior valid Rabies vaccination certificate but is overdue with appropriate Rabies documentation has been exposed to Rabies from a suspected rabid animal, the animal shall receive immediate veterinary care with a rabies booster dose within ninety-six (96) hours of exposure at the owner or keeper's expense, and its owner or keeper shall be required to keep the animal under a forty-five (45) day observation period.
- 4. If the County Health Director determines that an animal that is overdue with appropriate Rabies documentation and has no documentation of prior rabies vaccination has been exposed to Rabies from a suspected rabid animal, the animal shall be euthanized unless the owner or keeper of the animal agrees to provide the animal with immediate veterinary care with a rabies booster dose within ninety-six (96) hours of exposure at the owner or keeper's expense and quarantine the animal for a period of four (4) months or the owner or keeper of the animal agrees to provide the animal with immediate veterinary care and prospective serologic monitoring; if the serologic monitoring yields evidence of prior vaccination, the owner or keeper of the animal shall be required to keep the animal under a forty-five (45) day observation period; if the serologic monitoring yields no evidence of prior

vaccination, the owner of keeper of the animal must quarantine the animal for a period of four (4) months in lieu of euthanasia.

SAMPSON COUNTY ORDINANCE REGULATING EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICE AND GRANTING OF FRANCHISES FOR CONVALESCENT TRANSPORT SERVICE

Sampson County does hereby adopt the following ordinance pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 153A of the North Carolina General Statutes. That this ordinance shall govern the granting of franchises for ambulance service and other pre-hospital emergency medical services within the geographical bounds of Sampson County.

That upon adoption of this ordinance the previous ordinance heretofore adopted in 1968 [after a public hearing held on February 5, 1968] is rescinded in its entirety.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of Sampson County, in regular meeting assembled and following a duly advertised public hearing held on the 18th day of August, 1997, that:

- I. <u>DEFINITIONS</u>. As used in this ordinance, unless the context clearly indicates another or different meaning or intent, the following definitions shall be applicable.
 - [a] The term "ambulance" means any privately or publicly owned motor vehicle, aircraft, or vessel that is specially designed, constructed, or modified and equipped and is intended to be used for and is maintained or operated for the transportation of persons who are sick, injured, wounded, or otherwise incapacitated or helpless over or upon the streets or highways, waterways or airways of this State.
 - [b] The term "ambulance attendant" means an individual who has completed a training
 program in emergency medical care and first aid approved by the North Carolina
 Department of Human Resources and who has been certified as an ambulance attendant by
 the Department of Human Resources, Office of Emergency Medical Services.
 - [c] The term "emergency medical technician" means an individual who has completed a training program in emergency medical care at least equal to the National Standard Training Program For Emergency Medical Technicians as defined by the United States Department of Transportation and has been certified as an emergency medical technician by

- the State of North Carolina Office of Emergency Medical Service.
- [d] The term "ambulance provider" means an individual, firm, corporation or association who engage in the business or service of transporting patients in an ambulance.
- [e] The term "approved" shall mean approved by the North Carolina Medical Care Commission pursuant to the latter's rules and regulations promulgated under N.C. General Statutes 143B-165.
- [f] The term "secondary ambulance provider" shall mean the system of personnel and equipment meeting the same criteria as a primary ambulance provider, but not normally dispatched on first call response.
- [g] The term "committee" shall mean the Sampson County Emergency Medical Services Committee.
- [h] The term "county" shall mean the County of Sampson Board of Commissioners or its designated representative.
- [i] The term "telecommunicator" shall mean a person who is available at all times to receive requests for emergency services, to dispatch emergency services, and to advise local law enforcement agencies, and fire departments and emergency medical facilities of any existing or threatened emergency.
- [j] The terms "emergency" and "emergency transportation service" shall mean the use of an ambulance, its equipment and personnel to provide medical care and transportation of a patient who is in need of immediate medical treatment in order to prevent loss of life or further aggravation of physiological damages or physiological illness or injury.
- [k] The term "first responder" shall mean an organization with personnel trained in emergency medical care that is dispatched to the scene of a medical emergency for the primary purpose of providing emergency medical assistance to a patient until the ambulance and additional medical aid arrives.
- [1] The term "franchise" shall mean a permit issued by the County to a person for the operation

- of an ambulance service, rescue squad or first responder unit.
- [m] The term "franchisee" shall mean any person having been issued a franchise by the County for the operation of an ambulance service, rescue squad or first responder unit.
- [n] The term "license" shall mean any driver's license or permit to operate a motor vehicle issued under or granted pursuant to the laws of the State of North Carolina.
- [o] The term "non-emergency transportation service" shall mean the operation of an ambulance for any purpose other than transporting emergency patients.
- [p] The term "operator" shall mean a person in actual physical control of an ambulance which is in motion or which has the engine running.
- [q] The term "owner" shall mean any person or entity who owns an ambulance.
- [r] The term "patient" shall mean an individual who is sick, injured, wounded, or otherwise incapacitated or helpless to the end that the need for some medical assistance might be anticipated while being transported to or from a medical facility.
- [s] The term "person" shall mean any individual, firm, partnership, association, corporation, company, group of individuals, or other like legal entity, acting together for a common purpose, or an organization of any kind, including any governmental agency other than the United States.
 - [t] The term "rescue" shall mean situations where the victim cannot escape an area through the normal exit or under his/her own power.

II. FRANCHISE REQUIRED.

[a] No person either as owner, agent or otherwise, shall furnish, operate, conduct, maintain, advertise or otherwise be engaged in or profess to be engaged in the business or service of emergency and/or non-emergency transportation of patients within the County of Sampson unless the person holds a valid permit for each ambulance used in such business or service issued by the North Carolina Department of Human Resources, Office of Emergency Medical Services, and has been granted a franchise for the operation of such business or

- service by the County pursuant to this Ordinance.
- [b] No person shall drive an ambulance, attend a patient in an ambulance, or permit an ambulance to be operated when transporting a patient within the County of Sampson unless that person holds a currently valid certificate as an ambulance attendant, emergency medical technician, EMT-D, EMT-Intermediate, EMT-Advance Intermediate or EMT-Paramedic issued by the North Carolina Department of Human Resources, Office of Emergency Medical services.
- [c] No person, either as owner, agent or otherwise, shall furnish, operate, conduct, maintain, or otherwise be engaged in or profess to be engaged in the business or service of providing rescue services or first responder services unless they have been granted a franchise for the operation of such business or service by Sampson County, all pursuant to this Ordinance.
- [d] No franchise shall be required for:
 - [1] Any entity operated from a location or headquarters outside of the County in order to transport patients who are picked up beyond the limits of the County when that transport is to any facility which is located within the geographical boundaries of the County, or to pick up patients within the County for transporting to locations outside the County; but no such entity shall be used to pick up patients within the County for transporting to locations within the County or other locations unless that entity is rendering assistance to a franchised ambulance service in the case of a major catastrophe, mutual aid situation or emergency in which the services franchised by the County are insufficient or unable to cope; or,
 - [2] Ambulances owned and operated by an agency of the United States government.
- III. <u>APPLICATION FOR AMBULANCE FRANCHISE</u>. Application for a franchise to operate ambulances in the County shall be made by the ambulance provider upon such forms as may be prepared or prescribed by the County and shall contain, in the minimum, the following:

- [1] The name and address of the ambulance provider and the owner of the ambulance[s].
- [2] The trade or other fictitious name[s], if any, under which the applicant does business, together with a certified copy of an assumed name certificate duly filed as required by law, or articles of incorporation establishing such name in corporate form.
- [3] A resume of the training and experience of the applicant in the transportation and care of patients.
- [4] A full description of the type and level of service to be provided, including the location of the place or places from which that service is intended to operate, the manner in which the public will be able to obtain assistance and how the vehicles will be dispatched through that service.
 - [5] An compiled financial statement of the applicant as the same pertains to its operation, in such form and such detail as may be required by the County. These statements should show a comparison of the last two fiscal years of operations. At a minimum, the following statements should be included: Balance Sheet, Profit and Loss Statement and Statement of Cash Flow.
 - [6] A list of radio frequencies the applicant is authorized to operate on, along with a copy of the FCC license[s] in the name of the person providing the service.
- [7] A description of the applicant's capability to provide twenty-four hour coverage, seven days per week, for the district covered by the franchise applied for, and an accurate estimate of the minimum and maximum times for a response to emergency calls within that district.
- [8] Any additional information that the County shall deem reasonably necessary for a fair determination of the capability of the applicant to provide services in the County in accordance with the requirements of law and the provisions of this Ordinance.
 - [9] The Franchisee shall provide Franchisor a background check for all employees performing services in the County of Sampson reasonably required by Franchisor and permitted by law.

IV. GRANTING OF FRANCHISES.

- [1] Prior to accepting applications for the operation of an ambulance service, the County may designate specific service areas as franchise districts. Such districts will be established using criteria that include, but are not necessarily limited to, geography size, road access, the location of existing medical transportation service, population density, and response time. The County shall further have the authority to redistrict or rearrange existing districts at any time at its discretion.
- [2] An applicant may apply for a franchise to operate either emergency transportation service or non-emergency transportation service, or both. If both types of services are to be provided, separate applications must be filed for each type.
- [3] Upon receipt of an application for a franchise, the County shall schedule a time and place for hearing the applicant. Within thirty [30] days next following that hearing, the County shall cause such investigation as it may deem necessary to be made relative to the applicant and his/her proposed operations. A reasonable extension of time to complete such investigation shall be granted should the County deem an extension necessary.
- [4] A franchise may be granted if the County finds that:
 - [a] The applicant shows a reasonable effort to meet state standards and such other standards as may be outlined in this franchise ordinance.
 - [b] The proposed service will fit within the existing service so as not to adversely affect the level of service or operations of other franchisees to render service.
 - [c] A need exists for the proposed service in order to improve the level of ambulance services available to residents of the County and that this is a reasonable and cost effective manner of meeting that need.

V. TERM OF FRANCHISE.

[1] The County may issue a franchise hereunder to an ambulance provider which shall be valid for such term as may be determined by the County, provided always that either party, at its option,

- may terminate that franchise upon sixty [60] days prior written notice to the other party. After a notice of service termination is given, the ambulance provider may reapply for a franchise if continued service is desired.
- [2] Upon suspension, revocation, or termination of a franchise granted hereunder, such franchised ambulance service, rescue squad or first responder unit shall immediately cease operations. Upon suspension, revocation, or termination of an attendant's certification or emergency medical technician certification, such person[s] shall cease to provide medical care, directly or indirectly, with an ambulance service. Upon the suspension, revocation, or termination of a driver's license, such person[s] shall cease to drive an ambulance. The franchisees shall not permit any such individual to drive an ambulance without a valid driver license. The franchisees shall not permit any such individual to provide medical care without a valid certification.
- [3] Each franchised ambulance service shall, at all times, comply with the requirements of this Ordinance and such other requirements as may be set out in the franchise granted hereunder. Full compliance shall always be had with any applicable state and/or local laws relating to health, sanitation, safety, equipment, ambulance design and all other laws and ordinances that might be applicable to the service presented pursuant to the franchise.
- [4] Prior approval by the County shall be required where ownership or control of more than ten percent [10%] of the right of control of a franchisee is acquired by a person or group of persons acting in concert, none of whom own or control ten percent [10%] or more of such right of control, singularly or collectively, at the date of the franchise application or issuance. By its acceptance of the franchise, the franchisee specifically agrees that any such acquisition occurring without prior approval of the County shall constitute a material and substantial violation of the franchise and shall be cause for termination of that franchise, at the option of the County.
- [5] Any change of ownership of a franchised ambulance service without the approval of the County

shall result in immediate termination of the franchise and shall, in and of itself, require the filing of a new application for the issuance of a new franchise. The term "change of ownership" as contemplated by this section, shall mean any change of ownership, however small the percentage of change may be.

- [6] Any change in the level of service offered by a franchisee without the prior approval of the County shall, in and of itself, terminate that franchise and shall require a new application and new franchise, all pursuant to the terms of this ordinance.
- [7] No franchise may be sold, assigned, mortgaged, pledged or otherwise transferred without the prior written approval of the County and a finding of conformance with all requirements of this Ordinance as upon original franchise approval.
- [8] Each franchised service, its equipment and the premises designated for its use in the application, together with all records relating to its maintenance and operation, shall be open to inspection by the State, the County, or any of their designated representatives, at all times.
- [9] The franchise certificate shall be posted in a readily visible public location at the base of operations for the franchised service. No such franchise certificate may be defaced, removed or obliterated.

VI. STANDARDS FOR DRIVERS AND ATTENDANTS.

Standards for drivers and attendants as developed by the North Carolina Medical Care Commission as requirements for certification of ambulance attendants and emergency medical technicians pursuant to Article 7, Chapter 131E-158, and Article 56, Chapter 143 of the General Statutes of North Carolina, and rules and regulations promulgated by the Board of Medical Examiners For Advance Life Support Technicians shall be applied and the same are incorporated herein by reference thereto.

VII. STANDARDS FOR VEHICLES AND EQUIPMENT. Vehicle and equipment standards which are or may be developed by the North Carolina Medical Care Commission pursuant to applicable law shall be applied and the provisions of Article 7, Chapter 131E-157 and Article 56, Chapter 143, of the North

Carolina General Statutes are incorporated herein by reference thereto.

VIII. STANDARDS FOR COMMUNICATIONS.

- [1] Each ambulance vehicle shall be equipped with an operational two-way radio capable of establishing good quality voice communications from within the geographic confines of the County to each hospital emergency department in the County in which that ambulance is based. Each ambulance vehicle shall be equipped with a two-way radio communications capability for communications with all hospital emergency departments to which transportation of patients is made on a regular or routine basis anywhere within the State of North Carolina. Each ambulance vehicle shall be equipped with a operational two-way radio capable of establishing good quality voice communications from within the geographic confines of any county in which the ambulance's dispatching agency shall have directed that ambulance to transport patients.
- [2] Each ambulance provider shall maintain current authorizations or Federal Communication commission licenses for all frequencies and radio transmitters operated by that provider. Copies of all authorizations and licenses shall be on display and available for inspection as required by Federal Communications Commission Rules and Regulations.
- [3] Each base of operations must have at least one [1] open telephone line. All telephone numbers used by that base must be registered with each law enforcement agency and communications center operated or maintained by the County.
- [4] Each ambulance shall be dispatched from the County dispatch center or an acceptable and approved alternative.
- INSURANCE. No ambulance franchise shall be issued under this Ordinance, nor shall such franchise be valid after issuance, nor shall any ambulance be operated in the County unless the franchisee has at all times in force and effect either insurance coverage issued by an insurance company licensed to do business within the State of North Carolina, or a bond with personal and/or corporate surety for each and every ambulance owned and/or operated by or for that ambulance service which shall provide, at the minimum, liability for payment of damages in the following amounts:

- [a] In the minimum sum of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars [\$500,000.00] for injury to or death of individuals in any incident or accident resulting from a cause for which the owner or operator of said vehicle may be held liable as the result of liability imposed by law, regardless of whether the ambulance was being driven by the owner or the owner's agent; and
- [b] In the minimum sum of One Hundred Thousand Dollars [\$100,000.00] for loss of or damage to the property of another, including but not limited to personal property, in any accident or incident for which the vehicle owner or agent may be liable, as by law provided.
- [c] Written evidence of the insurance required by [a] and [b] above shall be provided to the County at all times during any franchise term, together with a letter from any carrier agreeing to provide a least thirty [30] days prior written notification before cancellation or amendment of any such liability insurance coverages.

X. RECORDS.

- [1] Record of dispatch which shall show the time that a call was received, the time the ambulance was dispatched, the time the ambulance arrived on the scene, the time that the ambulance arrived at its destination, the time that the ambulance was in service, and the time that the ambulance returned to its base.
 - [2] Trip records which shall state all information required in Section [a] above in addition to information on a form approved by the County. The trip record shall be so designed as to provide the patient with a copy thereof containing all required information. A copy of the trip record may serve as a receipt for any charges paid.
 - [3] Daily report logs which shall be maintained for the purpose of identifying more than one person transported in any one day.
 - [4] Driver and attendant check lists and inspection reports which shall list contents and descriptions of operations for each vehicle, which shall be signed by the individual verifying vehicle operations and equipment.

XI. RATES AND CHARGES.

- [1] Each franchise shall submit a schedule of rates to the County for approval and shall not charge more nor less than the approved rates without specific written approval of the County.
- [2] No franchisee shall attempt to collect rates on emergency calls until the patient [singular or plural] has reached the point of destination, has received medical attention and is in a condition to consult with the ambulance service as determined by any attending or consulting physician; but such franchisee may attempt to collect rates with a family or guardian of a patient once that patient is in the process of receiving medical attention following delivery of the patient to his/her point of destination.
- [3] On non-emergency calls, or calls where a person requires transportation to a non-emergency facility, attempts to collect payment may be made before the ambulance actually begins its trip.
- **XII.** ENFORCEMENT. The Sampson County Office of Emergency Services shall be the enforcing agency for the regulations contained within this Ordinance. That Office shall perform the following acts or provide the following services:
 - [a] Receive all franchise proposals from potential providers.
 - [b] Study each franchise proposal to determine if it conforms to this Ordinance.
 - [c] With the approval or disapproval, as the case may be, of the Committee, recommend to the franchise[s] following evaluation of each proposal.
 - [d] Inspect the premises, vehicles, equipment and personnel of franchisees to assure compliance with this Ordinance and to perform any other inspections that may be required by the County.
 - [e] With the approval of the Committee, recommend to the County the temporary or permanent suspension of a franchise in the event of noncompliance with the terms of this Ordinance and to further recommend the imposition, if justified, of misdemeanor or civil penalties as provided by this Ordinance.

- [f] Create cooperative agreements with other ambulance services so as to insure the continuation of service in a district where an ambulance service franchise might have been suspended under this Ordinance.
- [g] Prepare and deliver such data sheets as may be requested by the Committee or the Sampson County Director of Emergency Management. Services.
- [h] Receive complaints, public or otherwise, relative to alleged franchise infractions, review all such complaints with the Committee and obtain any corrective action required after receiving approval of the Committee for such corrective action.
- [i] With the approval of the Committee, recommend improvements to the County the purpose of which is to insure better or enhanced medical care and transportation by franchisees.
- [j] Maintain all records required by this Ordinance and any other applicable County, State, or Federal regulation.
- [k] Perform such of the above functions [a through j] as may be requested by any municipality within the County of Sampson.
- [1] Serve as staff to the Sampson County Emergency Medical Services Committee on all matters pertaining to that Committee.
- **XIII. MISCELLANEOUS.** The County may inspect a franchisee's records, premises and equipment at anytime in order to insure compliance with this ordinance and the terms of any franchise granted hereunder.

XIV. COUNTY EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES ADVISORY COMMITTEE.

[1] There is hereby created the Sampson County Emergency Medical Services Advisory Committee whose membership shall be appointed by the Board.

The Committee shall have the responsibility and duty of advising the Emergency Management Director on matters relating to the enforcement of this Ordinance as specified in Section XIII, infra, and shall develop and recommend for approval to the Board standards of care, policies,

procedures and actions which will maintain and improve the quality of emergency medical services for residents of Sampson County. Providers approved to operate at a level of prehospital care requiring Hospital sponsorship and direction from the ALS Medical Director will also be govern by all applicable rules required by OEMS and the local Audit and Review Quality Management Committee.

- [2] Membership on the Committee shall consist of the following:
 - [a] The Administrator of Sampson Regional Medical Center or his/her designee.
 - [b] A physician selected by the Sampson County Medical Society.
 - [c] The ALS medical director from Sampson Regional Medical Center.
 - [d] The Sampson County Communications Center Supervisor.
 - [e] One representative from County Government [county commissioner, county manager, or their designee].

Add Sampson County Finance Officer

- [f] One representative from each franchise provider of ambulance services within the County.
- [g] One emergency room nurse selected by the administration of the Sampson Regional Medical Center.
- [h] One citizen-at-large from Sampson County.
- [i] One educator residing in Sampson County. Add EMS Operations Chief.
- [j] The Sampson County Emergency Medical Services Director or the Director of Emergency Services Management of Sampson County.

Add EMS Training Officer.

All members of the Committee shall have full and equal voting rights on matters to be considered by the Committee with the exception of the following:

[1] Representatives from the franchised providers shall have no voting privileges when the Committee considers matters relating to the granting of franchises and/or reviewing complaints and investigate reports regarding franchised services. Representatives from franchised services shall have full and equal voting rights on all other matters not expressly excluded in this paragraph.

- **XV.** <u>ADDENDUMS TO ORDINANCE.</u> The Board may, through appropriate actions, amend or expand this ordinance to include other emergency departments or agencies, as it may deem necessary.
- XVI. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall take effect on the 5th day of June, 2000.

I.A.1. Description of applicant and co-applicants

Sampson Community College (SCC), a member of the North Carolina Community College System, is a two-year public comprehensive community college serving Sampson County. The College offers educational programs including college transfer, a number of occupational programs leading to the Associate of Applied Science degree (including nursing and allied health), and a range of focused job and basic employment skills training through the Division of Workforce Development and Continuing Education. Under partnership with the Sampson County and Clinton City Schools, the campus also hosts an early college high school.

The College's main campus is located in Clinton along Hwy 24, a major state highway connecting Fayetteville and Fort Bragg with Jacksonville and Cherry Point Marine Base with the state port of Morehead. The College's 56-acre campus includes over 200,000 sf of instructional and support space. The proposed construction project would be located adjacent to existing buildings designed for occupational training and have access to municipal water and sewer. Consistent with the requirements of the North Carolina General Statute, all ongoing operational and maintenance costs of the building will be provided by the Sampson County Board of Commissioners.

I.A.2. Description of the region

Sampson and Duplin Counties are located in the coastal plain of

southeastern North Carolina. Historically, the region was a principal producer of flu cured tobacco and home to a number of large textile and furniture manufacturing facilities. During the 1990s, with the closure of the remaining manufacturing facilities and the federal tobacco buy out, the county and region underwent dramatic changes in employment and agriculture. Sampson and neighboring Duplin counties are now only second to Iowa in swine production. Though smaller in size and employment than the lost larger textile and furniture manufacturers, the county now includes a growing number of metal fabrication industries including Schindler Elevator, Dubose Nuclear Steel, Dubose Steel, Atlantic Coil, and Hog Slat, a major manufacturer of production equipment for swine producers. (Three of the top four employers in the county are animal production integrators.)

I.A.3. Description of complete EDA project

The project scope of work leverages EDA funds and North Carolina Connect Bond funds to construct a 10,000 sf occupational training facility to support College credit and non-credit training in welding and metal fabrication. (The facility will replace a smaller shop area housed in a 25year old metal building currently used for welding construction. facility lacks proper ventilation, adequate instructional space, and cannot be renovated or expanded to adequately support the use of automated and robotic devices.) The facility will be built on the main campus located adjacent to the College's Occupational Building which provides classroom and shop space for instruction in industrial skills and access to a stateof-the-art machine shop and industrial trainers. Industry leaders from Dubose National Energy will help write the curriculum to train workers for the advanced manufacturing jobs for which out-of-state recruitment is currently filling. Industry leaders see a need in training the highly skilled welders to earn certifications to conduct inspections. Adding the certification opportunities will improve earning potential for the local workforce. Expansion of the program to include robotic welding will prepare students to compete in a workforce of highly skilled laborers. Experience with robotic welding will train students to work in other robotic applications in the agribusiness industry. These highly skilled workers will be able to use advance technology to support currently developing needs as well as future needs of industry. They will be part of the shift toward "knowledge jobs" that will pay higher wages.

I.A.4. Need for the project

Regional industries now include a growing number of advanced manufacturing facilities requiring welders and workers skilled in fabricating metal. In addition, production workers in agribusiness need welding skills to maintain equipment and production facilities. This project is a strategic investment in workforce training. One of the threats identified in the regionals CEDS is the aging of the existing metal workers and fear of losing the knowledge, and this project will address that need for two of the key economic clusters in the region: advanced manufacturing and agribusiness. Hog Slat, Dubose National Energy Systems, Smithfield Foods Hog Productions Division, Prestage Farms, Lafayette Farms, F. L. Turlington Lumber Company, Nash Johnson Farms, Robinson and Sons Machines, Inc., and Schindler Elevators have all responded positively to the project and have agreed to sign commitment letters of support. As the college is expanding opportunities to area high school students through career and college

promise, high school students also can pursue occupational training options. Metal working will give students an alternative path to a 2 or 4 year college degree in which they can train for highly skilled and well paid jobs. As the region continues to recover from the effects of Hurricane Matthew, this project will help strengthen the regional economy by contributing to a more diversified and skilled workforce.

I.A.5. Basis of economic distress cited for eligibility

While the project site is Sampson County, Duplin County will be included in the affected region where the 5-year combined per capita money income is 63.44%. The average unemployment rate for the two counties in 2016 was 5.65% with surrounding counties ranging from 5.4-6.5%. The Sampson County labor force of 29,760 and unemployed number of 1,606, Sampson County ranks 62nd in the state. The county's unemployment rates reflected the disruption of the Recession but now mirrors that of North Carolina. The unemployment rate masks underemployment evident in the economic index of families. one in five families are identified as living in poverty with surrounding counties exceeding 25%. The history of the coastal plain of North Carolina includes nationally recognized damage from tropical storms and hurricanes (Hazel, Fran, Floyd, and recently, Matthew.) These systems destroyed agricultural crops and animal production facilities which take a number of years to rebuild. Metal working is critical to the reconstruction of lost and damaged buildings and roads. The higher level of training would prepare students to fill jobs supporting repair to the damage to local businesses, farms, and roads that continue to impede commerce in Sampson County. Since the local agribusinesses are especially vulnerable to natural disaster, the training of a highly skilled and diversified workforce will mitigate future impact to local economy qualifying the project for special needs consideration.

I.A.6. Description of documentable impact

The local shortage of skilled welding workers forces Dubose National Energy Systems to hire out of state travel welders at significant expense and inconvenience. Their needs have grown from 8-10 employees 3-4 years ago to 40 people welding every day. Dubose, a local champion, leadership will help plan the program to train for industry needs. Hog Slat hires 8-10 welders a year and has need for the proposed robotic training. Leadership from Prestage Farms, Lafayette Farms, Hog Slat, Smithfield Foods, F.L. Turlington Lumber Company, Robinson and Son Machine Inc., Ezzell Trucking, Schindler Elevator, and Nash Johnson Farms has expressed the need to maintain and train current welding employees of 4-27 people. Turlington Lumber needs about 10% of its workforce to be able to weld and anticipates greater need of welding and metal fabrication workers as we plan to expand and upgrade our facilities. There is a wide range of skill sets and levels needed among our local industries. While Hog Slat might value speed and efficiency, Dubose Energy needs highly skilled precision workers. All have agreed to sign commitment letters. The project will provide an asset that will make the region more resilient and more economically competitive by training a highly skilled workforce.

I.A.7. Funding and cost share matrix

The College requests EDA funding to be used in conjunction with funds provided to SCC from the North Carolina Connect Bond funds. Funds have been allocated to the College by the North Carolina General Assembly under

a formula allocation developed and approved by the North Carolina State Board of Community Colleges. Total Project Cost(estimate)\$ 2,188,579.00 with a request of 80% EDA grant of\$1,750,863.20. NC Connect Bond funds of \$437,715.80 will fund the balance.

SUBJECT: Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP)

On October 8, 2017 Hurricane Matthew caused widespread damage to Sampson County. There was severe flooding in the county, thus numerous homes were destroyed. The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and North Carolina Emergency Management are currently accepting applications for citizens to participate in the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP).

The grant priorities are:

• <u>Acquisition</u> (Buyout): This program requires structures to be removed from acquired property.

The property must be maintained forever as open space.

This is the most permanent type of mitigation.

• <u>Elevation</u>: This program requires raising a structure above base flood elevation plus one foot freeboard.

This is one of the most common mitigation techniques used for retrofitting flood prone properties.

• Reconstruction: This program requires the rebuilding of the structure.

As of March 14, 2017, the Sampson County Emergency Services Office has received ten applications from citizens who wish to participate in the grant program in all three categories.

For the individuals to participate, the County must submit a Letter of Interest (LOI) to NC Emergency Management. If you concur with participation in this project, I would like to ask that it be placed on the agenda for consideration during the Board of Commissioners meeting in April.

Request for Proposals (RFP) were sent out to the fourteen (14) Debris Removal Contractors and the RFP was posted on North Carolina's Historically Underutilized Businesses (HUB) website on February 14, 2017.

This RFP was for Disaster Debris Removal at seven (7) right of way (ROW) scattered sites within the County and for the dump site that was started on property owned by the County on Black River Lane. The RFP requested an estimate on the tonnage and per ton cost for removal for both the ROW scattered sites and the site on Black River Lane.

At the bid opening on March 3, 2017, we received a total of three bids. The bids received were from Action Backhoe & Construction, Russell Enterprises and Step Construction.

In evaluating the bids received and consulting with the North Carolina Department of Public Safety, Pubic Assistance Supervisor, we determined that the bid from Action Backhoe & Construction was the lowest bid since this contract will be paid according to the actual number of tons dumped at the County Landfill. The Landfill will provide the Contractor with load tickets showing the tonnage which will be provided to the County for payment.

Because of the extreme difference in the estimated number of tons, we have contacted Action Backhoe & Construction and confirmed that it was understood that the Debris Removal would be paid according to the number of actual tons.

We respectfully recommend that the Board award the bid to the vendor with the lowest per ton price (Action Backhoe and Construction). The Sampson County Board of Commissioners convened for their regular meeting at 6:00 p.m. on Monday, March 6, 2017 in the County Auditorium, 435 Rowan Road in Clinton, North Carolina. Item 1: Reports and Presentations

<u>Introduction of New 4-H Agent</u> Genny Thompson was introduced as the new 4-H Extension Agent and welcomed by the Board.

Item 2: Planning and Zoning

<u>RZ-2-17-1</u> Chairman Wooten called the hearing to order and recognized Planning Director Mary Rose who reviewed a request to rezone approximately 22.3 acres located along Roseboro Highway from RA-Residential Agriculture to C-Commercial.

The Chairman opened the floor for comments and the following were received:

Aubrey Crumpler: My name is Aubrey Crumpler and I live on 1389 Underwood Road. I am the only land owner that actually connects to the land in question here. I got out of the Air Force in December of 1994. Discovered this land for sale from Mr. Williams in early 1995. I bought 24.8 acres adjacent to it. My only intentions for that land were to just have a place to go hunt and fish the river. The land lies in between two farmers. I grew up around here in Roseboro. First little change in my lifetime. I mean, not a whole lot is happening there which is kind of how most of us like it. I guess my biggest problem is just the unknown of having commercial land next to me, not knowing what could possibly come, whether its next year or 10 or 20 years from now. I mean you just

don't know. Like I said I have been there for 21 years. I have been verbally told what possibly the intentions are. The intentions that I was told, I honestly don't see why it would even need to be other than the DOT requiring it, but if that is what it's going to be used, I really wouldn't have an issue with that. I don't even know if I am able to say what it is, so I'm not going to. But I still want to know if that land is sold or handed down or whatever might happen in the future. So, it's a little unnerving to think that, you know, for me. I'm settled down. I'm not planning on going anywhere and I just don't want to take the chance of having somebody come in next to me and a lot of traffic in and out. I know that at first there was somebody that was rezoning for solar panels and stuff like that. I mean, stuff like that wouldn't really bother me, you know. I mean, it would affect the aesthetics of me driving home and looking across the fields at the deer and turkeys and stuff like that but still. At the present time, and have been for years, I'm a night worker so I try to sleep during the day. So I don't know what might come in next to me that might hinder that. Like I said, not a whole lot other than just the unknown. I mean if I had a clear cut plan in writing and knew what was going to happen to the land I might not be as oppose to it, but as it stands, I am opposed to it. That's it, I bought the land with no vision or expectation of it ever changing just because of where it's located; its rural Sampson County. That's basically all I have to say. The fact that it would be commercial. I mean a half mile up the road is already an area designated for industrial park, so I wouldn't see the need for that to become commercial to allow industry to come in when there is already an area assigned for that.

Planning Director Mary Rose provided more insight and noted that similar rezoning requests had recently been submitted for the purpose of billboard development and anticipated that more requests would be submitted as the Highway 24 project continues.

Aubrey Crumpler: Just understanding the lay of the land, Hurricane Matthew exposed; I mean I've seen water on that land before but two thirds of the land in question was under 4 to 5 feet of water. So it is a flood zone in the lower part. I don't know how his land is designated, but part of mine is considered wetlands and can't be developed. I just wanted to put that in there. There is a lot of low-lying land. There's probably about 2 to 3 acres that are up high enough, like at the level of where my house is, that it wouldn't flood. But two-thirds of it is flood zone. I don't know if it's designated flood zone, but it definitely does flood.

Vice Chairperson Lee asked for clarification on which property floods.

Aubrey Crumpler: His. Well, actually both of us. I mean the land runs together and drops off at the river. The fence post that the DOT has put along the land while they are doing the road. It flooded on Friday and Saturday. I was out of town and when I came home Sunday afternoon the water was a couple inches from the top of the post on that fence, two-thirds of the way up from the river to Underwood Road.

In response, the Chairman cautioned the Board to be careful with allowing others to speak on the property of another.

The Chairman closed the hearing. Upon a motion made by Chairman Wooten and seconded by Vice Chairperson Lee, the Board voted unanimously to approve conditional rezoning request RZ-2-17-1, accepting the presented findings of fact and making the following zoning consistency statement: Whereas, in accordance with the provisions of North Carolina General Statute 153A-341, the Sampson County Planning Board does hereby find and determine that the recommendation of the ordinance amendment RZ-2-17-1 is consistent with the goals and objectives of the Sampson County Land Use Plan and other long range planning documents due to the fact this property is located along a major thoroughfare where commercial development is encouraged.

<u>RZ-2-17-2</u> Chairman Wooten recognized Planning Director Mary Rose who informed the Board that the request had been withdrawn by the applicant.

RZ-2-17-3 Chairman Wooten called the hearing to order and recognized Planning Director Mary Rose who reviewed a request to rezone approximately .58 acres located at 96 Stone Place from R-Residential to RA-Residential Agriculture. The Chairman opened the floor for comments, and none were received. The Chairman closed the hearing. Upon a motion made by Vice Chairperson Lee and seconded by Commissioner Kivett, the Board voted unanimously to approve rezoning request RZ-2-17-3, accepting the presented findings of fact and making the following zoning consistency statement: Whereas, in accordance with the provisions of North Carolina General Statute 153A-341, the Sampson County Planning Board does hereby find and determine that the recommendation of the ordinance amendment RZ-2-17-3 is consistent with the goals and objectives of the Sampson County Land Use Plan for residential growth due to the fact this area is located within a portion of the County designated as a Residential Growth Area in Section 2 of the Sampson County Land Use Plan (Future Land Use Map). This section further identifies appropriate uses for this area would include rural residential development.

Commissioner Kirby arrived and noted that he had been attending a reception honoring Mr. Dale Johnson.

RZ-2-17-4 Chairman Wooten called the hearing to order and recognized Planning Director Mary Rose who reviewed a request to rezone approximately 33.19 acres located along I-40 and Goshen Church Road from RA-Residential Agriculture to C-Commercial. The Chairman opened the floor for comments, and none were received. The Chairman closed the hearing. Upon a motion made by Commissioner Kivett and seconded by Commissioner Parker, the Board voted unanimously to approve rezoning request RZ-2-17-4, accepting the presented findings of fact and making the following zoning consistency statement: Whereas, in accordance with the provisions of North Carolina

General Statute 153A-341, the Sampson County Planning Board does hereby find and determine that the recommendation of the ordinance amendment RZ-2-17-4 is consistent with the goals and objectives of the Sampson County Land Use Plan and other long range planning documents due to the fact this property is located less than a mile from the Suttontown I-40 interchange, a major thoroughfare where commercial development is encouraged.

Mary Rose presented new Planner Jake Palant to the Board.

<u>Planning Board Appointments</u> Upon a motion made by Vice Chairperson Lee and seconded by Commissioner Kirby, the Board voted unanimously to appoint Andy Jackson and Clayton Hollingsworth to the Planning Board.

Item 3: Action Items

<u>Public Hearing - Execution and Delivery of Contract and Deed of Trust and Refinancing of Certain USDA Debt</u> The Chairman opened the public hearing and recognized Finance Officer David Clack who reminded the Board that the public hearing was a mandatory part of the USDA Debt refinancing process and that no action is required. The Chairman opened the floor for comment, and none were received. The Chairman closed the hearing.

Approval of Eagle Scout Project - Installation of AED (Automatic External Defibrillator) at Exposition Center Eagle Scout Candidate Chris Daughtry presented to the Board his project to raise funds to purchase and install an AED (automatic external defibrillator) in an alarmed cabinet at the Sampson County Agri Exposition Center and provide a class to train employees and staff on its use. Mr. Daughtry noted that his objective was to enhance the safety of those attending events at the Agri Exposition Center and discussed his goal of raising \$1,200 - \$1,300. Upon a motion made by Commissioner Kirby and seconded by Commissioner Kivett, the Board voted unanimously to accept Mr. Daughtry's Eagle Scout project.

Approval of Cost Savings Proposal EXP 003 Telephone System Upgrade (VOIP) Exposition Center Director Ray Jordan presented his budget reduction proposal to the Board noting that the proposal, which would require an upgrade to the current telephone system, would result in a savings of \$1,680. Upon a motion made by Vice Chairperson Lee and seconded by Commissioner Kirby, the Board voted unanimously to approve the budget reduction proposal as presented.

Award of Bid for Audit Contract for Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 2017 David Clack reviewed the bid process noting that only three bids had been received as of January 13, 2017; therefore, the Finance Office had extended the response date to February 13, 2017. The Finance Office sent requests for proposals to firms gathered from a list of auditors compiled by the LGC. Current auditor, Thompson, Price, Scott &

Adams, later withdrew their bid leaving bids from Carr, Riggs, & Ingram (\$54,000.00 for FYE 2017; \$55,300.00 for FYE 2018; and \$56,500.00 for FYE 2019) and W. Greene, PLLC. Mr. Clack stated that in reviewing the proposals the lowest responsible bidder was W. Greene, PLLC at an annual cost of \$50,000, and therefore the Finance Office respectfully requested that the Board approve the award of the contract to W. Greene, PLLC for the annual audit for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2017. Upon a motion made by Commissioner Kivett and seconded by Commissioner Parker, the Board voted unanimously to award the bid to W. Greene, PLLC. (Copy filed in Inc. Minute Book ____, Page ____.)

Appointment - Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC) Upon a motion by Vice Chairperson Lee and seconded by Commissioner Kivett, the Board voted unanimously to add Lorie Sutton (Dept. of Aging Representative), and appoint Keith Jackson (NCDOT), Mike Rich (SRMC), and David Kinlaw (NCHP) to the Local Emergency Planning Committee.

Re: Essential Single Family Rehab – Disaster Recovery (ESFR-DR)

Sampson County was approached by the North Carolina Housing Finance Agency (NCHFA) in reference to funds available for disaster affected owner occupied homes in Sampson County. There is a total of fifteen million dollars available in this program for disaster affected Counties. This program is mirrored after the Single Family Rehab (SFR) program that the County applies and receives on a rotating three year cycle.

Applications were required to be submitted to NCHFA no later than March 31, 2017 for expedited approval. We received notification that Sampson County was approved for an initial set aside amount of \$150,000, with the option to access the loan pool for additional funds upon completion of the initial homes. The focus of the program is on essential rehabilitation of homes affected by the disaster with the maximum being \$40,000 per unit and the soft cost funds per unit are set at \$10,000. We anticipate assisting three disaster affected owner occupied homes with the initial set aside funds. This program is to be completed no later than June 30, 2019.

The attached Funding Agreement is required to be signed and forwarded to NCHFA upon approval of acceptance of these funds. Additional Plans & Policies will require adopting at a later date for submittal to NCHFA.

With previous SFR programs Sampson County has utilized the assistance of the Wooten Company for administration of the program. The Wooten Company had declined assistance with this program due to the volume of programs they currently are administrating. We have sought out other Consultants to assist the County with the ESFR–DR program and have located the Adams Company who is willing to assist with the field work; with Sampson County carrying out the duties as the Program Administrator.

This Funding Agreement (the "Agreement") is entered into on the 20th day of March, 2017, by the North Carolina Housing Finance Agency (the "Agency"), a public agency of the State of North Carolina and Sampson County (the "Member").

Recitals

Whereas, the North Carolina General Assembly enacted the North Carolina Housing Trust Fund and Oil Overcharge Act, N.C.G.S. Chapter 122E (the "Act") for the purposes of providing funding for affordable housing as described therein (the "Fund"); and

Whereas, the Act also created the North Carolina Housing Partnership (the "Partnership") to establish policies for programs of the Fund; and

Whereas, the North Carolina General Assembly enacted the Disaster Recovery Act of 2016 (House Bill 2) to, inter alia, appropriate funds to the Fund to directly benefit persons and families affected by certain natural disasters; and

Whereas, the Agency has adopted policy guidelines for the operation of an Essential Single-Family Rehabilitation Loan Pool – Disaster Recovery (the "Program") from the Fund; and

Whereas, the Agency is responsible for administering the Fund and the programs of the Fund based on the policies, rules and regulations of the Partnership; and

Whereas, the Agency has advertised a Notice of Funding Availability for funding under the Program and invited applications to participate in the Program; and

Whereas, the Application of the Member identified on the cover page of this Funding Agreement was received, evaluated, and approved by the Agency and thereby made a part of this Agreement; and

Whereas, the Agency has developed Program Guidelines (the "Guidelines") dated January 2017 and as may be amended from time to time, governing the execution of the Program by the Member and their relationship to this Agreement is made explicit in section 9 of this Agreement;

Now, therefore, in consideration of the payment of ten dollars (\$10.00) by the Member to the Agency, the exchange of the mutual promises set forth herein and other good and valuable consideration the Member and the Agency mutually agree as follows:

PART A: TIME OF PERFORMANCE

Section 1: Time of Performance

- (a) The Member shall begin performance of this Agreement on the 20th day of March, 2017 and shall complete performance no later than the 30th day of June, 2019 (date of completion). Any funds that are not committed under contract (pursuant to section 3.2 of the Program Guidelines) to a Program participant as of the completion date must be withdrawn from deposit and returned to the Agency, unless the Agency agrees in writing to an extension of this Agreement.
- (b) The Member must make reasonable progress in the use of funds under this Agreement. Failure to do so may result, in the Agency's sole discretion, in a reduction of the amount of funds available under this Agreement.

PART B: PROGRAM FUNDING

Section 2: Grant Amount

(a) The Agency has approved a set-aside of up to \$150,000 of ESFRLP-DR funds for the Member. The Member may reserve funds from this set-aside on a unit-by-unit basis in accordance with Program Guidelines (PG) 3.2.2 & 3.2.3, within six (6) months from the date of this Funding Agreement. Any funds from this set-aside not reserved by that date shall be de-obligated and remain in the ESFRLP-DR pool for reallocation to those Members seeking funding for additional units. The funds are from the State appropriated North Carolina Housing Trust Fund – Disaster Recovery Funds and are subject to the availability of said funds. In no event shall expenditures under this Agreement exceed this Program Grant. All funds disbursed under this Agreement must be used for the repair and rehabilitation of a single-family residence that was damaged as a result of one of the following Disasters: Hurricane Matthew, Tropical Storms Julia or Hermine.

(b) Funds for additional units may be reserved from the ESFRLP-DR pool, depending on availability, on a unit-by-unit, first come, first served basis in accordance with PG 3.2 up until December 31, 2018. Any funds, not committed under contract (pursuant to Section 3 of the Program Guidelines) to a unit as of December 31, 2018, must be withdrawn from deposit and returned to the Agency. All units must be completed and closed out by June 30, 2019.

Section 3: Disbursement of Funding

The Member will receive Program funds in accordance with the Guidelines, section 3.2 Reservation and Disbursements.

Section 4: Deposit of Funds

- (a) Any money advanced to the Member must be deposited, tracked and documented in accordance with the Guidelines, sections 3.3 *Member Accounts* and 3.4 *Program Income*.
- (b) The Agency reserves the right to require that all deposits made in eligible accounts will be subject to withdrawal by the Member and will also be subject to withdrawal by the Agency. If the Agency chooses to exercise this option, an agreement for custodial accounts will be provided by the Agency to implement the requirement and will be executed prior to the initial disbursement.
 - (c) Checks will be delivered to the addresses provided in section 23 of this Agreement.

PART C: FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT

Section 5: Establishment and Maintenance of Accounting Records

The Member must comply with the accounting procedures of the Guidelines, Section 3.5 Accounting System Requirements and Section 3.6 Record Keeping.

Section 6: Procurement Procedures

Member shall establish written procurement and contracting procedures which provide that proposed procurement and contracting actions will be properly managed in accordance with the Guidelines, section 3.7 *Procurement*.

Section 7: Annual Audit Report

The Member must comply with the auditing standards and requirements of the Guidelines, section 3.8 *Financial Audit Requirements*.

PART D: PROGRAM MANAGEMENT

Section 8: Program Guidelines

This Agreement is subject to the provisions of the Guidelines, whether or not specifically referenced in this Agreement, and all defined terms used in this Agreement shall have the same meanings as used in the Guidelines. In the event of a conflict between this Agreement and the Guidelines, the Guidelines shall govern. In the event the Guidelines are revised, the Agency will forward such revisions to the Member and thereby make them a part of this Agreement. Failure of the Member to comply with the terms and conditions of the Guidelines shall be an event of default by the Member under this Agreement. Any reference to this Agreement includes the Guidelines.

The Agency may reduce, suspend, or otherwise change the disbursement of payments under this Agreement, and the Agency may terminate this Agreement if the Agency determines that the Member has failed to comply with the Agreement or the Guidelines.

Section 9: Program Documents

The Member's Program must use loans to finance eligible repairs for Program participants. The Member must comply with the documentation requirements of the Guidelines, section 4.3 *Program Documents*.

Section 10: Member Responsibility

The Member must comply with the procedures and requirements of the Guidelines, section 3.9 *Monitoring by Member*.

Section 11: Reports

The Member must comply with the procedures and requirements of the Guidelines, section 3.10 *Reporting by Member*.

Section 12: Right To Inspect

The Member must comply with the procedures and requirements of the Guidelines, section 3.11 *Monitoring by Agency*.

PART E: GENERAL CONDITIONS

Section 13: Prohibited Activity

The Member must comply with the procedures and requirements of the Guidelines, section 2.2 *Prohibited Activities*.

Section 14: Publicity

The Member must, when publicizing Program availability, act in accordance with the requirements of the Guidelines, section 4.1 *Selection of Applicants*.

Section 15: Contract Changes

Any proposed changes in this Agreement shall be in writing, submitted to and approved and executed by the Agency before the performance of any work involved in the proposed change.

Section 16: Assignment

This Agreement shall be binding on and inure to the benefit of the Agency, its successors and assigns. The Member may not assign all or any part of its interest in this Agreement or delegate any duty or obligation hereunder without the prior written consent of the Agency.

Section 17: Termination of Agreement

Termination of this Agreement will be governed by the rules and requirements of the Guidelines, section 3.1 *Funding Agreement*.

Section 18: Indemnification

The Member holds harmless and indemnifies the Agency from any and all claims, including reasonable attorney's fees, for injury or damage to persons or property which may arise in connection with work performed under this Agreement or pursuant to the Member's Program.

Section 19: Litigation

The Member represents and warrants to the Agency that there is no pending or active litigation against the Member that may jeopardize or adversely affect this Agreement or the completion of activities hereunder.

Section 20: Iran Divestment Act Certification

The Member warrants and certifies that as of the date hereof, the Member is not identified on the Final Divestment List created by the North Carolina State Treasurer pursuant to N.C.G.S. 143-6A-4 Iran Divestment Act of 2015, Article 6A, as amended, of Chapter 143C of the General Statutes of North Carolina. The person signing this Agreement certifies that he or she is authorized by Member to make the foregoing certification. Member further agrees that it will not utilize on this Agreement any subcontractor that is identified on the Final Divestment List.

Section 21: E-Verify

Member agrees to comply with the requirement of N.C.G.S. 64-26(a) which requires private employers with 25 or more employees in the State of North Carolina to comply with the Federal E-Verify system for verification of all employees' legal work status.

Section 22: Prohibition of Discrimination.

The Member must consider all applications in the order in which they are received, or in any other manner designated by the Agency, on a fair and equal basis, may not arbitrarily reject an application, and may not, vary the terms of a loan or the application procedures therefore or reject an applicant in violation of any State or federal law regarding discrimination.

Section 23: Notice

COUNTY OF SAMPSON

THIS LEASE AGREEMENT, made and entered into this the ____ day of ___, 20___, by and between SAMPSON COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT, through the County Manager, hereinafter designated as LESSOR and the STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA, hereinafter designated as LESSEE,

WITNESSETH

THAT WHEREAS, authority to approve and execute this lease agreement was delegated to the Department of Administration by resolution adopted by the Governor and Council of State on the 7th day of November, 1984; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Administration has delegated to this State agency the authority to execute this lease agreement by a memorandum dated the 17th day of April, 1985; and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto have mutually agreed to the terms of this lease agreement as hereinafter set out,

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the rental hereinafter agreed to be paid and the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth, Lessor does hereby let the period of time and subject to the terms and conditions hereinafter set out certain space in the City of Clinton, in the County of Sampson, North Carolina, more particularly described as follows:

Being ± 168 net square feet of office space located at 360 County Complex Road, Clinton, Sampson County, North Carolina.

(Children's Developmental Services Agency)

THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THIS LEASE AGREEMENT ARE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The term of this lease shall be for a period of one (1) year commencing on the 1st day of March, 2017, or as soon hereafter as the leased premises are ceded to the Lessee, and terminating on the 28th day of February, 2018.
- 2. The Lessee shall pay to the Lessor as rental for said premises the sum of Three Thousand, Six Hundred Eleven Dollars and 40/100 (\$3,611.40), which sum shall be paid in twelve (12) equal monthly installments of Three Hundred Dollars and 95/100 (\$300.95) said rental to be payable within fifteen (15) days from receipt of invoice in triplicate.

The Lessee agrees to pay the aforesaid rental to Lessor at the address specified or, to such other address as the Lessor may designate by a notice in writing at least fifteen (15) days prior to the due date.

- 3. Lessor agrees to furnish to the Lessee, as a part of the consideration for this lease, the following services and utilities, which both parties acknowledge that they are shared with the Lessor and its other agencies or programs in the building:
 - A. Heating facilities, air conditioning facilities, electrical facilities, adequate lighting fixtures and sockets, and hot and cold water facilities, and adequate toilet facilities with proper ventilation.
 - B. All utilities except telephone.
 - C. Janitorial services and supplies, maintenance and cleaning of lawns, shrubbery, sidewalks and parking fees.
 - D. Lessor to provide required fire extinguishers and servicing, and disposal of recyclable items such as aluminum cans, cardboard and paper.
 - E. Reasonable Parking
 - F. Elevator service where applicable.
 - G. All fire and safety inspection fees and stormwater fees to be the responsibility of the Lessor.
- 4. During the lease term, the Lessor shall keep the leased premises in good repair and tenantable condition, to the end that all facilities are kept in an operative condition. Maintenance shall include, but not be limited to furnishing and replacing electrical light fixture ballasts, air conditioning and ventilating equipment filter pads, if applicable, and broken glass. In case Lessor shall, after notice in writing from the Lessee in regard to a specified condition fail, refuse or neglect to correct said condition, or in the event of an emergency constituting a hazard to the health or safety of the Lessee's employees, property, or invitees, it shall then be lawful for the Lessee, in addition to any other remedy the Lessor may have, to make such repair at its own cost and to deduct the amount thereof from the rent that may then be or thereafter become due hereunder. The Lessor reserves the right to enter and inspect the leased premises, at reasonable times, and to make necessary repairs to the premises.
- 5. It is understood and agreed that the Lessor shall, at the beginning of said lease term as hereinabove set forth have the leased premises in a condition satisfactory to Lessee, including repairs, painting, partitioning, remodeling, plumbing, and electrical wiring suitable for the purpose for which the leased premises will be used by Lessee.
- 6. The Lessee shall have the right during the existence of this lease, with the Lessor's prior consent, to make alterations, attach fixtures and equipment, and erect additions, structures of signs in or upon the leased premises. Such fixtures, additions, structures or signs so placed in or upon or attached to the leased premises under this lease or any prior lease of which this lease is an extension or renewal shall be and remain the property of the Lessee and be removed therefrom by the Lessee prior to the termination of this lease or any renewal or extension thereof, or within a reasonable time thereafter. In the event Lessee elects to remove his improvements or fixtures and such removal causes damage or injury to the demised premises, Lessee will repair only to the extent of any such damage or injury.

- 7. If the said premises be destroyed by fire or other casualty, without fault of the Lessee, this lease shall immediately terminate and the rent shall be apportioned to the time of the damage. In case of partial destruction or damage by fire or other casualty without fault of the Lessee, so as to render the premises untenantable in whole or in part, there shall be an apportionment of the rent until the damage has been repaired. During such period of repair, Lessee shall have the right to obtain similar office space at the expense of Lessee or the Lessee may terminate the lease by giving fifteen (15) days written notice to the Lessor.
- 8. Lessor shall be liable to Lessee for any loss or damages suffered by Lessee which are a direct result of the failure of Lessor to perform an act required by this lease, and provided that Lessor could reasonably have complied with said requirement.
- 9. Upon termination of this lease, the Lessee will peaceably surrender the leased premises in as good order and condition as when received, reasonable use and wear and damage by fire, war, riots, insurrection, or public calamity, by the elements, by act of God or by circumstances over which Lessee had no control or for which Lessor is responsible pursuant to this lease, excepted.
- 10. The Lessor agrees that the Lessee, upon keeping and performing the covenants and agreement herein contained, shall at all times during the existence of this lease peaceably and quietly have, hold, and enjoy the leased premises free from the adverse claims of any person.
- 11. The failure of either party to insist in any instance upon strict performance of any of the terms and conditions herein set forth shall not be construed as a waiver of the same in any other instance. No modification of any provision hereof and no cancellation or surrender hereof shall be valid unless in writing and signed and agreed to by both parties.
- 12. Any hold over after the expiration of the said term or any extension thereof, shall be construed to be a tenancy from month to month, and shall otherwise be on the terms and conditions herein specified, so far as applicable; however, either party shall give not less than sixty (60) days written notice to terminate the tenancy.
- 13. 



POLICIES AND PROCEDURES REGARING PUBLIC COMMENT

A period reserved for comments from the public on topics not otherwise included on that evening's agenda will be included as an item of business on all agendas of regularly-scheduled Board of Commissioners meetings and shall be deemed the "Public Comment" segment of the agenda. The Public Comment segment of the agenda will be placed at the end of the agenda, following the conclusion of all other open session business.

As with Public Hearings, the Chair (or presiding officer) will determine and announce limits on speakers at the start of the Public Comment period. Generally, each speaker will be allocated five (5) minutes. **Speakers may not allocate their time to another speaker.** The Chairman (or presiding officer) may, at his discretion, decrease this time allocation, if the number of persons wishing to speak would unduly prolong the meeting.

The Public Comment period shall not exceed a total of thirty (30) minutes unless the Board entertains a successful majority vote to extend this period.

An individual wishing to address the Board during the Public Comment period shall register with the Clerk to the Board prior to the opening of the meeting by signing his or her name, address and a short description of his or her topic on a sign-up sheet stationed in the lobby of the County Auditorium.

If time allows, those who fail to register before the meeting may speak during the Public Comment period. These individuals will speak following those who registered in advance. At this time in the agenda, an individual should raise his or her hand and ask to be recognized by the Board Chair (or presiding officer); and then state his or her name, address and introduce the topic to be addressed.

Items of discussion during the Public Comment segment of the meeting will be only those appropriate to Open Meetings. Closed Meeting topics include, but are not limited to, such subjects as personnel, acquisition of real property, and information protected by the client-attorney privilege. Closed Meeting subjects will not be entertained.

Because subjects of Special and Emergency Meetings are often regulated by General Statutes, there will be no Public Comments segment reserved on agendas of these meetings; however, Special and Emergency Meetings are open for public attendance.

The Public Comments segment of the agenda is intended to provide a forum for the Board of Community to listen to citizens; **there shall be no expectation that the Board will answer impromptu questions.** However, Board members, through the presiding officer, may ask the speaker questions for clarification purposes. The Board will not take action on an item brought up during the Public Comments segment of the agenda and, when appropriate, items will be referred to the Manager or the proper Department Head.
