Substitute Certificate

In addition to possessing the above listed requirements, all applicants must complete a criminal history background check through MorphoTrust, a background check from the Department of Education and a Mantoux Test. Current substitute teachers at other public school districts who have completed a criminal history review through MorphoTrust, may be approved by some area schools by transferring their criminal history approvals through the Department of Education.
