#### • Bid Award – Ford's Pond Project #2 Construction

Staff Report – Community Development Director, Brian Elliott – The City received two bids on April 26, 2023, one from Knife River Materials and one from JRT Construction, LLC, whom submitted the lowest bid in the amount of \$1,884,038.16, and is qualified to complete this project. Project includes:

- Councilor Dagel How much of this project is covered by grants? Finance Director, Tami Trowbridge An estimated 90%.

#### • Bid Award – Terrace Lane Improvement Project

Staff Report – Public Works Director, Aaron Swan – The City received two bids on April 13, 2023. Knife River Materials submitted the lowest bid in the amount of \$199,199, well under the engineer's estimate, and is qualified to complete this project.

**MOTION** made by Councilor Hamilton to approve Bid Award to Knife River Materials in the amount of \$199,199 as presented; second by Councilor Whitaker.

Discussion:

> Councilor Woods asked where Terrace Lane is located. Swan replied. When will construction begin? No exact date at this time but must be completed before June 30, 2023

#### • Purchase Approval – Type 1 Fire Engine

Staff Report – Fire Chief, Mike Lane – The current 1993 fire engine needs to be replaced. A replacement has been budgeted for the 2025-2026 fiscal year however, HME has a two year build time. Placing an order now will get it into production to receive in 2025. Most of the equipment from the old engine will be reused. Cost of the new engine is \$670,000 with an additional \$35,000 for outfitting.

<u>MOTION</u> made by Councilor Woods to approve purchase of a 2025 Type 1 Fire Engine from HME in the amount of \$670,000 with an additional \$35,000 for outfitting as presented; second by Councilor Whitaker. Discussion:

- > Councilor Groussman What will be done with the old fire engine? Lane There isn't much need for an old engine so they are usually donated to smaller fire stations.
- > Councilor Woods What happens if the price of the fire engine drops? The contract will be renegotiated.

In favor: Councilors Dagel, Whitaker, Smalley, Groussman, Hamilton, Woods and Mayor Sumner.

#### • Resolution 2023.03 – Food Waste Reduction

Staff Report – Community Development Supervisor, Kristi Gilbert – The City was approached by Source One Serenity to seek interest in a partnership to apply for a US Department of Agriculture (USDA) grant for a Compost and Food Waste Reduction Pilot Project. Projects will span two years with a start date of December 1, 2023. This project consists of Sutherlin Sanitary Service collecting commercial food waste and transferring it to a

worm digest composting facility in Glide called Healterra. Elena Lininger with Source One Serenity provided details pertaining to this process.

<u>MOTION</u> made by Councilor Woods to approve Resolution 2023.03 – Food Waste Reduction as presented; second by Councilor Groussman.

#### Discussion:

- > Councilor Whitaker Does this cost the city money? *Lininger Working through this program, there is no cost to the city.*
- ➤ Councilor Dagel Will this program be mandatory for businesses to participate? *No.*
- > Councilor Groussman What happens to the compost? It is sold to the public. City parks could receive it at no cost depending on quantity & availability.
- > Councilor Whitaker What do the veterans do? *This program is operated by veterans*.
- ➤ Councilor Hamilton What happens after the two year pilot project? *The City and Sutherlin Sanitary Service will determine feasibility.*

Further discussion ensued.

#### Comments:

This Adjustment is necessary because of the General fund Loan to Urban Renewal. At the time the budget was prepared, the additional opportunities for Urban Renewal were unforeseeable. Due to the Agency decisions to move forward with a property purchase and Mainstreet Grant, additional funds were needed. Contingency Funds were not sufficient for this Loan. This Adjustment is needed to correct Contingency for the prior supplemental budget resolution.

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 2023.04**

#### A RESOLUTION ADOPTING A SUPPLEMENTAL BUDGET ADJUSTMENT, AMENDING THE 2022-2023 BUDGET.

#### The City Council of Sutherlin finds that:

- **A.** That ORS 294.473 provides the procedures for public governing bodies to adopt supplemental budget adjustments when estimated expenditures differ by more than ten percent from the expenditures in the budget as most recently amended prior to the supplemental budget.
- **B.** The procedure includes the municipal corporation providing notice of a supplemental budget adjustment hearing and holding a public hearing on the supplemental budget adjustment prior to adopting a resolution to change the budget by more than ten percent.
- C. Public notice has been provided as required by ORS 294.473 and a public hearing related to the supplemental budget adjustment was held on June 12, 2023, and
- **D.** Due to unforeseen events at the time of adoption, and an error in identifying Contingency as the funding source for these events, fiscal year 2022-23 budget requires adjustment including but not limited to the following:
  - a. Tourism-Motel Tax Fund:
    - i. At the time the budget was prepared for FY21-22, the TRT Revenue was very conservatively projected given the major reduction that was a by-product of the COVID-19 pandemic. Actual Receipts exceeded budgetary amounts by almost 50%. The agreement with the Chamber calls for the City to distribute 62.5% of the receipts to them. This adjustment is necessary to fulfill the terms of our agreement.
  - b. Parks Construction:
    - i. At the time the budget was prepared for FY22-23, we were using existing cost estimates and proposed grant amounts. In the interim, there have been significant price increases, and amendments to the grants. A budget adjustment is necessary to accommodate these changes.
  - c. General Fund Fire Dept:
    - i. At the time the budget was prepared, the amounts for Wages and Overtime were accurate based on standard shifts. Grant opportunities for Wildland Protection came available later, as did the opportunities for Conflagration response. These additional expenses are completely covered by the corresponding resources, but an adjustment is necessary. The Fire Equipment purchase was approved by Council earlier this year and the adjustment for the Fuel line Item is a product of increased Diesel costs.

- d. General Fund Police Dept:
  - i. At the time the budget was prepared, the amounts for Salaries & Wages were accurate based on standard shifts. There was a Retroactive pay issue that came up and was resolved during the course of this fiscal year which was unforeseeable. Also, the adjustment for Gas & Lubricants is a byproduct of increased fuel prices. Therefore a budget adjustment is necessary.
- e. General Fund City Manager's Office:
  - i. At the time the budget was prepared, the Materials and Supplies budget was accurate. During the first 6 months of this fiscal year, Jerry has been appointed to the OCCMA board which could involve extra travel for him. He has also initiated a Douglas County City Manager's Coalition and Sutherlin is hosting the meetings. A budget adjustment is necessary to accommodate these opportunities.
- f. Enterprise Fund-Water Reserve:
  - i. At the time the budget was prepared, the projected cost of a replacement pickup for the Water Department was budgeted for. When a vehicle was finally located, the cost was 14.5% more than budgeted. Council approved the purchase but a budget adjustment was necessary.

#### NOW, THEREFORE, based upon the above findings,

#### BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SUTHERLIN, a municipal Corporation of the State of Oregon, as follows:

Section 1. That the budget for the City of Sutherlin for the fiscal year 2022 - 2023, which was adopted by the City Council on June 13, 2022 and is now on file in the office of the City Recorder of the City of Sutherlin, be hereby amended as follows:
