'Spotlight On' The Sutherlin Fire Department

The Sutherlin Fire Department is excited to announce the hiring of two Battalion Chiefs and the promotion of three Volunteer Fire Lieutenants. In July of 2023, Battalion Chief Mike Merlino was hired full time. He as more than 25 years of fire service, bringing with him a wealth of knowledge and experience. This includes paramedic and technical rescue. Battalion Chief Dwayne Gettys returns after having been transferred to the Douglas County Fire District in 2010, as part of the contract for service. He is also a paramedic and words part time for Umpqua Community College as a Paramedic/ EMT Instructor. The department promoted three of its own to Fire Lieutenants. Congratulations to, Lieutenant Josh McDonald, Lieutenant John Tranter and to Lieutenant Justin Standley. In mid-October of 2023, all three successfully passed the lieutenant's exam and assessment center. This new rank allows the fire department to continue increasing the capacity of its Volunteer Firefighter programs.
