

# City Council Proceedings

Sutherlin, Oregon, May 13, 1911

First Meeting

The City Council of the City of Sutherlin met this day for the first time and called Mayor M. J. Phillips. On roll call all members of the City government were present as follows: M. J. Phillips, Mayor; M. F. Rapelje, A. E. Shivia, F. C. McReynolds, F. W. Franz, T. A. E. Lyman, A. E. Bamber, Councilmen; W. E. Ed. John, Treasurer; Will J. Hayner, Recorder; T. J. Ardrey, Marshal.

Incorporation

Mayor Phillips stated that the Town of Sutherlin had been duly incorporated, and that the application for a charter had been duly approved by the Secretary of State; that the present session of the Council was called in order to comply with the law, which specified that a meeting of the Council must be called within ten days after the application for a charter had been approved by the Secretary of State.

Fire Limits

The first business taken up was an ordinance establishing fire limits within the incorporate limits of the town. Councilman Bamber moved that the fire limits include Central Avenue from California Street to Lemgwa Street and north and south to the alleys. This motion was seconded by Councilman Shivia, and on call of the roll the fire limits were thus established by the following vote: Yeas—Rapelje, Shivia, McReynolds, Franz, Lyman, Bamber.

Fire Limits Ordinance

On motion of Councilman Bamber the ordinance was read for the first time. On motion duly made and carried the ordinance was read for the second time. On motion duly made and carried the rules were suspended and the ordinance was read a third time by its title and adopted as read by the following vote—yeas—Rapelje, Shivia, McReynolds, Franz, Lyman, Bamber.

Dog Tax Ordinance

An ordinance to tax dogs was introduced and read for the first time for information. On motion of Councilman Bamber the rules were suspended and the ordinance was read for a second time. On motion duly made and carried the rules were suspended and the ordinance was read a third time by its title and adopted as read by the following vote: Rapelje, Shivia, McReynolds, Franz, Lyman, Bamber.
