
Greetings Citizens of Union,

Are you Recycling Wrong?

If you're tossing things in the recycling bin out of sheer hope, you might be an "aspirational recycler." Aspirational recyclers are well-intentioned people who put things in our recycle bins that do not belong there.

Substances like grease, food particles, and unrecyclable materials attached to recyclable materials are forms of contamination. Recycled material buyers will not purchase contaminated materials so they usually end up in a landfill. For instance, a cardboard takeout pizza box is recyclable unless it is greasy or has cheese stuck on it because these substances soak into the fibers making them unusable. Even a bigger concern is you might contribute to the entire truckload of recyclables being rejected and sent to the landfill.



The City of Union and Waste Connections would like to remind residents about what is and is not acceptable to place in your recycle bins.

Refer to the illustration on the left.

All containers need to be rinsed and free from food and liquids, including water.
